<b>3. Objective(s):</b>  1. All operations will be conducted with safety of the public and firefighters in mind. Protection of life and property is your highest priority task. When in doubt, sacrifice acres rather than firefighter and public safety.  2. Provide timely and accurate information regarding the incident's status and strategy to cooperating agencies, stakeholders, property owners, public, and media. Coordinate information sharing with LDAF and the State Fire Marshall's Office.  3. Manage the human resources assigned to the fire incident in a manner that promotes mutual respect and is consistent with interagency human resources objectives. The team will handle EEO complaints in consultation with LDAF Human Resources involving personnel attached to the team.  4. Continue partnership and coordination with the appropriate LDAF, State Fire Marshall, GOHSEP, and local public safety officials.  5. Manage the incident in a cost effective manner.																
<b>4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:</b>  Stop, Think, Discuss, then Act and ensure LCES is in place prior to engaging the fires. Ensure that the Tiger Island, Highway 113, Lions Camp Road, and Elizabeth Fires receive a strategic, risk-based response commensurate with the threats and opportunities and uses the full spectrum of management actions that consider fire and fuel conditions, weather, values at risk, and resources available.																
General Situational Awareness Watch Out Situations: Extreme heat, dry fuels, and fire behavior. Aviation use and possible long medevac times. Cumulative fatigue. Maintain situational awareness - your division, the divisions working near you, and your chain of command.

**Discussion:** A new pattern of primarily southeasterly winds becomes established. This will gradually help boost humidity across the region from south to north, but it will be a slow, gradual improvement from day to day. A weak upper disturbance today will not bring rain, but may enhance winds today. Tomorrow, expect wind to settle back down to more typical levels from recent days.

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### FIRE BEHAVIOR:

With clear skies, temperatures in the mid 90's and RH in the upper 20's to low 30's expect moderate to extreme fire behavior. Fuels are critically dry. **KBDI (777), 100hr FM 10, BI of 23 remains at critical levels above the thresholds for increased fire activity and growth.** Fuel conditions combined with increased winds, especially during the afternoon, have the potential to produce very active fire behavior. Live fuel moistures are critically low (45-55%) and should be treated as fully cured/dead. **Fire Behavior based on values for the fuel models shown.**

In **15 minutes**, a new spot fire or ignition during peak burn conditions in receptive fuels that could reach **6 acres.**

#### Specific Areas of Concern:

**All Divisions:** Heavy fuels in drainages, logs and dozer berms will continue to hold heat and provide the ignition source for reburn during the peak burning period. It is very important to keep the needle/cast cleared from all holding lines. Conditions will be favorable for new ignitions.

**Tiger Island:** Critical to check heat identified on the IR and reburn areas. Monitor the unburned fuels in the drainages and timber stringers. The lower fuel moistures and weather conditions will increase the potential for reburn in the brush and needle/leaf cast. The spot in DIV A is an area that needs attention.

**Hwy 113/ Elizabeth:** Critical to check heat identified on the IR and reburn areas. Monitor the unburned fuels in drainages, timber stringers. Heavy fuel loads in the drainages continue to dry out and the potential for reburn increases along 10-mile creek in both fires.

**Lions Camp Road:** Monitor fires for hot spots and reburn, especially during mid-afternoon during the peak burn period.

#### Air Operations:

Generally good conditions.

#### Fire Behavior Safety Message:

There are still unburned fuels in drainages and scorched brush to provide a ladder from surface to crowns in timber stringers. Watch for intense burning in jackpots of heavier fuels.

Remember, LCES always even when the fire does not appear to pose any threat to your safety.

**Major Hazards and Risks:** Fatigue, Driving, Hydration,

**Fatigue:** Fatigue affects everyone physically and mentally. It can affect your reaction time while driving, decisions can be more difficult and/or challenging, it affects your ability to focus, and can lower your immune system. It is vital to your health to get adequate rest after a long day. This is somewhat easier on this assignment since we are using hotels vs. a camp. No one should be working beyond the 2:1 work rest ratio except when the fire dictates. If this happens it must be mitigated the next operational period. This standard is for your benefit so be sure to follow this policy.

**Hydration:** Remember the recommendation from the Safety group, drink that first bottle of water when you wake up. Eight hours of sleep with no hydration means your body needs water. Don't get behind on this as you may never catch up during the workday.

**Driving:** There has been an increase in accidents. This is a signal that fatigue is beginning to affect our driving skills. Stay focused on driving while behind the wheel. This applies to all assigned resources, 3 of the 4 recent accidents happened away from the fireline.

### IWI IC Responsibilities – Division Group Supervisor or Point of Contact

- Take charge of the scene – inform the Division Supervisor and Tiger Island Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name – Division A medical, etc.
- **For backup IWI communication, call the communications phone: (804) 807-5821.**
- Assign or begin patient assessment (Medical Incident Report - MIR) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident. Transmit MIR patient information to Communications.
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for initial documentation, but a narrative will be required.
- As appropriate, conduct an After Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.
