<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> High pressure and dry conditions will continue to prevail over the area for the next few days. Afternoon highs will warm into the mid to upper 90s again today and this will continue through Monday. The relative humidity will fall into the upper 20 to low 30 percent range during the late afternoon. Expect a slight increase in moisture over the area Tuesday with isolated Thunderstorms possible...but a cold front will begin to work its way down here on Wednesday into Thursday. Moisture will increase significantly out ahead of the front and along with that scattered afternoon thunderstorms will develop out ahead of it.

° Driving ° Communication	° Hydration	° Equipment

Driving – Please be aware of situation around you when driving. You could meet hundreds of 4 - 20 ton projectiles literally feet from you. Beware the inattentive driver! Look ahead, behind, and to the side – SITUATIONAL AWARNESS!

Communication – Make sure you understand your task – ask questions, give feed back. Make sure you give clear instructions – ask for feed back – encourage questions.

Hydration – Temperatures are expected to be high again. Be sure to drink plenty of WATER before, during and after shift.

Equipment - Keep your distance from heavy equipment; make sure operator knows your location. Don't approach moving equipment until you are sure operator is aware of your presence and he has stopped operations. Watch for swinging log ends and domino effect of moving trees, and snags! Also watch for "critters" that may be escaping from disrupted debris piles.


Communication Responsibilities

All firefighters (**and equipment operators**) have five communication responsibilities:

- Brief others as needed
- Debrief your actions
- Communicate hazards to others
- Acknowledge messages
- Ask if you don't know

In addition, all leaders of firefighters (**and equipment operators**) have the responsibility to provide complete briefings that include a clearly stated "Leaders Intent."

- Task = What is to be done
- Purpose = Why it is to be done
- End State = How it should look when done

DEMOBILIZATION PROCEDURES

A. <u>HOW WILL IT HAPPEN?</u>

- 1. Your supervisor declares your position excess.
- 2. The Section Chief agrees and notifies the Demob Unit Leader.
- 3. The Demob Unit Leader has a 24+ hour window to reassign you to another incident or arrange for transportation to your home unit.

B. WHAT CAN YOU DO TO EXPEDITE THE PROCESS?

- 1. Turn in all time reports and equipment use records to Time.
- 2. If you have equipment, have an inspection completed by **Ground Support.**
- 3. Turn in any non-essential items you have checked out to <u>Supply</u> or <u>Communications.</u>
- 4. Complete and turn in Unit Logs on a daily basis to
 <u>Documentation</u> and get a Performance Evaluation from your supervisor (you keep the original and a copy goes to the files)
- 5. If there is any change in your status, notify **<u>Demob</u>** immediately.
- 6. Check the Demob Board on a regular basis. Be available to move within a 1 to 2 hour notice.






