Discussion: Dry conditions hit their lowest today, with relative humidity falling ibelow 25% this afternoon. Winds will tick up a bit, but still light to moderate. Anticipate sustained winds closer to 10 mph than 5, with gusts into the middle teens. An infrequent gust closer to 20 mph may be possible. Look for winds to veer southeasterly tomorrow. Though this will start to bring some humidity back to the larger fires and southernmost portions of the forest, even there, relief will be small and incremental with afternoon RH falling below 30% again.

Extended Outlook:

Slow, incremental improvement in humidity should be expected as Gulf air creeps back in. Despite this, expect minimum RH values below 40% each day. Rain is unlikely as afternoon showers and storms should stay close to the seabreeze nearer the coast, but an isolated cell could try to push as far north as the southernmost fires and Calcasieu RD.

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

With clear skies, temperatures in the mid 90's and RH in the low 20's expect moderate to extreme fire behavior. Fuels are critically dry. **KBDI (775), 10hr FM 6, BI of 23 remains at critical levels above the thresholds for increased fire activity and growth.** Fuel conditions combined with increased winds, especially during the afternoon, have the potential to produce very active fire behavior. Live fuel moistures are critically low (45-55%) and should be treated as fully cured/dead.

In 15 minutes, a new spot fire or ignition during peak burn conditions in receptive fuels that could reach 5 acres.

Specific Areas of Concern:

All Divisions: The diminishing heat due to the extensive mop-up, high humidity and moisture have reduced but not eliminated the threat for additional fire movement. Heavy fuels like stumps, logs and dozer berms will continue to hold heat and provide the ignition source for reburn during the peak burning period. It is very important to keep the needle/cast cleared from all holding lines. Conditions will be favorable for new ignitions.

Tiger Island: Critical to check heat identified on the IR and reburn areas. With lower fuel moistures expect reburn in the needle/leaf cast, especially during mid-afternoon during the peak burn period.

Hwy 113: Critical to check heat identified on the IR and reburn areas. With lower fuel moistures expect reburn in the needle/leaf cast, especially during mid-afternoon during the peak burn period.

Elizabeth/Lions Camp Road: Monitor fires for hot spots and reburn, especially during mid-afternoon during the peak burn period.

IDA: Check heat identified on the IR and all firelines with needle/leaf cast, especially during mid-afternoon during the peak burn period.

Air Operations:

Generally good conditions. Isolated storms in the afternoon may affect air operations.

Fire Behavior Safety Message:

Fatigue: It has been a busy season, and we are approaching the end of this incident. Fatigue affects decision making in a negative way. Follow the work/rest guidelines. With the lower operational tempo there should be no one that isn't getting adequate rest after each day.

Hydration: That morning cup of coffee does not match that bottle of water you need first thing in the morning. With the higher temperatures and full sun being well hydrated takes an intentional effort to maintain. It is one of the most important things you can do to feel well.

Driving: Continue to keep distractions out of your head while you are driving. Even the most experienced driver can make a mistake when other thoughts take your attention off driving, even if only for a few seconds. If you need to make a call, pull off the road and stop before picking up your phone. You can be fined \$100 if you are observed holding your cell phone while driving in Louisiana.

IWI IC Responsibilities – Division Group Supervisor or Point of Contact

- Take charge of the scene inform the Division Supervisor and Tiger Island Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name Division A medical, etc.
- For backup IWI communication, call the communications phone: (804) 807-5821.
- Assign or begin patient assessment (Medical Incident Report MIR) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident. Transmit MIR patient information to Communications.
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for initial documentation, but a narrative will be required.
- As appropriate, conduct an After Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.
