Inform, involve and communicate incident planning and operations with all partners. • Confine all fires that are within the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge, inside the Refuge and/or inside the swamp edge break if possible. Aggressively suppress all fire outside the swamp edge boundary. • In cooperation with local timberland owners, use full suppression strategies and tactics to minimize damage to private timberlands and improvements and to prevent fires outside the Refuge from entering the Refuge. • Assist in management and suppression of additional fires (new starts or breakouts) in the vicinity as approved by Agency Administrators and Unified Incident Commanders. • Protect all cultural and archeological sites and structures within the refuge. • Manage the fires cost-effectively consistent with the values at risk. • Implement structure protection as necessary for at-risk facilities and communities. • Coordinate suppression actions with assigned Refuge Resource Advisors to protect endangered species. • Conduct all operations in a harassment-free environment. There will be a no tolerance atmosphere for harassment, alcohol, or illegal drug use. Everyone will be treated with dignity and respect.

DISCUSSION:

High pressure will remain in control with a continuation of dry conditions during the operational period. The position of the high pressure will keep east to southeast winds in place for tonight. Some patchy fog will still be possible around sunrise and shortly after. Temperatures are expected to bottom out in the lower 60s.

TONIGHT (TUESDAY NIGHT SHIFT):

- WEATHER: Mainly Clear. Patchy fog possible around sunrise.
- WIND (20 FT): ESE 6 to 10 mph early with a few gusts near 15 mph. Winds decreasing to 2 to 4 mph by morning.

FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: Timber with shrub understory (pine plantation) will be the most active fuel type. Current fuel conditions are favorable for very active fire behavior within all fuel types. Re-burn potential is high. Expect all fuels to burn readily, including those that appear green. Recent moisture will likely be short lived.

The fuel moisture for tonight at 2200 hours is:

Calculated 1 hr fuel 8 %, 10 hr fuel 11 %, 100 hr fuel 16 %

ERC levels have fallen slightly with recent rain but will trend back up rather quickly

Critical fire behavior thresholds: 1 HR Fuel Moisture <6%, RHs below 40% and a Dispersion Index greater than 60.

WEATHER: Mainly clear. Patchy fog possible around sunrise. Winds (20ft): ESE 6 to 10 mph with a few gust to 15 mph early, becoming calm by morning.

Min Temps: 60-65 Max RH:95-100% Max LVORI: 10 LAL 1

Chance Rain 0% Rainfall 0

General Fire Behavior Forecast: After an excellent drying day today, fuels will be receptive and available before the day shift concludes. At the onset of night shift, expect that any new starts or activity from earlier starts will be able to develop and grow-especially early in night shift. Rates of spread could be surprisingly high by end of day shift/beginning of night shift. Flame lengths and spread rates will decline after midnight as RH's rise.

SPECIFICS:

All divisions – smoldering and creeping possible, especially in heavy's or dozer berms.

Re-burn could be a problem early. Will likely settle down as RH's rise.

Initial Attack activity is likely by end of day shift. Fuels are dry enough to expect growth and movement from any new start. Divisions E F G received less rain - fire activity could be more active if responding to IA in this area.

IWI IC Responsibilities:

- Take charge of the scene – inform the Division Supervisor and Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name – Division A medical, Fish Meadows medical, Highway 21 accident.
- Assign or begin patient assessment (9 Line) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident. Transmit 9 Line patient information to Communications.
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. The Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required.
- As appropriate, conduct an After Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.

Spanish Moss

Spanish moss is one of the first things newcomers will notice here. It appears to hang everywhere! What is this scary, beautiful, intriguing, and perhaps annoying plant? Spanish moss is a bromeliad - it is in the same taxonomic family as pineapples.

This rootless plant prefers to grow on trees, used simply as a support. The moss is not a parasite. It thrives on rain, fog, sunlight, dust and debris. The outer layer of Spanish moss is covered by tiny scales that trap water until it is absorbed. In dry periods, it can go dormant.

Native Americans had many uses for Spanish moss. Later, it was used as padding in automobile seats, furniture, mattresses and, even insulation in homes. Bats, reptiles and, amphibians use moss clumps for shelter. Song birds often use it to build nests. Las Vegas tend to get creative with it.

Chiggers are often found in Spanish moss.

