3. Objective(s): 1. All operations will be conducted with safety of the public and firefighters in mind. Protection of life and property is your highest priority task. When in doubt, sacrifice acres rather than firefighter and public safety. 2. Provide timely and accurate information regarding the incident's status and strategy to cooperating agencies, stakeholders, property owners, public, and media. Coordinate information sharing with LDAF and the State Fire Marshall's Office. 3. Manage the human resources assigned to the fire incident in a manner that promotes mutual respect and is consistent with interagency human resources objectives. The team will handle EEO complaints in consultation with LDAF Human Resources involving personnel attached to the team. 4. Continue partnership and coordination with the appropriate LDAF, State Fire Marshall, GOHSEP, and local public safety officials. 5. Manage the incident in a cost effective manner.																
4. Operational Period Command Emphasis: Stop, Think, Discuss, then Act and ensure LCES is in place prior to engaging the fires. Ensure that the Tiger Island, Highway 113, Lions Camp Road, and Elizabeth Fires receive a strategic, risk-based response commensurate with the threats and opportunities and uses the full spectrum of management actions that consider fire and fuel conditions, weather, values at risk, and resources available.																
General Situational Awareness Watch Out Situations: Extreme heat, dry fuels, and fire behavior. Aviation use and possible long medevac times. Cumulative fatigue. Maintain situational awareness - your division, the divisions working near you, and your chain of command.

Discussion: Yesterday's front is stalled on the Gulf coast, with an unsettled pattern to continue. Showers may pop up as early as late morning, but focus for scattered showers and storms will be in the afternoon and early evening. Most rain will be light to moderate, producing amounts around or less than a quarter inch each day. The strongest storms will be capable of producing a quick inch or two of rain in isolated spots along with gusty outflow. Beyond the scattered showers, expect a mix of sun and clouds, allowing temperatures to rise up into the 80s and near 90 degrees and minimum RH values above 60% today and above 40% tomorrow.

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FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Be alert for thunderstorms in the fire area during the afternoon that could cause strong erratic winds that could cause fire movement, even with higher fine fuel moistures. These are the fuels that drive the fire. Heavy fuels remain extremely dry. These are the fuels that retain the heat. **KBDI, ERC values, BI, and RH are at critical levels.** Live fuel moistures are critically low (45-55%) and should be treated as fully cured/dead. There is the **potential** for active fire behavior and spread today even with higher RH values.

In **15 minutes**, a new spot fire or ignition during peak burn conditions in receptive fuels that could reach **3 acres.**

Specific Areas of Concern:

All Divisions: The diminishing heat due to the extensive mop-up have reduced but not eliminated the threat for additional fire movement. Heavy fuels like stumps, logs and dozer berms will continue to hold heat and providing the ignition source for reburn during the peak burning period. It is very important to keep the needle/cast cleared from all holding lines. Lightning outside of any rain event could produce new ignitions. These could show up hours to days after the lightning strike.

Tiger Island: Infrared continues to show scattered heat across the fire area. Check heat spots identified on the IR near the firelines, especially during mid-afternoon during the peak burn period.

Hwy 113/Elizabeth: Critical to monitor the reburn areas near holding lines and structures. Check heat spots identified on the IR and all firelines with needle/leaf cast, especially during mid-afternoon during the peak burn period.

Lions Camp Road: Critical to monitor reburn areas and check any identified heat sources from the IR.

Air Operations:

Generally good conditions. Isolated storms in the afternoon may affect air operations.

Fire Behavior Safety Message:

Stepping in stumpholes, falling trees/snags or branches are very much hazards today. Look up, look down, look all around before initiating any actions.

Watch for gusty, erratic downdraft winds and lightning from developing thunderstorms in the afternoon.

HEALTH AND SAFETY MESSAGE

Talking about safety might get old, but so do firefighters that practice it.

