Extremely dry conditions make control difficult, spotting, large area of uncontrolled fire line, Thunderstorm activity with little rain. Firefighter fatigue. Sea breezes pose difficulties in line containment. Reburning due to needle fall in areas that were previously burned. Structures on along east line near Randall Crews Road are still threatened until mopup and line improvement is completed.
