<p>Local thresholds of fuels to be of concern: 20-foot wind speed over 20mph RH less than 30% Temperature over 95F KBDI over 650</p> <p>Historically, large fires (over 80 acres) on the Kisatchie NF tends to increase when BI values are above 19 and 100-hour fuels are below 17%, especially in combination with other local thresholds listed above. KBDI is a good indicator of resistance to control. At KBDI values above 400, the litter and duff layers contribute to fire intensity and will burn actively. Be prepared to adjust tactics based on current and expected fire behavior.</p>

East Zone Fire Weather

Milder temperatures and dry post-frontal conditions are expected through the remainder of this weekend as high pressure settles across the region. The next chance of rain will return by early next week with another cold front advancing into the region. The remainder of next week looks unsettled as upper-level troughing will maintain rain chances through the mid to late week timeframe. Minimum RH values will range from around 25-35 percent on Sunday and Monday before increasing through the rest of next week with higher chances for rainfall.

WEATHER/CLIMATOLOGY DISCUSSION:

Rains on Friday brought some relief to the state. Areas of South-central LA received .25 to .5 inches of rain. **Rain amounts were much lighter in the eastern half of the state** with amounts north of I-10 ranging from .1 to .3 inches. There will be isolated chances for rain again Saturday morning before things dry out Saturday afternoon through Tuesday. Temps will remain in the low 90s through Monday with **potential for critical RHs starting Sunday.**

The 6 to 10-day outlook is calling for above normal temperatures for the majority of the state. Chances of above normal precipitation for Northwest Louisiana. **Portions of far east LA are forecast for below normal precipitation.**

FIRE BEHAVIOR DISCUSSION:

Short Range (Saturday through Monday): ERC(Y): 32 KDBI(Y): 723 BI(Y): 20 (Vernon RAWs)

A Fire and Fuels behavior Advisory has been issued for portions of the south including Louisiana. Very hot temperatures are forecast to dry out fuels and increase ERC values in the areas of concern during much of the first half of September. **Fire weather thresholds required to produce crown fire in high-risk timber and brush fuels are much lower with the fuel dryness indicated by 90th-percentile-or-greater ERCs.**

Rain on Friday will help moderate fire behavior in some areas. **Areas missed by rain will continue to see moderate to extreme fire behavior.** Drier weather and lower RHs forecast for Sunday will dry out increased **needle cast from Friday storms enhancing potential for escapes on existing contained fires.** Patrol and mop will be important over the next few days. **Initial attack should expect holdovers from lighting as fuels dry out and in areas to the east that received less rain than received lightning.**

Expected Fire Behavior for Saturday through Monday: Areas missed by rain or minimal rainfall occurred can expect the following conditions. Fire behavior will be more moderated in areas that received more substantial rains.

Grass: ROS 20 to 30 CPH, FL 4-6 feet. Expect FL in excess of 6 feet and ROS exceeding 40 CPH in areas of denser grass fuels.

Brush: ROS 6 to 12 CPH, FL 4-6 feet. Expect passive crown fire. Active crown fire possible especially where terrain and wind align and from outflow winds near isolated thunderstorms.

Timber: ROS 3 to 6 CPH, FL 1-3 feet. Expect passive crown fire. Active crown fire possible especially where terrain and wind align and from outflow winds near isolated thunderstorms.

Medium Range (Monday through Tuesday):

Winds are forecast to be less than 10 mph over the period, but temps remain in the low to mid 90s with RH values in the low to mid 30s, contributing to drying of existing fuels and potential for reburn in needle cast.

Long Range Tuesday night into Wednesday

Relative humidities are forecast to rebound with increased potential for showers and storms.

Reassessment Criteria:

In the event conditions change forecasts may need to be revised. Major changes may include,

1) Major change in weather forecast, 2) Widespread rains, 3) Observed fire behavior is not well represented by forecast
In the event reassessment criteria is met, request a spot weather forecast and an updated fire behavior forecast.

SAFETY

1) Reburn of scorched needle cast in pine will be a holding problem on containment lines especially areas that experienced strong frontal winds on Friday contributing to accumulation.

