WEATHER DISCUSSION: Hot and dry conditions are expected to continue Today. Higher Relative Humidities and better chances for rain are expected Thursday through Sunday.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY: Partly cloudy with scattered thunderstorms developing, mainly after 4 pm. Areas of smoke through mid morning, particularly across eastern portions of the fire.

MAXIMUM TEMPERATURES: 98-102F.

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR

Fuels around the Okefenokee Wildlife Refuge are predominately Fuel Model 7 (Southern Rough). Large to moderate acreage tracts of commercial timberland are mixed in throughout the entire perimeter surrounding the refuge. Fast moving wildfires with extremely high flame lengths and rapid rates of spread occur within the swamp. As fire transitions to the upland, torching and crown fires are common. Long Range spotting is possible.

Indicators of Increased Fire Activity

- Relative humidity dropping below 45%
- Winds above 10 mph
- Heavy fuel loadings
- Fine dead fuel moisture 8% or less
- Dispersion above 70

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR

- **Extreme fire behavior conditions that produced the Plume & associated Thunderstorm on Tuesday exist again today. Expect rapid ROS with potential of spotting over .5 miles.**
- **Winds will shift throughout the day – Thunderstorm activity in fire area after 1600 – LAL 3.**
- **High probability for Plume dominated fire activity – these will be fuel driven and most likely to occur in the late afternoon when influenced by the thunderstorm activity & sea breezes.**

One hour fine dead fuel moisture will begin to drop to 4%-5%, keeping it at critical levels. 1000 hour fuels are around 12 to 16%. Extensive mop up is required. Reburn potential is high in all divisions.

Should a fire run(s) occur, expect winds in the area to potentially increase above predicted levels. This would increase Flame Lengths and ROS above predictions. Heavier firebrands can also be lifted higher and further increasing likelihood of spots to max predictions. In areas where fuels have been herbicided, expect quick ignitions and extreme heat, very fast.

Each day the water table is dropping creating more duff layer and organic fuels available for burning and/or reburning, latest moisture reading as low as 16%...

Night Ops – Expect winds on West Branch from the S and a Sea Breeze with SE winds on the East Branch, Expect high ROS similar to daytime, decreasing to around 15 ch/hr through 2300. Dispersion Index of 2 – really good for nighttime. Expect fire to continue to spread until RH's greater than 80%, intense runs will cause RH levels near the fire edge to drop below 60% over 100' away. Lighting line will be hampered above 70% RH. Heads up for fire activity to the South of our fire perimeter, especially Divisions D & E.

Air Operations: Inversion lifting by 0900 today. Mixing heights will be 8000 feet.

SAFETY:

WINDS – we will have shifting winds all day so keep abreast of changing wx conditions. Holding line along East & North Branches is a concern. **THUNDERSTORMS higher probability for PM storms** - these will/can cause severe winds that can create extreme fire behavior, when winds are over 30 mph, ROS can be 2 mph and greater. LAL of 3 for today.

FUELS: Reburn is an issue. Watch for pockets of cured shrubs or blankets of red needles beginning to cover the forest floor. 1000 and 10,000 hour fuels as well as deep duff pockets are providing the heat source. Weather is staying hot and dry! Stay focused, and ensure LCES is in place before starting operations. Watch for standing burning snags that can fall without warning. *Energy Release Component (ERC) continues to be above the 97th percentile for this area.*

Extreme Fire Behavior potential – The high temperatures and low relative humidity being experienced on the incident has created the potential for extreme fire behavior. The extended drought and low live fuel moisture make the extreme fire behavior the “norm”. ***WATCH OUT for: a rapid increase in fire’s intensity; high, sustained rate of spread; a well-developed convection column; long-distance spotting; whirlwinds and the sudden calming of wind.***

Fatigue – Most line resources have been on the Honey Prairie fire for several long hot days and many of us have been on multiple incidents already this year. The best defense is adequate rest, frequent breaks during the heat of the day, and eating well. Drink plenty of water to avoid heat related issues.

Heavy Equipment-There is a lot of equipment being used on this incident. Be sure to allow for sufficient space when working in the same area as heavy equipment. Be sure when approaching equipment that the operator is aware you are there. During night operations wear clothing with reflective strips and have your headlight on so you can be seen. Salvage logging is occurring in Div C & D.

Limited Ingress and Egress – The access roads around this fire can be confusing. Know your escape routes prior to needing them. Park vehicles headed out to minimize the need to turn around vehicles in an emergency situation. Narrow dusty roads limits visibility....be sure to allow sufficient space between vehicles in case of a sudden stop.

SOUTHERN AREA IMT INCIDENT WITHIN AN INCIDENT EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN

Introduction

An emergency such as a helicopter accident, firefighter entrapment or burnover, camp evacuations, vehicle accident, medical emergency or other unknown emergency condition could occur on any of the wild fires or all-risk incidents we may be assigned. This may result in serious injuries or fatalities, and periods of extreme stress. This is called an “incident within an incident (IWI).”

Assignments may be in remote or severely impacted locations that result in longer than normal response times for local emergency response personnel; therefore, the team is responsible for handling the situation professionally, timely and effectively.

The intent of this plan is to establish a process and protocol to effectively manage an emergency situation (IWI) while continuing to manage the primary incident with as minimum of distraction as possible.

General Procedures

In the event of an emergency IWI, notification will be made thru the chain of command to the Operations Section Chief and/or Safety Officer. The Operations Section Chief (OSC) will assume control of the emergency and promptly assign on-scene responsibility to an appropriate Division/Group Supervisor or other individual not directly involved with the incident. If OSC cannot be contacted, the highest qualified operations person or safety officer on scene will assume command of the emergency and take appropriate action.

The Incident Commander, Medical Unit Leader and Communications will be notified promptly. The IC will ensure that all remaining command and general staff are notified.

All incident personnel will be instructed by the OSC or Safety Officer to clear the designated radio channel for “emergency traffic” related only to the emergency situation. If OSC or Safety Officer cannot be contacted, the highest qualified person on scene will broadcast “emergency radio traffic.” If available, air attack will be over the incident to ensure clear communications are in effect and will be available as an airborne repeater if needed. In the event personnel are injured, when they have been loaded and being transported to the hospital or at an appropriate time, OSC or Safety Officer will announce on the radio that “emergency radio traffic” has been canceled.

Names of the injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.

To aid in an investigation, deceased individuals or their personal effects will not be moved except to accomplish rescue work or to protect the health and safety of others.

Those directly involved will provide written documentation of their actions. An ICS 214 may be utilized for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required.

An After Action Review will be conducted after each emergency incident within an incident to determine strengths and needed improvements.
