DISCUSSION: An upper level disturbance is expected to move over the region today with somewhat unstable conditions for the fire. Major Hazards and Risks: Urban Wildland Interface, Extreme Fire Behavior

Some thoughts from Paul Gleason, the creator of the LCES concept.

Wildland/Urban Interface – Suppression in the Urban Wildland Interface presents its own unique set of problems. The choice of fire line location is often influenced by the homes which stand between the fire front and a “better” option. Often the standard tactics of anchoring at the rear (or heel) and flanking, will leave improvements in the path of the wind driven fire.

The lack of an ideal fire line location does not in itself constitute unsafe indirect strategy. The “urgency” of the operation causes a breakdown in solid tactics. During interface suppression operations, maybe more than any other operation, the LCES System must be in place.

With the rapid spread rates reached by wind driven fires only two options are available. The traditional “anchor and flank strategy or the unorthodox protection of improvements and resources as the wildfire spreads past. The last dictates the necessity for a “defensible space” around each improvement sufficient to serve also as a safety zone, a true safety zone. Unless this precaution has been made, the risk of defending the improvement may not be worth the operation.

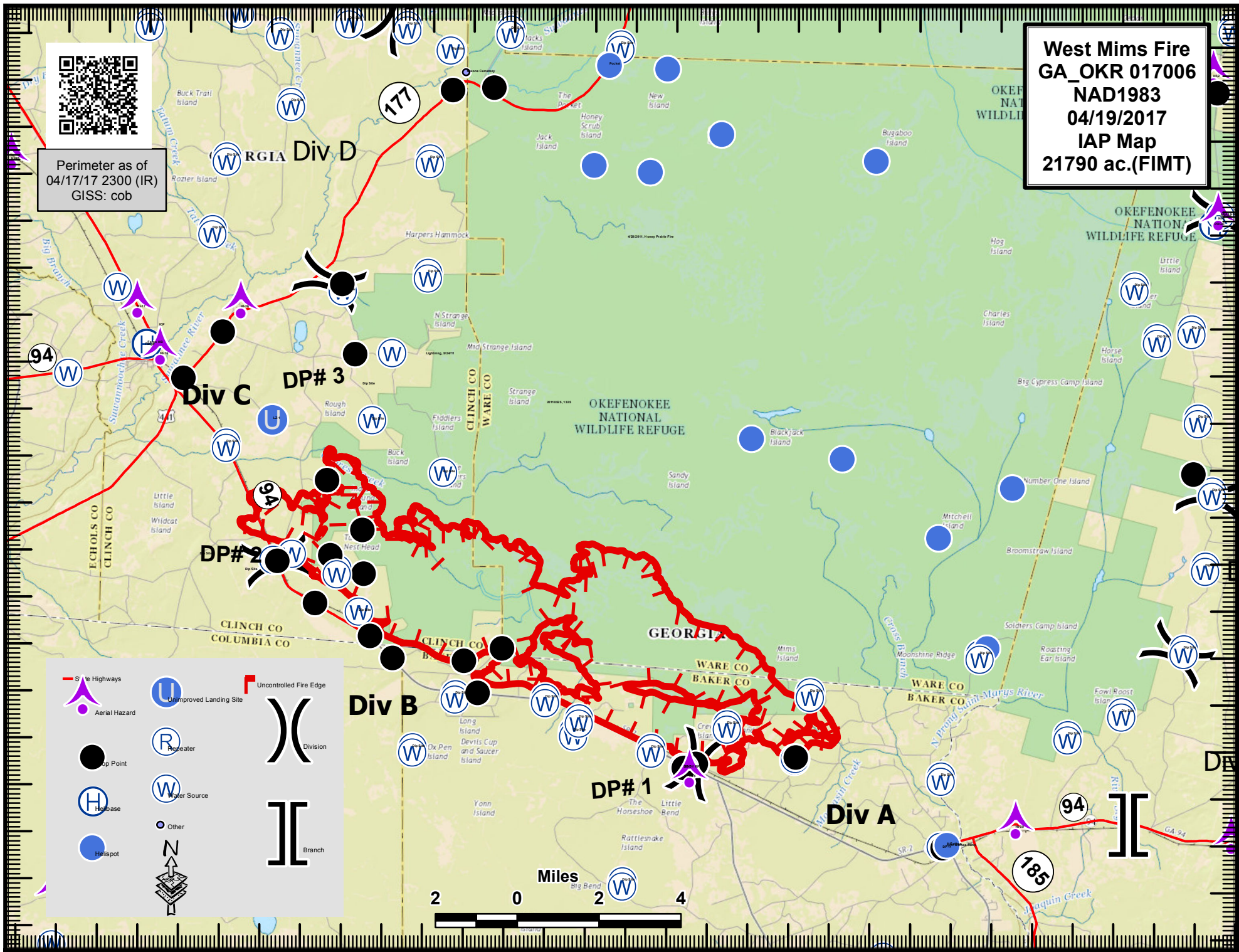

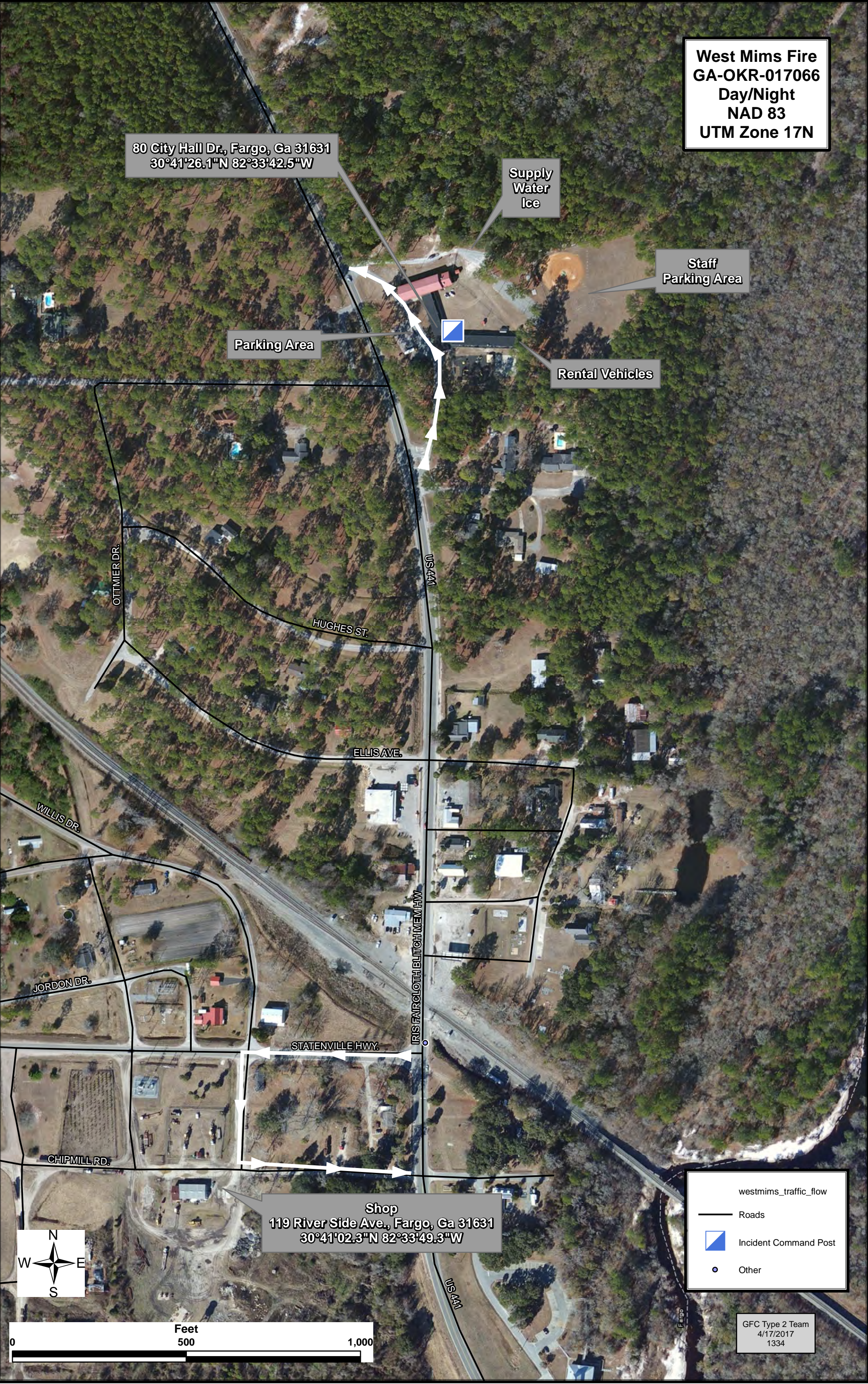

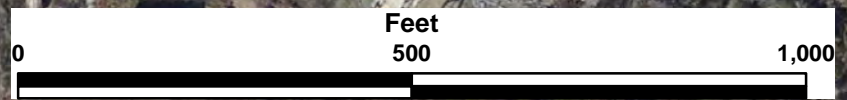