Major Hazards and Risks: Communications, Thunderstorm Safety, Distractions

Communications: Clear communications that are understood by the sending and receiving parties is critical to successful operations. This topic continues to be emphasized because everything depends on sending and receiving information. Did the supplies get delivered to the correct location for that day's operational plan? Are the coordinates correct for the air resources to deliver their load? There are many examples and all of them are important. When having those difficult conversations...remember it isn't as important what you say, but it is important how you say it. Life is all about relationships and we all need to think before we speak.

Thunderstorm Safety: The possibility of thunderstorms is mentioned in the weather forecast. With the amount of hazard trees on these fires this it is important to look up, look down, look all around. Park vehicles and equipment in open areas if available. Seek shelter until the storm passes if you can. Refer to page 21 in the IRPG for items that are specific to your situation.

Distractions: Don't be distracted from your primary task. These can creep in as the worst possible moment when you need to be focused. Make your decisions based upon as much information as you can gather at the time needed to move forward and remember there is rarely 100% complete information. Don't dwell on previous errors, learn from those experiences to understand how to avoid the same mistake twice.

Stop...Think...Discuss...Act

Stop - Take the time to think about what you're going to do. Ask yourself, what is the worst thing that can happen?

Think - Think about how you're going to accomplish your mission. Is it the safest way or is there a better way to accomplish the goal? Do you have the right tools, training, equipment?

Discuss - Two heads are better than one. Share your ideas and concerns with others. We all have different experience and perhaps another perspective will result in a better course of action.

Act - Act in the safest way possible. Follow proper procedures, don't rush, and STOP if it can't be done SAFELY.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING COMPLETION OF OF-289 PROPERTY LOSS OR DAMAGE REPORT

To file a claim for Property Lost and/or Damaged, it is important you provide all necessary information to support the claim. Failure to do so could result in the claim being disapproved. To file, you complete both page 1 and page 2 of the OF-289. **Contact the COMP to get a fillable OF-289 that allows digital signatures.**

Ensure the following information is provided on the 2-page form:

PAGE 1:

- **Resource Order Number** for the Incident where damage and/or loss occurred.
- **The Compensation and Claims Specialist must be able to contact you if they have questions. Be sure you note your email address and cell phone number so they may contact you. Provide:**

Name of person filing the Claim (who the COMP will contact)
Claimant's work unit Name and Address
City, State, Zip
Claimant's email address
Claimant's phone Number

- **Incident Number** as shown on your Resource Order; example: LA-LAS-000252
- **Name of the Incident** as shown on your Resource Order; example: Tiger Island
- **Financial Codes** as shown on your Resource Order.
- Check your **Type of Employment**.
- **Pay close attention when entering information for "Description of Property Lost or Damaged"**. Be sure you include:
 - Each item you are requesting replacement/repair for. Be sure to include identifying information such as serial numbers, vin numbers, model numbers, etc.
 - Include the age of the equipment.
 - Include the quantity, i.e. how many were damaged or need repaired?
 - **Include these attachments:** 1) Pictures of the damage; 2) Prints showing the current cost for the item you are requesting be repaired or replaced; 3) Police reports, if applicable
 - **Important** – Include the **COST** you are requesting for repair or replacement of the item. The **COST** must include any amounts for **SERVICE** or **SHIPPING**, when applicable. For instance, it might cost \$240 to get a part to repair a vehicle, but an additional \$275 for the mechanic. Include the entire amount needed. (Quotes can be obtained from local repair shops, websites, etc.)
 - **Attach any additional information to support your claim;** i.e. general messages, handwritten notes, etc
 - **Important** - Indicate whether the item is a State Compact resource
- **A claim is not valid unless the loss/damage was caused because of work you were completing for the incident. Be specific.** Include the date, place, division on the fire and a good description of how the damage/loss occurred.
- If someone **witnessed** the loss or damage occurring, have them complete, sign and date where indicated.
- Employee who is submitting the claim should **Sign and Date** the OF-289 form.

