DISCUSSION: Weak high pressure remains over the region from the Western Atlantic. Hot and near record temperatures will continue with very dry RHs for the fire area today. The east coast seabreeze is expected to shift the winds more southeasterly again late in the afternoon.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Today is the third day in a row of 90°+ temperatures. This will quickly dry out fuels that were unavailable to burn only a few days ago. Expect to see new areas begin to carry fire over the next few days. Winds have littered previous burned areas under pine stands with needle cast which is igniting and re-burning previously consumed areas as well.

By 1300 temperature is forecasted to surpass 90 degrees and RH's to be in the lower 40's. This will allow the fire to start burning well, and by 1400 fire activity will have picked up considerably. Expect flanking and backing fire most of the morning and midday, after 1600 watch for the fire to make runs to the northeast where fuels are available.

Flanking/Backing fire: ROS 10-15 ch/hr, FL 12-16 ft.

Head fire (short durations): ROS- 40-50 ch/hr, FL4-6 ft.

SPECIFIC:

DIV A: On east side fire continues to back from Dog Fennel Rd. to containment lines. West side has interior green islands that continue to burn out, as well as re-burns starting to occur in Pine stands.

DIV B/C: Little fire behavior is expected near containment lines. Interior continues to burn to the south backing into the wind in the Strange Island area. With southeast winds in the afternoon there is a slight possibility that fire could make a push south of Bugneck Rd. which is one of the few areas that fire could push through to the west. Re-burns will continue to be an issue.

DIV D/E: Strategic firing initiated on the north end of Billy's island will continue to flank south and west. Southeast winds in the afternoon may push fire on to the south end of Billy's Island, towards the State Park.

DIV M: Expect residual heat from yesterday's burn out operation and fire front along swamp edge break and Chesser Island. Southeast winds in afternoon should push any spotting interior.

DIV N: Fire will continue to back south against the wind along the swamp edge break.

DIV O: Fire north of Soldier Camp Island will continue backing to the southeast towards the swamp edge break into wet areas that are not prone to burning.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Fire behavior will not affect air operations today.

SAFETY

Weather getting hotter and drier... As weather continues to escalate so will fire behavior. Keep your situational awareness. Today's fire will not be yesterday's fire.

MY SAFETY

Leadership Category

An important aspect of safety is individual responsibility for one's own health & safety. Even with the best supervision, each individual firefighter will occasionally be required to make personal decisions concerning their safety. It is important that individual responsibility be taught as the basis for a viable safety program. Some of those individual responsibilities are:

- Fitness for duty. Begin each work shift both mentally and physically prepared for the rigors of wildland firefighting. Getting adequate sleep, maintaining a healthy diet, and proactively participating in physical training are the foundation of "My Safety".
- Utilization of personal protective equipment. Wear your PPE without being told. Each individual is responsible for performing their own risk assessments. If a hazard is identified that can be mitigated by wearing a particular PPE component it should be utilized. Fireline supervisors have more important duties to focus on other than performing glove patrol.
- Following safe work practices. Using a spotter when backing up vehicles is the prudent and professional course of action. If you are unsure of how to perform a job task safely, ask your supervisor or experienced coworker.
- Using the correct reference materials is an important aspect of safety. You should have a working knowledge of the Red Book, IRPG, and your local operating guidelines.
- Ensure instructions are clearly understood. Communication is a basic responsibility for all fire personnel. Ask appropriate questions to clarify uncertain issues. Speak up when you observe hazards that may place yourself or others at risk.
- Maintain situational awareness at all times. Awareness is a vital component of "My Safety". Pay attention to what is happening around your area of operations. Always display an awareness of what is happening around you by asking questions or making comments.

Summary: Do not expect someone else to be responsible for your safety. Take it upon yourself to make "My Safety" your number one priority.

Discussions points:

1. *Talk about ways you can improve on your safety.*
2. *Have your supervisor talk about their expectations for individual safety.*

Collector for ArcGIS- Mobile Mapping App

Instructions



Situation Unit and GISS have implemented use of the Collector app for mobile mapping on the West Mims Fire. There are two types of users: Collector and Viewer. Anyone assigned to the incident can view mobile maps, and some will be designated to collect new data using the mobile maps. The data collected using Collector can be served directly to the Situation Unit as proposed. All new data must then be reviewed and approved by the Situation Unit Leader before it will show up on printed map products.

You must have an ArcGIS Online (AGOL) account to login to the Collector app for viewing or collecting. Many agencies have their own accounts. If you have an agency account, you can provide your account username to your DIVS. They will then provide that information to SIT.

If you don't have an AGOL account, you can request an account through the NIFC organization for AGOL using the following web link: <http://nifc.maps.arcgis.com/home/index.html>

You will receive an email to activate your account. After you receive your user name and set up your password, you can then provide your user name to your DIVS, and they will submit it to SIT.

If you need training on how to download maps for offline use in the field, let your DIVS know. **TIP:** When using Collector in the field turn your mobile device on airplane mode to save battery life.
