Gusty SW Winds & Isolated Afternoon/Evening Thunderstorms Wind Shift from SW to NNW Tonight with Frontal Passage

DISCUSSION: A weather pattern change today as southwest winds become gusty by midday ahead of an approaching cold front. Waves of scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms will develop in advance of the front and could impact the fire site this afternoon through tonight. The main thunderstorm hazards will be lightning and gusty and erratic winds, even if storms are not directly over the fire site. Despite mostly cloudy skies, temperatures will continue above normal with an increase in humidity. The front is expected to push south of the fire site after midnight tonight (early Tuesday morning).

TODAY (MONDAY DAY SHIFT):

- WEATHER: Mostly cloudy with a chance of afternoon showers and isolated thunderstorm.
- WIND (20 FT): South near 10 mph morning, increasing near 15 mph with gusts up to 25 mph by midday.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

A cold front passes over the fire area today, bringing slightly cooler temperatures and higher relative humidity. However, high winds and dispersion index will allow for moderate fire growth in available fuels. Long, wind driven runs, are possible mostly well within the fire perimeter north of Blackjack Island. Containment lines along the east side of the swamp will likely be tested.

Thunderstorms predicted in our fire area could cause unpredictable fire behavior. If they pass across or near the fire perimeter without rainfall watch for downdrafts pushing the fire in any direction. These winds can be in excess of 30 mph and quickly advance fire spread in unpredictable directions. Spotting distance is also drastically increased.

SPECIFIC:

- DIV A:** Residual heat will remain along the Six Rd. where burnout operations took place yesterday. On west portion of division watch for re-burn along the perimeter.
- DIV B/C:** Re-burn is likely today with increased winds kindling residual heat and allowing fire to carry through the needle cast. Spots from these re-burns should blow to the interior of the fire perimeter.
- DIV D/E:** Fire that is on the north end of Billy's island will continue to burn south. It is unlikely to burn off the island tomorrow due to wetter fuels surrounding it. Fire burning north of Blackjack Island has potential to make a large wind driven run to the northeast today.
- DIV M:** Winds from the southwest will push fire burning interior towards the swamp edge break. Spotting across the break is possible today.
- DIV N:** Fire has backed through most fuels that will carry fire at this point. Little fire behavior is expected.
- DIV O:** Fire north of Soldier Camp Island will continue backing to the southeast towards the swamp edge break into wet areas that are not prone to burning.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Low ceiling tomorrow again, clearing around 1000. Scattered thunderstorms in the afternoon could cause turbulent flying conditions.

Ensure communications are working, loan hand held radios if needed. 3. Ensure all hazards are communicated. 4. Match the task to be accomplished with the capabilities of the resource.
3. **Fatigue:** 2-1 Work Ratio—for every 2 hours of work the body needs 1 hour of rest. Bad decisions and accidents start to happen when the brain or your body goes to long without proper rest. Supervisors need to monitor their firefighters. Take breaks as needed and drink plenty of water. If you feel fatigue, speak up.
4. **Driving:** Drive with lights on all time. Don't drive where you can't see. Watch RR crossing and while working around RR. Watch your speed.
5. **Loggers:** will be working in Divs. Charlie on Council Rd. Watch for potential re-burns. Stay away from cutting site. Watch for trucks hauling on Council Rd. & HWY 94.

Training Specialist Message

The following contains information for both trainee and trainer/evaluators regarding the incident training program. The information is to assist you in planning your activities.

- 1) Trainee and Mentor/Evaluator register with Training Specialist (TNSP)
- 2) It is not necessary to be assigned to the incident as a trainee to receive credit for your assignment. If you have an open task book initiated by your home unit take the opportunity to accomplish tasks and receive credit.
- 3) It is only necessary to follow up with the TNSP during your assignment if you have any significant issues i.e. Changes in assignment/trainer problem with assignments etc.
- 4) Trainer and evaluator **MUST** “close out” with TNSP prior to Demob. The closeout process involves:
 - ✓ The trainer completing an individual performance evaluation (ICS 225/226)
 - ✓ The trainee will complete an exit interview form. Forms are available at the TNSP desk
 - ✓ The evaluator should have all work completed in the position taskbook at the time training assignment closeout. Including a recommendation as to the recommendation of the assignment i.e. recommend certification, needs more assignments, etc.
- 5) If you have reached a point where as much work can be done in the book as possible on this incident, you may perform the close out process with the TNSP prior to Demob which could save you time and a potential wait in line.

Collector for ArcGIS- Mobile Mapping App

Instructions



Situation Unit and GISS have implemented use of the Collector app for mobile mapping on the West Mims Fire. There are two types of users: Collector and Viewer. Anyone assigned to the incident can view mobile maps, and some will be designated to collect new data using the mobile maps. The data collected using Collector can be served directly to the Situation Unit as proposed. All new data must then be reviewed and approved by the Situation Unit Leader before it will show up on printed map products.

You must have an ArcGIS Online (AGOL) account to login to the Collector app for viewing or collecting. Many agencies have their own accounts. If you have an agency account, you can provide your account username to your DIVS. They will then provide that information to SIT.

If you don't have an AGOL account, you can request an account through the NIFC organization for AGOL using the following web link: <http://nifc.maps.arcgis.com/home/index.html>

You will receive an email to activate your account. After you receive your user name and set up your password, you can then provide your user name to your DIVS, and they will submit it to SIT.

If you need training on how to download maps for offline use in the field, let your DIVS know. **TIP:** When using Collector in the field turn your mobile device on airplane mode to save battery life.