PAGE 2: Page 2 is critical information to support your Claim. After employee signs and dates the OF-289, it should be forwarded to:

- **Incident Supervisor:** This is your direct supervisor while working on the Incident. **The Incident Supervisor should validate that what you stated occurred and provide any other information they have to support what you are claiming.** They need to indicate whether they do or do not recommend approval.
- **Subject Matter Expert: The Subject Matter Expert provides verification of the COST being requested and provides any other applicable information to support the claim.** They need to indicate whether they do or do not

recommend approval. The Subject Matter Expert may also annotate their recommendation for how the claim should be resolved, i.e. if the items can be replaced at the incident, etc.

Once the recommendations above have been obtained, the OF-289 should be emailed, along with all attachments, to the Finance inbox, with the word “**claim**” included in the subject line so that it will flow to the COMP inbox. After reviewing the claim for completion, the COMP will then forward the OF-289 as follows:

- **Finance Section Chief:** The Finance Section Chief will make a recommendation whether the claim should be approved, and may include any comments that may be pertinent to the claim.
- **Incident Agency Representative:** The Incident Agency Representative is **whomever the Agency has designated as approving official**. This is usually the Incident Business Advisor. They will make the decision whether or not the claim should be approved, including any contingencies for the approval.

If the claim is approved, the COMP will send a General Message to the **Supply Unit** and request an S#. Upon receipt of the S#, the COMP will return the approved OF-289 to the claimant, along with **the S# which authorizes incident funding not-to-exceed the amount approved** by the designated approving official.

What else? Double check to insure that:

- **There are 2 pages of the OF-289 form. Be sure you complete and return both, with all attachments.**
- **If the claim is for property paid for by and owned by the employee, there is a different form to be completed. Do not complete the OF-289 form for this type of claim.**
- **The incident Compensation and Claims Specialist (COMP) is here to assist. If you have questions, do not hesitate to contact them. For further assistance on submission of a claim, contact Susan Deimel at 501-337-3598.**

5 WAYS

To Support Someone Who Might be Struggling



Let others know you are open to talking about mental health



Our everyday words and actions communicate our attitudes about mental health. Be aware of the messages you might be sending to others. Normalize that mental health is part of our overall health. If you feel comfortable doing so, sharing your own experiences getting through hard times can send a strong message to others that you are a safe person to talk to.

"Mental health is just as important as physical health."

"I went through a rough time last year. I talked to a counselor, and it really helped."

Start a Conversation

Sometimes it is hard to know what to say to someone we think might be struggling, so we just don't say anything at all. Talking about mental health is the first step to supporting others and helping someone get connected with resources that might help. Start by letting them know you care and that you've noticed a change. Ask questions to better understand.



"Hey, I've noticed you haven't been joking around with us like you normally do, and yesterday you seemed pretty upset. I care about you and have been wondering how you're doing."

Really Listen



Give your full attention to the person speaking. Ask questions to better understand the person's experience, and offer non-judgmental support. We often become distracted by the urge to share our own thoughts or offer solutions. We usually can't fix what's happening for the other person, but we can offer care and encouragement.

"What you're going through sounds really hard. I'm glad you told me."

Be Prepared to Talk About Difficult Topics, Including Suicide

If you are worried that someone is considering suicide, ask them directly. If someone shares they are having thoughts of suicide, let them know it's a signal that it's time to speak to a mental health professional, and let them know that help is available. If a person is at immediate risk of harming themselves or someone else, stay with them, call 911, or take them to the nearest emergency room. Never promise to keep thoughts of suicide a secret.



"I know you're going through a lot right now and that things are really hard. I really think talking to someone to help you get through all of this could make a big difference."

