3. Objective(s):

• Provide for the safety and security of incident personnel and public in all incident operations through sound risk assessment and hazard mitigations.

• Maintain a positive working relationship with all adjacent landowners, cooperators State and Federal partners. Inform, involve and communicate incident planning and operations with all partners.

• Confine all fires that are within the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge, inside the Refuge and/or inside the swamp edge break if possible.

 In cooperation with local timberland owners, use full suppression strategies and tactics to minimize damage to private timberlands and improvements and to prevent fires outside the Refuge from entering the Refuge.

• Assist in management and suppression of additional fires (new starts or breakouts) in the vicinity as approved by Agency Administrators and Unified Incident Commanders.

• Protect all cultural and archeological sites and structures within the refuge.

• Manage the fires cost-effectively consistent with the values at risk.

• Implement structure protection as necessary for at-risk facilities and communities.

Coordinate suppression actions with assigned Refuge Resource Advisors to protect endangered species.
Conduct all operations in a harassment-free environment. There will be a no tolerance atmosphere for

harassment, alcohol, or illegal drug use. Everyone will be treated with dignity and respect.

4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:

Keep fire within the Okefenokee Refuge Swamp Edge Break Boundary. Respond to initial attack fires on new starts within: *South of Suwannee Canal

*Within the Okefenokee jurisdictional boundaries

*Within state properties inside Perimeter Road

*North of GA 94/FL 2

General Situational Awareness:

Utilize; confine, contain, and point source protection strategies and tactics that commit operations personnel only where and when they can be successful, under conditions where important values at risk are protected with the least exposure.

DISCUSSION: Cooler conditions, low humidity and westerly winds are expected Friday as a broad area of low pressure lingers across the deep south. Passing light showers are possible with little rainfall accumulation expected. A dry cold front will push south of the fire site Friday evening. FUEL ASSUMPTIONS:

Primary fuels consist of shrub, shrub with pine overstory and timber litter. Current fuel conditions are favorable for very active fire behavior within all fuel types. The current drought conditions have led to both live and dead fuel moistures to reach critical levels. Expect all fuels to burn readily, including those that appear green.

<u>General Fire Behavior Forecast:</u> ... minimum fire growth today due to moisture received yesterday... Smoldering and creeping should be expected in the morning. As the humidity drops after noon the fire intensity will increase. Active burning should be expected in all areas of the fire that has available fuel.

SPECIFIC:

DIV A/O: Fire will continue to burn between Soldier Island and the swamp edge break to the southeast where fuels will allow. On the west portion of DIV A, watch for re-burn along the perimeter.

DIV B/C: Re-burn potential in the afternoon.

DIV D/E: If conditions allow Billy's Island will continue backing south.

DIV M/N: West wind will push smoke across containment lines. Short range spotting could be observed after noon as the conditions become flavorful for active burning.


INCIDENT: West Mims FireDATE: Friday, May 5, 2017Major Hazards & Risks: Driving, Equipment, Complacency, Wet Surfaces

Driving: Driving continues to be a major hazard on all highways throughout the Incident. Do not become complacent at any time when entering and exiting highways. Logging trucks are not clearly visible at times. Give them plenty of space to make wide turns as necessary. Adhere to posted speed limits. Your **PPE includes buckled seat belts, clear dashes, clear windshields, lights on, no distractions, and time.** .

Equipment: A lot of heavy equipment is working in and around this incident. Know your travel routes, both capacity and clearances. Fire equipment should have an equipment boss to assist in safe operations. **Stay clear of equipment work areas** – a minimum of 2.5 tree lengths. Use extra caution around logging equipment in the fire area.

Complacency: Although we received precipitation on some areas of the fire and fire behavior will moderated briefly, be aware that much more rain will be needed to completely remove the threat for extreme fire when conditions are right.

Wet Surfaces: Rain was received in some areas of the fire yesterday, watch your footing on wet surfaces.

Ensure communications are established with operators. During airtanker operations clear the drop zone before approach of the lead plane.
All	Structure Protection & HAZMAT	 Review "Wildland Urban Interface" Watch outs, IRPG page 12. Use "Structure Assessment" checklist, IRPG pages 13-15. Follow "HAZMAT Incident Operations" on pages 34-36 in IRPG. Identify and avoid damaged gas service near structures.

Know who you will contact in case of an emergency and practice the IWI protocol and 9 Line
ALL	Heavy Equipment Operations	 Ensure communications are established with operators. Use hand signals if other communications are unavailable. Maintain a 50'-100' exclusion area around equipment and increase it to 1 1/2 times tree height when in timber. Use a spotter when backing.
ALL	Night Operations	 Maintain high visibility in work area and wear vest while in roadway. Use glow sticks to mark hazards. Ensure personnel have a personal light (headlamp) and red strobe to ensure visibility. Watch for signs of fatigue. Take breaks away from areas of known hazard.
All	Train Traffic	 Observe warning signs when crossing tracks. If no warning lights are posted, bring vehicle to a complete stop and check for incoming trains before crossing. Use caution when crossing tracks with low vehicles or trailers. Contact CSX to ensure awareness to fire resourse locations.

Take charge of the scene – inform the Division Supervisor and Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name – Division A medical, Fish Meadows medical, Highway 21 accident.
 Assign or begin patient assessment (9 Line) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across

incident. Transmit 9 Line patient information to Communications.

• Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.

• Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.

• Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written

documentation of witnesses. The Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required.
 As appropriate, conduct an After Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.

Southern Area Red Team Social Media Guidelines for Fire Personnel

On an incident, only public information officers have authority to post original official fire information to social media. Our Facebook account for the fire is https://www.facebook.com/okefenokeewildliferefuge/

We don't prohibit you from posting to your personal social media accounts. If you do, please keep the following in mind.

- Safety is our highest priority.
 - Keep situational awareness by avoiding distractions.
 Losing situational awareness to take a cool photo or video isn't worth jeopardizing the safety of you, your co-workers, or that of the public.
 - If you're a supervisor talk about taking photos and videos with the people you supervise and let them know what you expect. Fireline supervisors have responsibility and discretion regarding taking photographs and videos on the job.
 - Promote safety by showing safe practices. Photos and videos that show missing PPE undermine our safe and professional reputation.
- You work for the Unified Command.
 - Represent them and the wildland fire community professionally with your posts. Ask yourself if you'd



want your boss to see what you've posted. Social media sites are monitored and you may be disciplined if you post inappropriate material.

- Your work may be requested by the agency for legal or other reasons. Agencies have different policies about photography and video rights.
- All official information from the fire comes from the Information section or personnel designated by Information to talk with the media.
 - If you are not a public information officer assigned to the incident, you should not post independent updates about the fire through social media. You are encouraged to forward official information disseminated by Information via social media. You are also encouraged to share your photos and videos with Information so they can post them through official incident means.
 - Send them to: okefirepio@gmail.com or give to an information officer.
 - Certain sensitive information, especially injuries and fatalities, is protected by the Privacy Act. Besides the legal aspect, consider the feelings of those affected or their families.
 - \circ Use a disclaimer saying that your social media site is not official fire information.


Finance Notes

For **ALL** resources:

- Please turn in CTRs and/or shift tickets *daily*.
- Record all of the meal breaks taken during your operational period, with a minimum of one during each shift. If no meal break is recorded, justification must be included in remarks.
- Be sure to document the reason for Hazard Pay or other differential (i.e., Environmental Pay) in remarks.
- Record your request number (i.e., E-1, O-1, C-1) on CTRs and shift tickets. For shift tickets, put the number in the upper right hand corner.