2) Trees damaged by fire and/or impacted by recent storms will be prone to falling. Work with fireline and initial attack resources to identify hazards and mitigations.

IWI IC Responsibilities – Division Group Supervisor or Point of Contact

- Take charge of the scene and identify/determine who is in charge of assessing and treating the patient.
- Use the Medical Incident Report (in IRPG or IAP) to relay critical information regarding patient assessment, transportation, and resource needs.
- Coordinate the request for transportation and/or other resources based on patient assessment.
- Ensure that information about patient assessment, transportation or other resource needs is transmitted directly over the radio on command and by phone (911). **Note that dispatch may be closed at night.** If you are on a fire at night, your first option for medical assistance may be 911. Make sure someone has cell phone coverage at all times.
- The Incident Commander, Medical Unit Leader, Safety Officer and Communications unit will be notified promptly. The IC will ensure that all remaining command and general staff are notified.
- All incident personnel will be instructed by the appropriate chain of command position to clear the designated radio channel for “emergency traffic” related only to the emergency situation. If the chain of command individuals are not available, the highest qualified person on scene will broadcast “emergency radio traffic.”

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Communications

The local Coordination Center radio identifier is "Pineville Dispatch". All communication is in clear text only. Make sure you have this dispatch phone number: 318-473-7035 in case radio communication fails. Note that this dispatch center is likely closed at night. If you do not understand the local terms and/or communications, make sure you ask for clarification

The success of any team hinges on the communication skills of the team members. Effective communications require skills in active listening and filtering. During high risk operations, all attempts to communicate should follow these measurements:

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Is it Accurate?• Is it Relevant?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Is it Timely?• Is it Complete?
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When communications meet these measurements, the five communication responsibilities come into play. The five communication responsibilities are:

1. Brief 2. Ask if you don't know	Identify hazards Acknowledge messages	Debrief
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When these elements are followed, you will build trust and cohesion, which can lead to commitment and accountability.

Communications are a challenge. Let's meet this challenge head on and continue to develop effective teams.

Military Training Areas and UXOs

Local factors: There are military areas that we firefighters are not to enter. Check with local resources and the maps of the area to make sure you are not near a military training area. There are UXOs that may be out there.

1. If you see UXO, stop. Do not move closer.
2. Never remove anything near UXO.
3. Clearly mark the UXO area with flagging, etc.
4. Keep a minimum of 500 feet away from any UXO that is on fire.
5. Report discovery of UXO to your immediate supervisor and/or dispatch.

The military is responsible for fire suppression on their bombing ranges and the Fire Directory has military Liasons to call.

Resources assigned to LICC Fire Support and the Ida fire are requested to submit all finance documents electronically to the email listed below.

Please email electronic copies of the following documents as applicable:

- Contract/Agreement/State Cooperative Agreement
- Casual Hire Form (ADs)
- Resource Order
- Crew Manifest

The preferred method of turning in CTR's, Shift Tickets, or other associated time documents is direct to our Finance email. Electronic copies can include PDF, scanned copies of documents, or pictures of documents. QR codes and links are below to fillable PDF time documents.

- CTRs and Shift Tickets should be submitted at a minimum, every other day.
- Justifications are required in the remarks when posting Time without meal breaks.
- Hazard Pay is required to be justified in the remarks, such as: "Firefighting on an uncontrolled Fireline."
- VIPR Resources should submit lodging receipts periodically rather than at the time of demob.
- Include your cell phone number on CTR and/or Shift Tickets in remarks.
- Our Finance email does not have an auto reply.

Partial Payments – VIPR Resources should have an interim invoice submitted after 14 days. Please email lodging receipts while assigned to the incident(s) to finance to complete and interim invoice if extending.

Demob – Please notify finance when emailing time documents for your last operational shift to close out time.

Coding Time

Please ensure to include correct incident code on CTRs and/or Shift Tickets based on the information below.

FY23 LICC Fire Support – P8EK6V23 0806

Code to LALIC Support when not assigned to a wildfire during staging.

ABC Misc. – P8EK2123 0806

Code hours working fires less than 300 acres on USFS lands, and all fires in the initial response/mutual aid zone that do not exceed 1 operational period. **VIPR Resources:** code full work shift for day to this code when responding to an IA fire.

