WATCH OUT WEATHER SITUATION TODAY
Gusty SW Winds & Thunderstorms Today & This Evening

DISCUSSION: A pattern shift today as unstable conditions and strong southerly winds impact the fire area ahead of an approaching cold front. Winds will shift from SSE in the morning to the SSW by afternoon with gusts 25-30 mph. A few spotty showers will be possible near the fire complex early in the morning. The potential for thunderstorms increases by midday and continues into the evening hours. A few severe storms capable of 60 mph wind gusts are possible during this time frame. Rain chances decrease after midnight tonight. Even if thunderstorms do not directly track over the fire site, gusty and erratic wind shifts and lightning will be potential hazards to the West Mims.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

With approaching cold front expect fire behavior to be very active due to high winds. As the front passes the winds will shift from the SE to SW. Outflow from approaching thunderstorm could cause unpredictable wind direction.

Fuel moistures and ERC's continue to be at record levels. Fire has burned much of what is available for consumption at this time within the planned containment area. Nevertheless, as the weather continues to be hot and dry, those areas that haven't carried fire previously will, at some point, become prone to fire spread.

For today expect maximum rates of spread to be 30-40 chains/hour and maximum flame lengths to be 8-10 feet. Good ventilation will allow for increased fireline intensity and spotting out to ½ mile.

Expect the fire to burn very active today where it has available fuel. 80-100% consumption of heavies, snags and duff. Intense burning with torching and spotting should be anticipated.

SPECIFIC:

DIV A/O: Backing fire will continue to burn between Soldier Island and the swamp edge break to the southeast where fuels will allow. On the west portion of DIV A, watch for re-burn along the perimeter.

DIV B/C: Re-burn will likely be an issue in these divisions today. With high winds, flare-ups along the west perimeter in DIV C may cause containment issues.

DIV D/E: Residual heat along Hwy 177 from burnout operation will cause flare ups near the containment lines. In the interior, Billy's Island will continue backing south. High winds may cause flare up on north end that could threaten containment along the canal.

DIV M/N: High winds today could cause fire to escape containment lines today. Residual heat along containment lines is likely, especially on the southern portion where intense fire behavior was exhibited yesterday.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Frontal passage could affect air operations due to high winds and thunderstorms.

SAFETY

Frontal Passage/Wind increased or changes directions. Cold front will pass over the fire area today. What does that mean to you? Your division? Your tactics?

IWI IC Responsibilities:

- Take charge of the scene – inform the Division Supervisor and Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name – Division A medical, Fish Meadows medical, Highway 21 accident.
- Assign or begin patient assessment (9 Line) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident. Transmit 9 Line patient information to Communications.
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. The Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required.
- As appropriate, conduct an After Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.

| <p>Transition: <i>Transition means a new IC and some new leadership, but it does not change the fire situation nor the hazards we may encounter. Be clear about your mission and your organization today. Are you prepared for a medical emergency?</i></p> <p>Driving: <i>Today may be the first day you drive on local roads or the one hundredth time. Driving these roads could be the greatest hazard of your day. Your PPE includes buckled seat belts, clear dashes, clear windshields, lights on, no distractions and time. Plan for sufficient time to drive safely.</i></p> <p>Equipment: <i>A lot of heavy equipment is working in and around this incident. Know your travel routes, both capacity and clearances. Fire equipment should have an equipment boss to assist in safe operations. Stay clear of equipment work areas – a minimum of 2.5 tree lengths. Use extra caution around logging equipment in the fire area.</i></p> <p>Storms: <i>Thunderstorms are likely today. Keep an eye on the sky and an ear by your radio. Be prepared to take shelter when alerted. A vehicle or building is the best shelter. Consult your IRPG pg 21 for thunderstorm safety. Prepare for significant changes in fire spread as erratic winds arrive with storms.</i></p> <p>Aviation: <i>Helicopters are a key resource to identify fire concerns and to cool down hot areas.
