

- 5. General Control Objectives For The Incident (Include Alternatives)
 - 1. Provide for the safety of the public and assigned incident resources through effective hazard / risk assessment and mitigation.
 - 2. Provide timely and accurate information updates to the GFC, cooperators, affected communities, and other stakeholders.
 - 3. Provide accurate cost accountability and documentation of expenditures for the duration of the incident.
 - 4. Develop and maintain coordination with local fire departments, local EOC directors, GEMA, other IMT's deployed in the area, GOAL, and private industry.
 - 5. Provide support on initial and extended attack fires as requested by Georgia GFC District 8 and District 10.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure will remain to the south of the region today. Upper level disturbances will pass overhead and combine with the warm and moist airmass for an increased shower and thunderstorms chance today. The upper level ridge will begin to build back into the area on Wednesday.

1. Gusty winds in thunderstorms as high as 40 mph.

Weather Summary:

Yesterdays scattered thunderstorm development generated shower activity. Some fire areas received trace amounts while other areas like Manor & Homerville received as much as ½ inch to 7/10ths of an inch of rain. The rainfall also generated higher RHs. The combined positive impact inhibited new fire starts and re-burn potential.

General Fire Behavior:

Yesterday's fire behavior was limited to the organic soils or hot spots along the firelines. This activity was centered on Divisions WI, WH, WG, & WW. The Gum Maple Bay Swamp fuel type in these Divisions contains areas that will support ground fire. Follow-up in-stand examinations of this fuel type revealed that the surface litter and duff layer are too moist to support future burn out operations even though there is active ground fire.

Surrounding Pine Plantations (4 to 7 ft tall pine saplings with grass & low shrubs or Sawtimber sized plantations with southern shrub evergreen species 4 to 6 ft. tall) were tested and can support surface fires within 1 day following a significant rainfall event. Yesterday's additional rains that were received from thunderstorm activity further dampened & eventually removed these fuels from being capable to ignite. Remember with just one day of excellent drying fuels will be available to burn. Favorable wind directions will exist today: SW – AM & then WSW – PM. These wind directions reduce the possibility of fire escapes from "hot" Divisions. The Probability of Ignition is 20%. The following Fire Behavior is being provided to assist in time distance operational planning.

Air Operations:

There are no restrictions on air operations as the skies will be clear. There will be the development of cumulus clouds. Smoke production is expected to be very minimal. Aircraft should be advised that there will be less erratic winds, but thunderstorms development is possible after in the afternoon.

Safety:

Areas of deep duff or organic burning have tree root systems that are weakened. These trees will be a hazard even without the influence of wind. Wind gusts associated with the thunderstorms are predicted to be > 30 mph. Stay alert to this serious safety hazard.

Tropical Storm Barry brought us significant rainfall amounts Saturday. Partly cloudy hot weather with moderate winds and moderate relative humidities will bring gradual drying. There is a chance of scattered showers and thunderstorms. Refer to page 75 in your Incident Response Pocket Guide for lightning mitigation. Plan and act accordingly. Maintain LCES at all times!

In the mop-up process, wear your PPE. Wear eye protection as needed, as eye injuries are common.

Snags are present, so be alert to any in your assignment area. Trees growing in peat soils can have weakened and burnt roots due to under ground burning that will allow them to fall without warning. Park vehicles a safe distance away from trees. Roads can be blocked quickly by falling trees and snags. If you are working around pumps, post a lookout for these snags. Following the storm, trees may have fallen across the roads. Predicted winds will increase the likelihood of snags falling. Maintain safe driving speeds and distances.

While driving, soft road shoulders and sloppy off road conditions could be a problem. Watch your footing on equipment and slippery ground surfaces.

Following the recent rains, snakes and alligators are out in force. Remain aware of your surroundings and maintain a safe distance from the local wildlife.


Human Resource Message

ACTUAL CHECKOUT PROCEDURE

When final approval and instructions are obtained the Demob U/L will:

- 1. Give the Crew Boss, Liaison Officer, or individual:
 - A. The Demob checkout ICS-221
 - B. Instructions for going through checkout phases

THE RELEASED CREW BOSS OR INDIVIDUAL OVERHEAD WILL:

- 1. Turn in all issued items, except communications gear, to the <u>Supply Unit</u> and obtain their release on the Demob Checkout ICS-221.
- 2. Obtain <u>Communication Unit</u> clearance on the Demob checkout showing all communication equipment has been returned.
- 3. Obtain <u>Facilities Unit</u> clearance on the Demob checkout showing that their area was left in good condition.
- 4. Obtain <u>Ground Support Unit</u> or <u>Supply Unit</u> clearance on the Demob checkout indicating that all vehicles and keys were returned, and that contract equipment has been inspected.
- 5. Obtain <u>Documentation Unit</u> clearance on the Demob checkout indicating all Performance evaluations have been completed and also all IS-214's.
- 6. Resolve all time discrepancies with the Time Unit the evening before departure.
- 7. Sign their time reports before leaving the ICP.
- 8. Obtain Time Unit clearance on the Demob checkout for personnel time.
- 9. Obtain <u>Time Unit</u> clearance on the Demob checkout showing that all time on contracted equipment has been reported, agreed upon and signed.
- 10. Return the final release sheet ICS-221 to the Demob U/L.

TRAVEL RESTRITIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS

REST REQUIREMENTS

We will release no person from the Incident without first obtaining 8 hours of rest, unless specifically approved by the I.C.

TRAVEL LIMITATIONS

All Federal employees must be able to arrive at their home unit before 2200 hours.

All agency personnel will meet their own agency's travel limitations when returning to their home unit. Also, out of area resources will be required to meet local and regional requirements due to travel arrangements.

TRAVEL ROUTES

All return travel will be by the most direct route, and documented on ICS-214's.

Federal and State government employees returning via their own agency's vehicles will plan the most direct, most practical routes to their home units.

Crews and/or other resources that must travel long distances to home units should file a route plan (RON) with Demob and check-in with their home unit dispatch.