Fire Codes – Fires that exceed 300 acres and/or 1 operational period will have to have a new fire code generated that will be provided to code to. Notate on CTRs and Shift Tickets when responding to initial attack fires, include fire name if known.

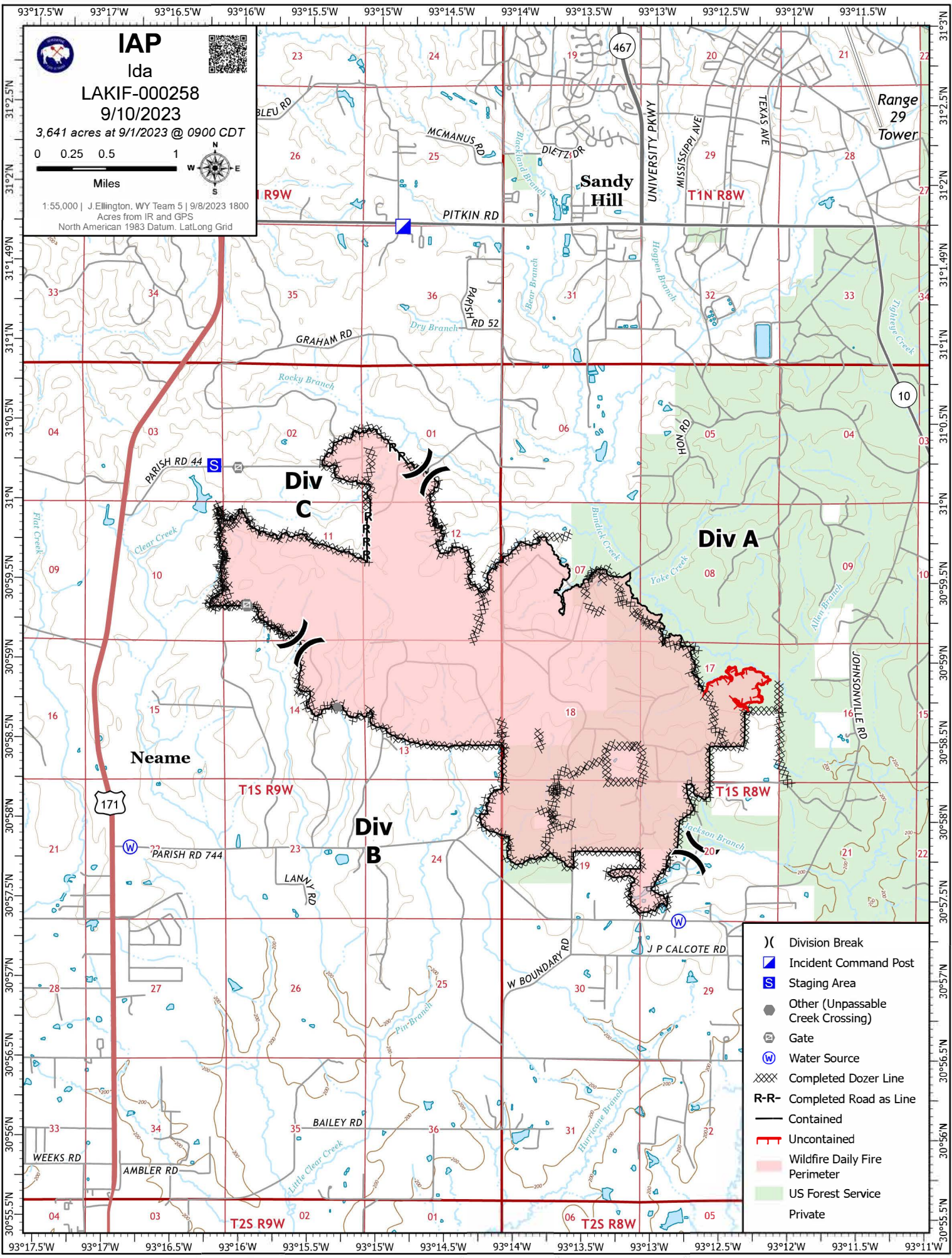
