### **WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

### \*\*\*RED FLAG WARNING 10 AM to 8 PM \*\*\*

After a morning of poor/low RH recovery, A Red Flag Warning will go into effect from 10 AM until 8 PM. This is a result of hot, very dry conditions, and wind gusts up to 17 mph. RH will be slow to moisten into the evening, with recoveries into Friday morning rather poor in the 50-60% range. Friday will be similar to today, with the possibility of another Red Flag Warning. By Friday evening, the sea breeze may reach the fire area bringing brief gusty winds, but finally a return of excellent RH (90-100%) recovery by Saturday morning.

during the early evening. Low confidence at this time.

**MIXING HEIGHT:** Weak morning inversion. 10,000-11,000 ft during the afternoon.

**TRANSPORT WIND**: E 4-9 mph.

**EXTENDED OUTLOOK: SATURDAY - MONDAY:** Saturday into Monday, flow remains onshore with improved afternoon min RH and the return of recoveries upwards of 90%. As moisture increases across the region, showers/storms are becoming increasingly likely during this time period. At this time, odds of a wetting rain (0.25"+) are around 30-40% each afternoon. Uncertainty remains with the evolution of this system, so confidence is low. However, confidence is much higher for increased humidity and lessening fire weather concerns.

### **FIRE BEHAVIOR:**

Fuels are critically dry. **KBDI** and **ERC** values are at record levels. Fuel conditions combined with gusty winds, especially during the afternoon, have the potential to produce extreme fire behavior. Fires may exhibit erratic and explosive growth behavior. Be alert for thunderstorms in the fire area during the afternoon that could cause strong erratic winds. Isolated heat points displayed on IR maps could transition into active flame as drying continues.

Live fuel moisture samples collected at the north end of Division O on 08/29 ranged from 49 to 59 percent moisture, MEANING they are well into the transition of live fuels contributing to fire intensity and spread as if they were dead fuels.

### Fire Behavior based on values for the fuel models shown.

Vegetation	Fuel Model	Max Rate of Spread	Flame Length
Grass/Shrub	GS3	118 ch/hr ~ 1.5 miles/hr	11 feet
Southern Rough	7	94 ch/hr ~ 1.2 miles/hr	10 feet
Timber Litter and Understory	TU2 / TL6	39 ch/hr~ .5 miles/hr	6 feet

During peak heating expect **Spotting** distances up to **0.5 miles** from wind driven ground fire and slightly less from torching trees.

### Probability of Ignition Day = 70%

A new spot fire or ignition in the afternoon could reach 2 **acres** in an hour in sheltered timber and 8 **acres** where grass/shrub and southern rough fuels are continuous. If exposed to wind gust at or above 20 mph the potential size could more than double!

### Specific Areas of Concern:

**UNIT**: Private Lands

**All Divisions**: Live fuels are dry enough to act as dead fuels and support fire spread in the same way. Isolated heats are still showing near lines that could develop into open flames and spread as needles and leaves continue to fall.

**Div A**: Where reburn potential and unburned areas exists, short runs encouraged by northerly winds are possible in the afternoon and early evening.

**Div F:** North and northeast winds could encourage rapid fire spread on the west side of the division and along Nichols-Sibley Rd.

**Div J**: Isolated and scattered heat remain close to the lines. Watch for torching and short runs where fuels are continuous.

**Div O and W**: Isolated and scattered heat remain close to the lines. Watch for torching and spotting. North winds will continue to test lines across both divisions.

### Air Operations:

Generally good conditions for air operations, gusting winds may cause some issues. Increased smoke from interior or new starts will reduce visibility.

### Fire Behavior Safety Message

Reassess your situation and mitigate hazards if you have any doubts about your escape routes or safety zones or if the situation becomes too complex. The Tiger Island Fire has numerous changes in vegetation type and age throughout providing for a broad range of fire behavior possible.



### IWI IC Responsibilities - Division Group Supervisor or Point of Contact

- Take charge of the scene inform the Division Supervisor and Tiger Island Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name Division A medical, etc.
- · For backup IWI communication, call the IWI phone: (208) 891-6743.
- Assign or begin patient assessment (Medical Incident Report MIR) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident. Transmit MIR patient information to Communications.
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader.
   Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals
  will not be transmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. The Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required.
- · As appropriate, conduct an After Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.

### **Medical Incident Report**
