The Fire Danger statement that includes the Kisatchie NF has been extended into Sunday 10/1, with additional extensions likely into next workweek. Fuels in the area are dry, but still not nearly as dry as fuels just to the south in the Lake Charles (LCH) area. For the requested time period of 10/01 to 10/03, daily conditions will likely remain the same as an upper-level ridge remains in place. However, a cold front will begin to approach the region on 10/04, with rain chances increasing thereafter.

WEATHER/CLIMATOLOGY DISCUSSION:
Check the daily fire weather forecast for the NWS zone that you are working in.

Outlook as of 1600 on 9/29/2023

Fire Weather Watch for parts of western and central Louisiana Saturday and Sunday. Hot temperatures and abnormally dry conditions will dominate through Monday. Highs will range from the mid-80s to low 90s at the coast to the low and mid-90s inland, with a few readings in the upper 90s possible across western and central Louisiana. These highs are within a few degrees of records for this time of year. A persistent feed of dry air will continue to infiltrate the region, with minimum RH as low as 20-30% each afternoon; the immediate coast will see RH from 30-45%, highest in far southeast Louisiana. Saturday AM will still have good recoveries, but maximum RH Sunday and Monday will potentially range from 50-70% for many areas. Winds through the southern tier of both states will be gusty during daylight hours, with peak gusts from the east or east-northeast of 15-25 mph inland and 25-35 mph for the coastal parishes and counties. Gusts will be lower and less prevalent in northern areas. Isolated thunderstorms may clip far southeastern Louisiana at times, but the majority of Louisiana and all of Mississippi will see no rainfall.

FIRE BEHAVIOR DISCUSSION:

A Fire and Fuels behavior Advisory has been issued for Louisiana and Mississippi due to critically dry fuel conditions along with record setting indices used to predict fire danger.

In all fuel types that have canopy, transition from surface fire to canopy should be expected. Spotting will be a problem, and resistance to control will be high.

Expected Fire Behavior for Saturday (09/30) through Monday (10/02):

GS3-Grass/Shrub: **ROS 15 to 60 **CPH, FL 6-11 feet. Expect FL in excess of 11 feet and ROS exceeding 60 CPH in areas dominated by denser grass fuels.*

7-Southern Rough: *ROS 12 to 48 CPH, FL 4-8 feet. Expect passive crown fire. Active crown fire possible especially where terrain and wind align and from outflow winds near isolated thunderstorms.*

TU2-Timber: *ROS 5 to 20 CPH, FL 2-5 feet. Expect passive crown fire. Active crown fire possible especially where terrain and wind align and from outflow winds near isolated thunderstorms.*

Spotting up to ¼ of a mile away has routinely been reported on recent fires, including small initial attack fires. When the temp gets over 90 and the RH is 20-25% the ***PIG is 70+. PIG > 70% HIGH PROBABILITY OF SPOT FIRES

*ROS-Rate of Spread, **CPH-Chains per Hour (1 chain = 66 feet) 40 chains per hour is .5 miles, ***PIG-Probability of Ignition

In the event conditions change forecasts may need to be revised. Major changes may include,
1) Major change in weather forecast
2) Widespread rains
3) Observed fire behavior is not well represented by forecast
In the event reassessment criteria is met, request a spot weather forecast and an updated fire behavior forecast.

SAFETY

Spot weather forecasts should be requested or submitted online for those fires that have potential for extreme fire behavior, exceed initial attack, or are in areas where Red Flag Warnings have been issued.

