WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure will build in over the area today with only isolated afternoon showers and thunderstorms possible associated with the sea breeze. The weather pattern will change very little through the weekend with isolated chances of afternoon thunderstorms possible. A slight increase in moisture will bring scattered Thunderstorm activity on Monday.

Road conditions – The secondary roads will be wet and very inaccessible today. Use caution and avoid traveling on the wet secondary roads if possible. Look for alternative routes and be sure someone knows where you are in case you do get stuck.

Winch Operations – Stop and think before starting winch operations. Be sure to use all PPE and a heavy coat or blanket on the cable to reduce risk of injury.

Snags – Higher wind speeds, soft soil from rain and previous fire damage combined will increase snag fall today. Scan areas that you park your vehicles and equipment, as well as, any area you are working for potential snags. Mitigate the ones you can do so safely and communicate ones you can't.

Communication Responsibilities

INSURE YOU HAVE COMMUNICATIONS

All firefighters have five communication responsibilities:

- · Brief others as needed
- · Debrief your actions
- · Communicate hazards to others
- Acknowledge messages
- · Ask if you don't know

In addition, all leaders of firefighters have the responsibility to provide complete briefings that include a clearly stated "Leaders Intent."

- Task = What is to be done
- Purpose = Why it is to be done
- End State = How it should look when done


A. <u>HOW WILL IT HAPPEN?</u>


- 1. Your supervisor declares your position excess.

- 3. The Demob Unit Leader has a 24+ hour window to reassign you to another incident or arrange for transportation to your home unit.


B. WHAT CAN YOU DO TO EXPEDITE THE PROCESS?

- 1. Turn in all time report and equipment use records to Time.
- 2. If you have equipment, have an inspection completed by **Ground Support.**
- 3. Turn in any non-essential items you have checked out to <u>Supply</u> or <u>Communications.</u>
- 4. Complete and turn in Unit Logs on a daily basis to
 <u>Documentation</u> and get a Performance Evaluation from your supervisor (you keep original and a copy goes to the files)
- 5. If there is any change in your status, notify **<u>Demob</u>** immediately.
- 6. Check the Demob Board on a regular basis. Be available to move within a 1 to 2 hour notice.
