#### **HEALTH AND SAFETY MESSAGE**

INCIDENT: Simmons and Juniper Road Fire DATE: 7/17/11 TIME: 0730-1900

#### **Major Hazards and Risks:**

**SNAGS**-Stay out of area, essential fire line personnel only, look at root system before working/parking. IRPG pg. 20. **Complacency:** Remember Situation Awareness Keep focus on objectives, communication, previous fire behavior, weather forecast local factors.

<u>**DRIVING-**</u> Drive defensively. Backing accidents are common with this type incident. Use spotters when backing and blow your horn to alert personnel of your actions. Use headlights on dusty roads. Observe travel restrictions in Demob plan. Safe travel home is part of the assignment.

<u>Personal Hygiene-</u> Practicing good hygiene will prevent the spread of illness and disease. Washing stations will be set up at various places at the staging area. Use them before eating, and after visits to the rest room.

<u>AIR DROPS</u>- Be alert. Stay out of drop area. Both the approach and departure routes are dangerous to ground personnel. Manage helicopter dip sites to minimize exposure for ground forces. Use Air to Ground channel.

FIRE BEHAVIOR – Maintain situational awareness, follow 10 Standard Orders, recognize / mitigate the 18 Watch Out Situations, and apply LCES. Know the fire weather forecast. Monitor conditions for change.

<u>HYDRATION/HEAT STRESS</u> – Heat index will be high again today Be sure to drink plenty of fluids (before you get thirsty), and take frequent breaks. Watch your co-workers for heat related symptoms.

**ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS** – Watch for and stay away from rattlesnakes, fire ants and wildlife. Keep all foods secured. Bring all trash off the line. Use insect repellent for ticks. Report tick bites to Medical Unit Leader.

Accidents: Contact your supervisor and inform him/her. Follow emergency procedures at bottom of medical plan.

#### **General Fire Behavior**

Smoldering fire was observed across most sections of the fire. Isolated flare-ups in piles, single tree torching and small interior runs, and short range spotting were observed. Expect this trend to continue as warmer temperatures and clear sunny skies persist. Needle/leaf cast should continue to be monitored, the mostly sunny days and high winds will continue to dry the fuels out again, especially on the unsheltered sand ridges.

#### **Specific Fire Behavior**

#### Easterly winds will continue to put spotting pressure on division Golf and the "wedge" section of Foxtrot.

Divisions Kilo, Hotel, Golf, Foxtrot, November, and Oscar all showed fire activity yesterday. Fire behavior in these divisions will continue to increase as dry, hot, clear days continue. A spot fire occurred on division Foxtrot. The spotting distance was ~350 feet. Fuels are receptive and are getting drier every day! You will continue to see the torching out as vegetation cures from the continued heat of the smoldering organics.

**Heads up to NC Forest Service Employees on Juniper Road Fire** – A special State Health Plan Follow-up Annual Enrollment will held on July 18<sup>th</sup> through July 29<sup>th</sup> – see e-mail below for more details. If you have no computer access and need to log into Beacon to select health plan options, stop by the Duplin Pender Zone Office to use a computer and access Beacon.

Should the media approach you with questions about the fire, feel free to communicate the following Talking Points:

- ➤ The fire acreage was resized to 31,140 acres; containment remains at 85%.
- ➤ No significant rainfall is forecasted to occur for the next seven days; smoke from ground fires may be present for the remaining summer months.
- > Expected containment and control dates have not been set for this fire.
- ➤ Ground fires along the fire's southernmost containment lines remain a concern; organic soils continue to burn due to the extreme drought conditions. Heavy equipment was able to work on this hot ground after numerous water drops from airships assigned to the fire.
- Engine crews are using hose lays along New Road and Lodge Road to wet down ground fire that is burning into the soil foundation of the roadbeds.
- Many trees within the fire's perimeter and interior have become unstable because the soil has burned away from the root systems. Ground fire heat and heavy equipment movement also a concern. Because of these hazards, fire managers strongly discourage the general public from attempting to enter the game lands to engage in windshield or walking tours of the fire.

If you observe non-incident personnel within the fire footprint or HS Game Lands, advise that game lands are closed to the public or contact either the NCWRC Agency Representative or Safety Officer to handle this communication; cell phone numbers can be found in the IAP.

DENR E-Mail dated July 5, 2011

A special State Health Plan Follow-up Annual Enrollment will held on July 18<sup>th</sup> through July 29<sup>th</sup>, effective September 1, 2011. Changes in the SHP are with premiums, co-pays and deductibles. During this period, members will have the opportunity to change their plan elections and add eligible dependents.

Along with other changes, the Comprehensive Wellness Initiative (CWI) has been eliminated. Therefore, effective September 1, 2011, the tobacco and weight management component will no longer determine the plan in which members may enroll. If members previously elected to enroll in the 70/30 Basic plan due to CWI, they will now have the opportunity to enroll in the 80/20 Standard plan.

\*\*\*Enrollment elections made in July will be for September 1, 2011, and will not be retroactive to July 1, 2011

\*\*\* All changes are to be made in Beacon's ESS site **only**; no paper enrollments will be accepted.