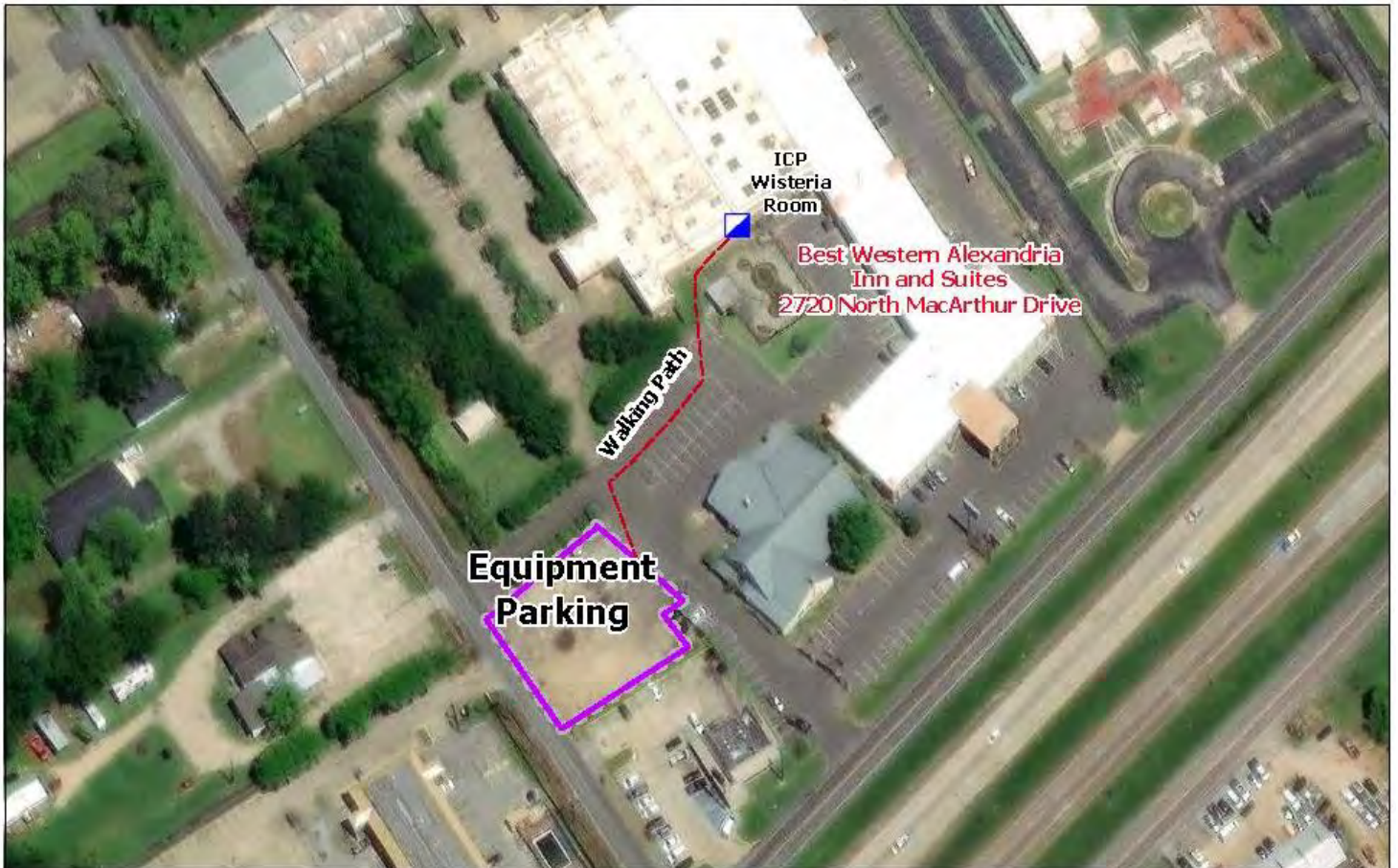

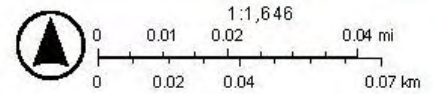

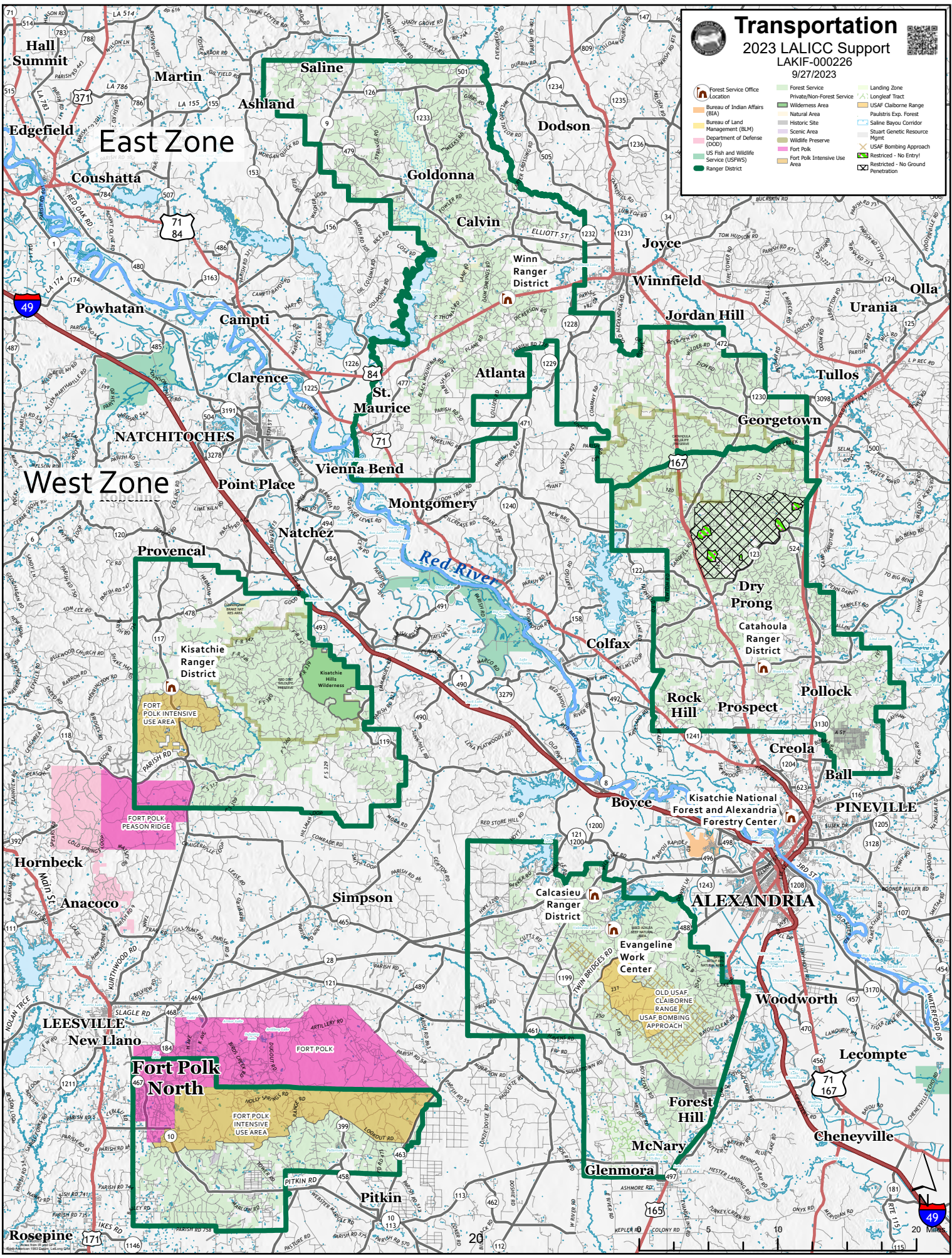
ICP Map FY23 LICC Support

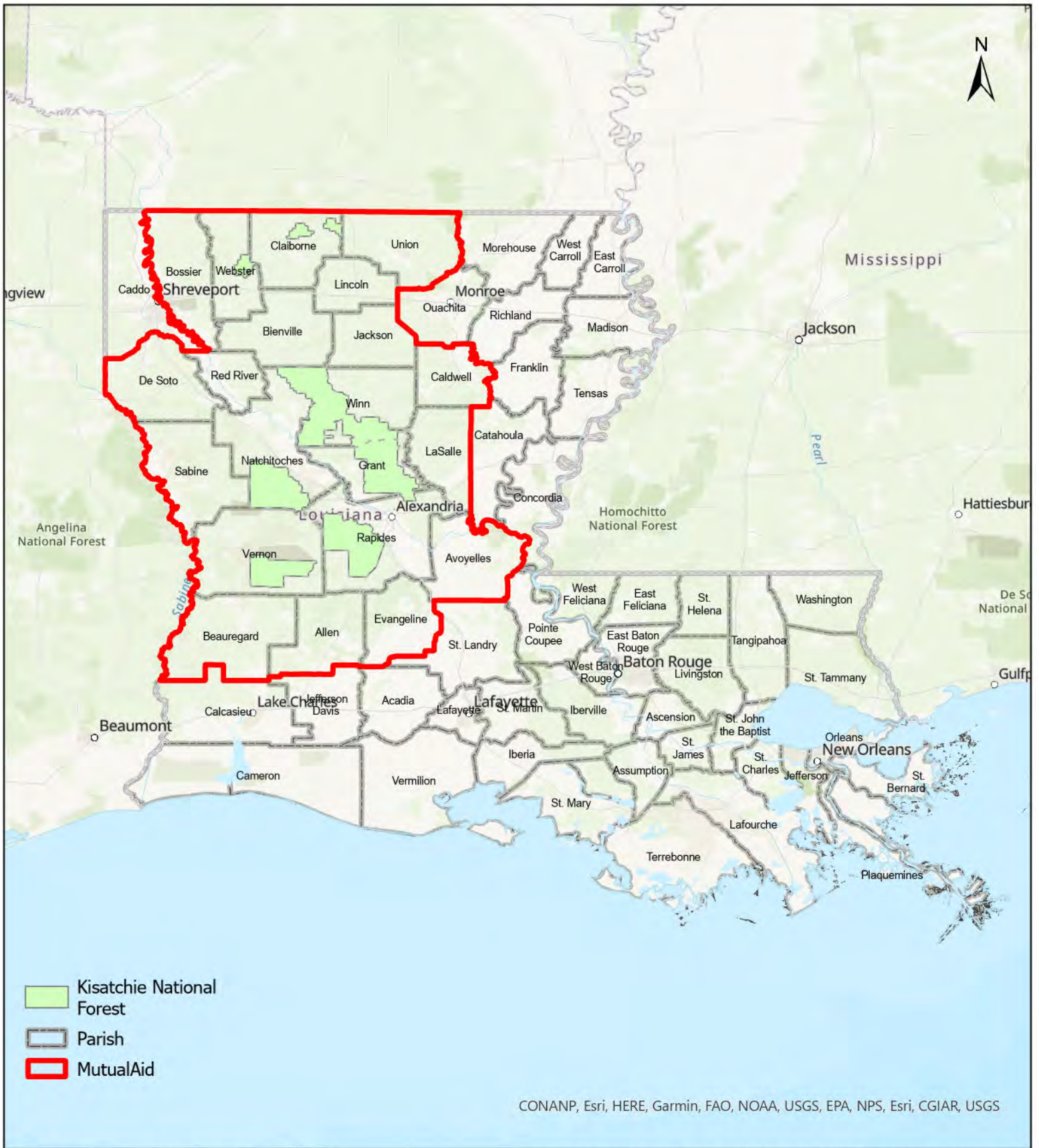

Medical Emergencies

IWI IC Responsibilities – Division Group Supervisor or Point of Contact

- Take charge of the scene – inform the Division Supervisor and LICC that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name – Division A medical, etc.
- Assign or begin patient assessment (Medical Incident Report - MIR) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident. Transmit MIR patient information to Communications.
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with communications and 911 when needed. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for initial documentation, but a narrative will be required.
- As appropriate, conduct an After-Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (**Verify correct frequency prior to starting report**)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: *Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.*

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
