Rates of Spread listed above take the fine fuels (1 hr) that carry the fire. Although these fuels generally take longer than 1 hour to completely dry, even after a soaking it takes a morning of sun and light winds to make these fuels available again to carry a fire at a sometimes surprising ROS. Be cautious of this. What will the indices mean for you yellered-up folks?

- * Tractor plows should not have problems outflanking escapes or new IA starts.
- * Engine crews may have to cool down fuel jackpots before going direct in southern rough.
- * Areas open to sunlight and wind or open pine stands will be active earlier in the day.
- * WATCH for fire or machinery weakened trees that may fall with little disturbance.
- * Less fuel will be available today keeping intensity somewhat lower.


