3. Objective(s):

• Provide for the safety and security of incident personnel and public in all incident operations through sound risk assessment and hazard mitigations.

• Maintain a positive working relationship with all adjacent landowners, cooperators State and Federal partners. Inform, involve and communicate incident planning and operations with all partners.

• Confine all fires that are within the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge, inside the Refuge and/or inside the swamp edge break if possible.

 In cooperation with local timberland owners, use full suppression strategies and tactics to minimize damage to private timberlands and improvements and to prevent fires outside the Refuge from entering the Refuge.

• Assist in management and suppression of additional fires (new starts or breakouts) in the vicinity as approved by Agency Administrators and Unified Incident Commanders.

• Protect all cultural and archeological sites and structures within the refuge.

• Manage the fires cost-effectively consistent with the values at risk.

• Implement structure protection as necessary for at-risk facilities and communities.

Coordinate suppression actions with assigned Refuge Resource Advisors to protect endangered species.
Conduct all operations in a harassment-free environment. There will be a no tolerance atmosphere for

harassment, alcohol, or illegal drug use. Everyone will be treated with dignity and respect.

4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:

Keep fire within the Okefenokee Refuge Swamp Edge Break Boundary. Respond to initial attack fires on new starts within: *South of Suwannee Canal

*Within the Okefenokee jurisdictional boundaries

*Within state properties inside Perimeter Road

*North of GA 94/FL 2

General Situational Awareness:

Utilize; confine, contain, and point source protection strategies and tactics that commit operations personnel only where and when they can be successful, under conditions where important values at risk are protected with the least exposure.

DISCUSSION: High pressure will settle over the central Gulf of Mexico with strong west winds expected over the fire site again today with gusts of 25-30 mph by midday. Seasonably cool temperatures will continue with dry conditions. Winds will remain elevated tonight as a dry cold front approaches from the north with some passing clouds after midnight.

Primary fuels consist of shrub, shrub with pine overstory and timber litter. Current fuel conditions are favorable for very active fire behavior within all fuel types. The current drought conditions have led to both live and dead fuel moistures to reach critical levels. Expect all fuels to burn readily, including those that appear green.

The fuel moisture for today is:

Calculated 1 hr fuel 4%, 10 hr fuel 8%, 100 hr fuel 14%

ERC levels have been above 97 Percentile

Critical fire behavior thresholds: 1 HR Fuel Moisture <6%, RHs below 40% and a Dispersion Index greater than 60.

General Fire Behavior Forecast: ... Potential for large fire growth...

Active burning should be expected in all areas of the fire that have available fuel. If the fire gets established in pine plantations very high rates of spread should be expected. Short and long range spotting should be expected ahead of the fire.

SPECIFIC:

DIV A/O: Fire will continue to burn between Soldier Island and the swamp edge break to the southeast where fuels will allow. On the west portion of DIV A, watch for re-burn along the perimeter. Be on the lookout for long range spotting from interior burning.

DIV B/C: Re-burn potential is very high today.

DIV D/E: Billy's Island will continue flanking and backing to the south at a moderate intensity.

DIV M/N: West wind will push smoke across containment lines. Expect spotting to occur when this happens. The control lines will be tested today due to high winds and low humidity.


INCIDENT: West Mims FireDATE: Saturday, May 6, 2017Major Hazards & Risks: Fire Behavior, Driving, Heavy Equipment, Snags

Fire Behavior: Potential for <u>S</u>ignificant <u>F</u>ire <u>B</u>ehavior exists over the fire area today due to higher wind gusts and dry fuel and air conditions. Make sure you have LCES in place before engaging. Set Management Action Points and be prepared to disengage and reassess early if necessary.

Driving: *Distracted driving is the cause of many accidents. In fact* -More than **45,000 crashes** occurred by distracted drivers in Florida in 2015, resulting in more than **200 fatalities** and more than **39,000 injuries**. *Avoid driving distracted.*

Heavy Equipment: A lot of equipment is working in and around this incident. Know your travel routes, both capacity and clearances. Fire equipment should have an equipment boss to assist in safe operations. **Stay clear of equipment work areas** – a minimum of 2.5 tree lengths. Use extra caution around logging equipment in the fire area.

Snags: Heads-up for snags. Keep personnel out of the immediate area of snags and widow makers. Try to work away from the danger zone of potential falling snags. Flag or remove snags in work areas to mitigate the hazards.

ALL	Heavy Equipment Operations	 Ensure communications are established with operators. Use hand signals if other communications are unavailable. Maintain a 50'-100' exclusion area around equipment and increase it to 1 1/2 times tree height when in timber. Use a spotter when backing.
ALL	Night Operations	 Maintain high visibility in work area and wear vest while in roadway. Use glow sticks to mark hazards. Ensure personnel have a personal light (headlamp) and red strobe to ensure visibility. Watch for signs of fatigue. Take breaks away from areas of known hazard.

IWI IC Responsibilities										

IWI IC Responsibilities:

Take charge of the scene – inform the Division Supervisor and Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name – Division A medical, Fish Meadows medical, Highway 21 accident.
 Assign or begin patient assessment (9 Line) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across

incident. Transmit 9 Line patient information to Communications.

• Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.

• Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.

• Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written

documentation of witnesses. The Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required.
 As appropriate, conduct an After Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.



Why "RSB 1979" on all the sleeves?

Richard Simpson Bolt, Jr., age 48, a Biological Technician on Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge from July 12,1974 until February 28, 1979 was mortally burned while attempting to plow out a wildfire in "The Pocket" of Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge on February 15, 1979. Richard was burned over 70% of his body and survived for 13 days while being treated at the Brooke Army Medical Center in Fort Sam Houston, Texas before succumbing to his injuries.

Richard began his U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service career on June 1, 1964 as a temporary bulldozer operator on Santee National Wildlife Refuge in South Carolina. He became a career employee while stationed at Eufaula National Wildlife Refuge, Alabama. Subsequently, Richard served in a highly commendable manner on Key Deer and Loxahatchee National Wildlife Refuge in Florida before coming to Okefenokee.

Richard was a truly dedicated refuge employee. He gave his all and ultimately, his life, to the profession of which he was so very proud. Richard will always be remembered as an example in his private and professional life. He will be missed by all who knew him, and those that never knew this man will be less than they might have been.


