**Discussion:** A heat advisory is in effect today with heat index values of at least 108 and up to 112 degrees across the area. The hot temperatures will overwhelm the humidity in place, driving afternoon RH below 40% before the day's showers and thunderstorms erupt. Expect winds to be generally light and somewhat variable, though more out of the north/northwest than other directions. However, afternoon thunderstorms will again drive the threat of strong, erratic winds - to around 50 mph in the very strongest storms. These storms will also carry the threats of frequent lightning and brief, localized heavy rain.

Some drier, post-frontal air will attempt to move in behind the weak front, but isn't expected to clear things out entirely. Rain chances will be lower, but not entirely dry. Relative humidity is expected to fall into the 25-35% range, but overnight recoveries still look to be relatively good. Expect winds to remain light and variable or northerly, but with some gusts reaching into the teens. Another front is anticipated very late Tuesday night or Wednesday, which will increase shower and storm potential into the mid-week.

### FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Fuels are critically dry. **KBDI and ERC values are at record levels.** Fuel conditions combined with gusty erratic winds, especially during the afternoon, have the potential to produce active fire behavior. As days since rain increases, isolated heat points displayed on IR maps are more likely to transition into active flame as drying continues.

**Live fuel moisture** samples from the fire area range from **49 to 65** percent moisture.

#### Fire Behavior based on values for the fuel models shown.

During peak heating expect **Spotting** distances up to **0.1 miles** from wind driven ground fire and slightly less from torching trees.

Probability of Ignition Day = **60%**

A new spot fire or ignition without suppression in the afternoon would be less than **0.1 acres** in 15 minutes in sheltered timber and up to **6 acres** where grass/shrub and southern rough fuels are continuous.

#### **Specific Areas of Concern:**

##### **All Fires:**

- Late morning and afternoon heating and drying will be enough to support ignition and spread in needle cast and ladder fuels.
- Rainfall affects continue to diminish today with areas that have been quiet for several days experiencing reburn that could support torching and spotting in the late afternoon.
- Possibility of torching increases today.
- Hot spots sheltered from rain will start to reignite and spread as unburned fuel dry and become available.
- Live fuels are dry enough to act as dead fuels and support fire spread in the same way.

#### **Air Operations:**

Generally good conditions for air operations.

#### **Fire Behavior Safety Message**

The body's methods for preventing overheating are conduction, convection, radiation, and evaporation (sweating). When the air temperature is higher than the skin temperature, sweating is the only way to prevent overheating. During sweating, blood is diverted to the extremities, where water diffuses from the blood to the surface of the skin. As water evaporates, the body loses 580 kilocalories of heat for each liter of sweat evaporated. On average, wildland firefighters need 4 to 6 liters of water per day to stay hydrated.

### Major Hazards and Risks:

- 1. Thunderstorms      2. Driving      3. Heat/Dehydration      4. Fire Weakened Trees

**Thunderstorms** cause significant hazards for wildland firefighters, including downbursts. Downbursts can cause extreme fire behavior and lightning. When thunderstorm development is likely, lookouts should be aware of the signs. Approaching thunderstorms may be noted by a sudden reverse in wind direction, a noticeable rise in wind speed, and a sharp drop in temperature.

**Situation Awareness:** Sound waves move at different rates based on atmospheric conditions. Take the storm precautions below as soon as you hear thunder, not when the storm is upon you. Do not resume work in exposed areas until 30 minutes after storm activity has passed.

#### Hazard Control:

- Take shelter in a vehicle or building if possible.
- If outdoors, find a low spot away from tall trees, wire fences, utility lines and other elevated conductive objects. Make sure the place you pick is not subject to flooding.
- If in the woods, move to an area with shorter trees.
- If only isolated trees are nearby, keep your distance twice the tree height.
- If in open country, crouch low, with feet together, minimizing contact with the ground. You can use a pack to sit on, but never lie on the ground.
- If you feel your skin tingle or your hair stand on end, immediately crouch low to the ground. Make yourself the smallest possible target and minimize your contact with the ground.
- Don't group together.
- Don't stay on ridge tops, in wide open areas, or near ledges or rock outcroppings.
- Don't operate landline telephones, machinery, or electric motors.
- Don't handle metal hand tools or flammable materials in open containers.

## Understanding The Lightning Threat

### What you need to know...

- *Your chances of being struck by lightning depends on your behavior when storms are in the area.*
- *The threat for lightning increases as a storm approaches, peaks when it is overhead and gradually diminishes as it moves away.*
- *Many people wait too long to get to a safe place and then go back outside too soon before the threat is over.*
- *Poor planning or surprise thunderstorm development catch many people off guard.*

**IWI IC Responsibilities – Division Group Supervisor or Point of Contact**

- Take charge of the scene – inform the Division Supervisor and Tiger Island Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name – Division A medical, etc.
- **For backup IWI communication, call the IWI phone: (208) 891-6743.**
- Assign or begin patient assessment (Medical Incident Report - MIR) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident. Transmit MIR patient information to Communications.
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for initial documentation, but a narrative will be required.
- As appropriate, conduct an After Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.

### Medical Incident Report

FOR A **NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT**: WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A **MEDICAL EMERGENCY**: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE **"MEDICAL EMERGENCY"** TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM COMMUNICATIONS

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH **(Verify correct frequency prior to starting report or call IWI phone: (208) 891-6743.)**  
*Ex: "Tiger Island Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."*

2. INCIDENT STATUS: *Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.*  
*Ex: "Tiger Island Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) "This will be the Trout Meadow Medical Incident, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."*

<b>Severity of Emergency AND Transport Priority (priority 1, 2, 3)</b>	<input type="checkbox"/> <b>RED / PRIORITY 1</b> Life or limb threatening injury or illness.
