.DISCUSSION...

Modest northeasterly flow will continue to stream showers onshore for most of the area through Sunday. Thunder is possible, though chances are very low at this time. Showery weather and plenty of cloud cover will result in low dispersions for most of the area for the rest of the weekend as well. Frontal boundary sinks slightly further south by Monday and Monday Night, which will limit rain chances to mainly eastern parts of northeast FL, and result in less cloud cover and higher dispersions over interior southeast GA.

FOG POTENTIAL AND OTHER REMARKS...We are closely monitoring the progress of Tropical Storm Milton, which is expected to move into the eastern Gulf of Mexico and across the Florida Peninsula by mid next week. Regardless of exact track and intensity, breezy and wet conditions are expected by mid week.



Equipment: Always use a spotter when backing up. Stay clear of heavy equipment as the line of sight is limited for the operator. When working around equipment at night, be sure to utilize head lamps and high visibility vest.

Chainsaw safety:

Always use a swamper when using the saw. Full PPE including hard hats, chaps, gloves , ear and eye protection must be worn when operating a saw or working as a swamper. Conduct frequent, scheduled briefings to ensure situational awareness.



Operating Heavy Equipment In Heavy Debris Areas :

When Operating equipment in heavy debris areas, slow down, stay situationally aware of the debris load you are pushing, move smaller amounts of debris instead of large loads. Put most experienced operators on equipment.

Shift tickets – every piece of equipment should have its own shift ticket. This includes any trailer used to haul supplies, equipment, fuel, etc. Multiple days can be placed on each ticket. All shift tickets must include the equipment GFC number. Chainsaw shift tickets should include bar length.

Equipment time needs to be captured in shift hours that the equipment works. Do not include hours that you are at briefings or meal breaks.







Incident within an Incident Plan (Updated 9/14/15)

The **Incident Commander** is responsible for overall action in case of a serious accident.

ON SCENE

Upon occurrence of a "SERIOUS" incident involving significant injury or fatality within the incident, the highest qualified person on scene shall take control of the situation until the nearest <u>Division/Group Supervisor</u> arrives to assume control. Immediate and clear communication must be established between Operations and Division/Group Supervisors to determine who can arrive at the scene quickest and assume control of the situation. In the event of such an incident in camp or on incident roads, on-site personnel shall take control until an <u>Operations Chief</u> or <u>Division/Group Supervisor</u> arrive or <u>Local Law Enforcement</u> and/or <u>Medical personnel</u> have assumed control as the <u>On-Scene Incident Commander.</u>

Incident Communications or the **On-Scene Incident Commander** will take immediate action to clear all radio traffic on the incident "Command Channel" by broadcasting *"Emergency Traffic Only"*, so that quick and proper coordination for handling the accident can take place.

At no time during the incident will the name of the subject(s) be used over the radio.

Upon arrival at the incident scene, whoever has been designated to manage the incident (Operations Section Chief or Division/Group Supervisor) should take immediate actions to:

- Identify and mobilize medical personnel to the scene notify them you are in charge.
- Coordinate appropriate transportation for injured personnel.
- Restrict unnecessary personnel from the accident scene.
- Secure the scene area and identify witnesses for investigation.

The nearest <u>Line Safety Officer</u> will respond immediately to the scene to assist the <u>On-Scene Incident</u> <u>Commander</u> and shall be responsible for initiating the proper investigation and documentation by qualified personnel.

ICP

Immediately upon notification of a serious incident requiring emergency action, the <u>Incident Commander</u>, <u>Medical Unit Leader</u>, <u>Planning Operations</u>, <u>Safety Officer</u>, and <u>Air Operations</u> shall respond to the incident communications facility in order to support the incident. The <u>Medical Unit Leader</u> will normally physically operate the radio during the patient assessment/care portion of the incident. In the absence of the <u>Incident</u> <u>Commander</u>, The <u>Planning Section Chief</u> will assume the supervisory role.

<u>Planning Section Chief, Logistics Section Chief, Finance Section Chief</u> and <u>Public Information Officer</u> shall be notified and may be requested to respond to incident communications as dictated by specific emergency needs.

<u>Public Information Officer</u> is responsible for managing external communication. All information released from the incident shall be through the <u>Public Information Officer</u> with the approval of the <u>Incident Commander</u>.

The <u>Incident Commander</u> will make contact with the <u>Agency Administrator</u> who will in turn contact appropriate officials of the agency. If the accident involves a fatality, the <u>Agency Administrator</u> will be responsible for implementing Agency specific protocols for dealing with the incident.