- **Submit** CTRs and/or shift tickets **daily**. Ensure that each is dated, signed by the incident supervisor, and includes your name (or the identification information for your equipment).
- **Include** your request number (i.e., E-1, O-1, C-1) on CTRs and shift tickets. For shift tickets, put the number in the upper right hand corner.
- **Record** meal breaks taken during your operational period, with a minimum of one during each shift. If no meal break is recorded, justification must be included in remarks.
- **Document** the reason for Hazard Pay or other differential (i.e., Environmental Pay) in remarks. The most common reasons for Hazard Pay are:
 - Helicopter ground operations under hovering helicopter (attaching slingloads)
 - Uncontrolled fireline duty (line construction, patrol, mop up, felling, etc).
*(This **does not** include non-suppression activities, e.g., media tours, incident personnel driving to the fire to observe activities, and drivers delivering tools or personnel.)*
 - Limited control flights
- **Document and mitigate excessive shifts:** If you must work more than 16 hours in an operational period, record why in remarks. In succeeding shifts, show that you mitigated the fatigue by taking off one hour for each two that you worked over 16.

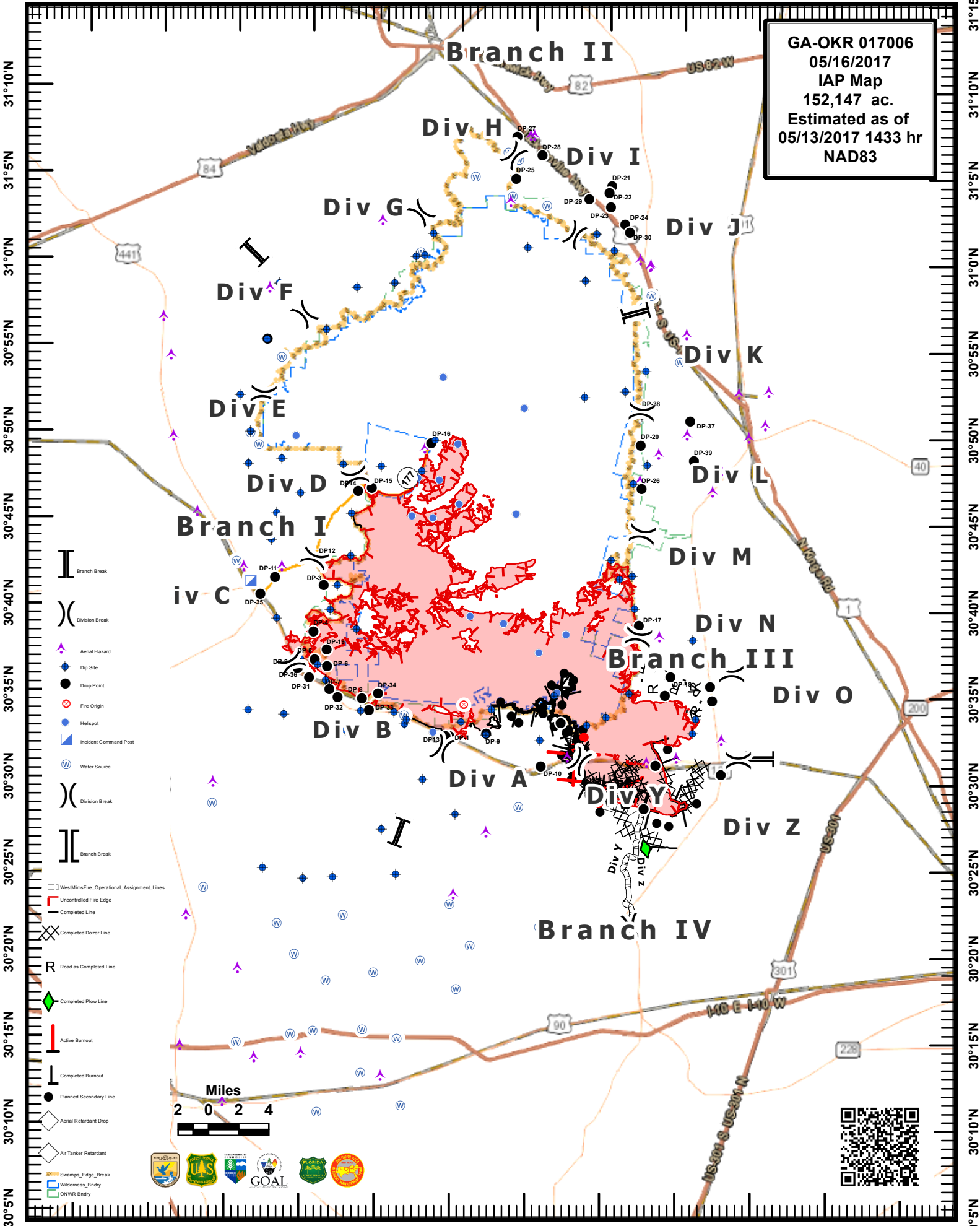