Help Make Connections



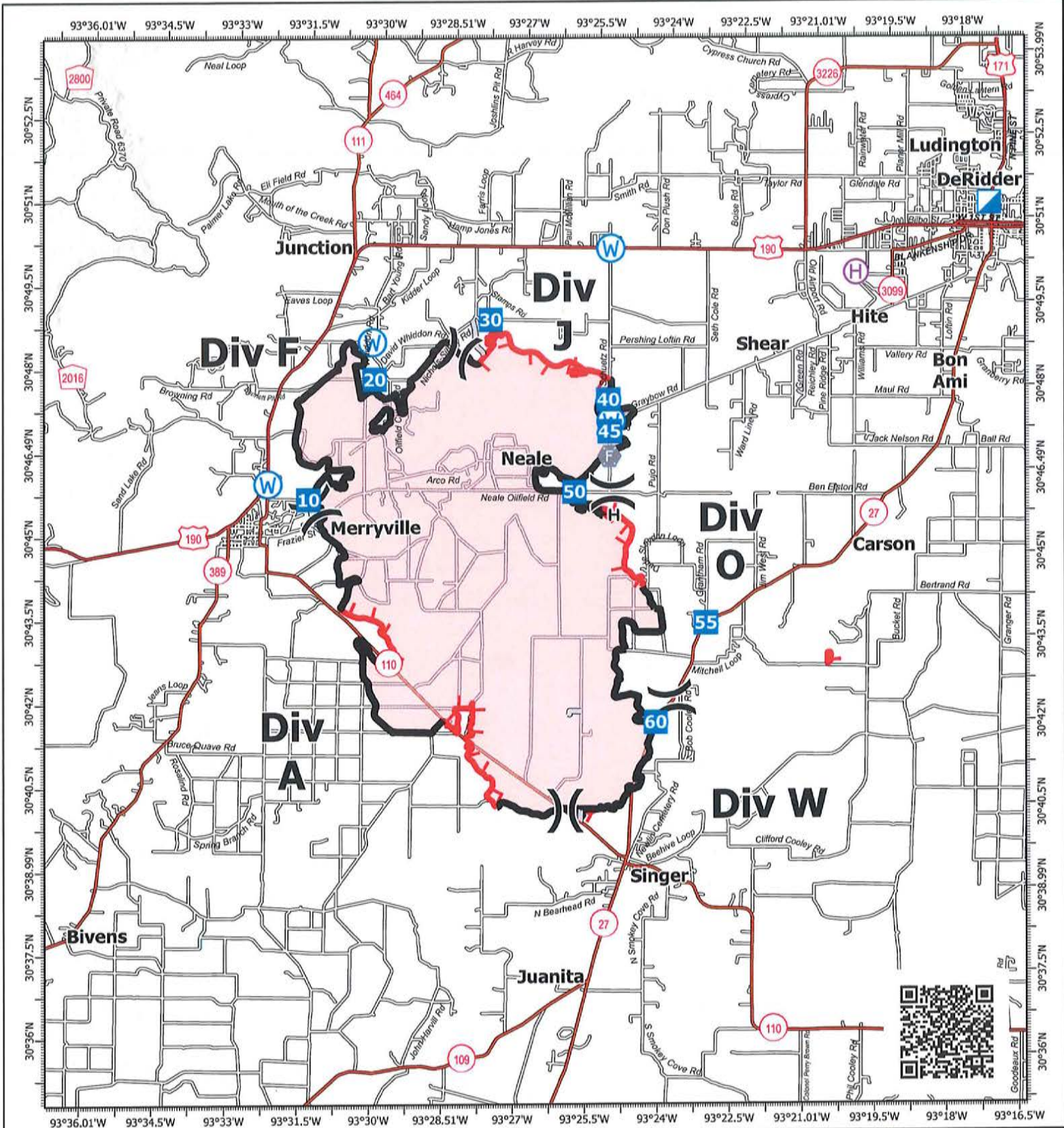
Taking the first steps to seek mental health or substance use care can be difficult. Offer to help find a provider or make connections with someone else who can help.

IWI IC Responsibilities – Division Group Supervisor or Point of Contact

- Take charge of the scene – inform the Division Supervisor and Tiger Island Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name – Division A medical, etc.
- **For backup IWI communication, call the communications phone: (804) 807-5821.**
- Assign or begin patient assessment (Medical Incident Report - MIR) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident. Transmit MIR patient information to Communications.
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for initial documentation, but a narrative will be required.
- As appropriate, conduct an After Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
