GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR

Fuels around the Okefenokee Wildlife Refuge are predominately Fuel Model 7 (Southern Rough). Large to moderate acreage tracts of commercial timberland are mixed in throughout the entire perimeter surrounding the refuge. Fast moving wildfires with extremely high flame lengths and rapid rates of spread occur within the swamp. As fire transitions to the upland, torching and crown fires are common. One hour fine dead fuel moisture is at 8% for Thursday. 1000 hour fuels are drier than normal for this time of year. There is reburn potential in all divisions due to the amount of needle cast. Should a fire run(s) occur, expect winds in the area to potentially increase above predicted levels. This would increase Flame Lengths and ROS above predictions. Heavier firebrands can also be lifted higher and further increasing likelihood of spots to max predictions. In areas where fuels have been herbicided, expect quick ignitions and extreme heat, quick rate-of –spread, and group tree torching producing spotting problems.

Night Ops – Expect another night of minimal fire behavior, with areas of heavy smoke and patch of fog after 2200 hrs. with fog becoming locally dense. Partly cloudy with a slight chance of showers and thunderstorms mainly before 2300 hrs. Fire behavior after midnight will primarily be limited to smoldering in heavy fuels near firelines and interior in Divisions B,V,Y,V, and O. Winds are forecast from the SW 2 - 4 mph. 

The Honey Prairie Fire increased by 2,537 acres on July 12 including a 678 acre strategic firing operation near Swamp Park. A helicopter was used for ignition as the target was an interior pocket of unburned area in the Okefenokee NWR. There was some ash fall from the smoke column reported by Hoboken residents. More smoke and ash can be expected on July 13 as another hot, dry day is expected. Crews continue patrolling, building breaks on the perimeter, and continuing mop up operations. The fire was fairly active in the interior, increasing as the fuels were dried during the day.

Firefighters on the Sweat Farm Again and Racepond Fires continue to patrol and mop up the perimeter of these fires and extinguish machine pile holding fire that could threaten the fire line. They are applying best management practices where needed and providing initial attack support to the Georgia Forestry Commission. Structure protection and fuel reduction continues in Swamp Park.


A Hazardous Weather Outlook has been issued by the National Weather Service: "Areas of smoke will continue to impact portions of southeast Georgia. Smoke from the Honey Prairie wildfire will push to the east and northeast of the fire location impacting a portion of southeast Georgia, including Nahunta, Brunswick, Woodbine and St. Marys. The smoke may drift into northeast Florida including locations around Jacksonville International Airport, Callahan, Hilliard and Kings Ferry through the mid afternoon hours then lift northward. Visibilities may be reduced to 3 miles or less at times across these areas."

Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge remains closed. During the early morning hours of low fire activity, firefighters staged at the Visitor Center are clearing downed trees and cutting down hazardous trees along the Ridley's Island Trail.

The Georgia Fire Information Center will be open from 8 a.m. – 7 p.m. daily to help assist the public and media with up to date information on all fires across Southeast Georgia and Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge. Please contact us at 912-496-2566 or georgiafireinformationcenter@gmail.com.
