**Staging Fax** 910-259-6790 <u>Anaphylaxis</u> is a severe, potentially life-threatening allergic reaction. It can occur within seconds or minutes of exposure to something you're allergic to, such as certain foods, some medications, insect venom and latex. Anaphylaxis requires an immediate trip to the emergency department and an injection of epinephrine. If anaphylaxis isn't treated right away, it can lead to unconsciousness or even death.

#### Symptoms

Anaphylaxis symptoms usually occur within minutes of exposure to an allergen. Sometimes, however, anaphylaxis can occur a half-hour or longer after exposure. Anaphylaxis symptoms include:

- Skin reactions, including hives along with itching, flushed or pale skin (almost always present with anaphylaxis)
- A feeling of warmth
- The sensation of a lump in your throat
- Constriction of the airways and a swollen tongue or throat, which can cause wheezing and trouble breathing
- A feeling of impending doom
- A weak and rapid pulse
- Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea
- Dizziness or faint

#### **Instructions for sanitizing coolers**

- 1. Mix bleach and water at a 1 to 10 ratio. One part bleach to 10 parts water in a spray bottle.
- 2. Use caution to avoid spilling the solution on your nomex! It will destroy the fiber that makes them fire resistant.
- **3.** Spray the inside of the cooler, avoid breathing the solution in, and protect your eyes by wearing goggles.
- **4.** Allow this to sit for about 3 minutes, then rinse thoroughly. This will sanitize your cooler, and prevent you and the crew from getting sick.

**DRIVING**- Drive defensively. Backing accidents are common with this type incident. Use spotters when backing and blow your horn to alert personnel of your actions. Use headlights on dusty roads. Observe travel restrictions in Demob plan. Safe travel home is part of the assignment.

## Juniper Road Demob Procedures

- Demob list will be posted on the Information board at the Duplin-Pender Zone Staging Area and the Simmons Road ICP with Demob (Travel) Dates. This is your actual demob date and not your last work day that is listed in the IAP.
- Check-out will start with Ground Support and vehicle post inspections. Vehicle inspections should be completed at the location in which the original inspection was completed. This will be Live Oak Staging, Duplin-Pender Zone Staging or Bladen Lake State Forest Staging for heavy equipment only. Pink and Yellow copies of the vehicle inspection form will be given to the resource demobing.
- Resources will then come to the Simmons Road ICP to complete the demob process. Resources should first go the Demob Unit Leader to get there Demobilization Checkout form (ISC-221). The Demob Unit Leader will sign off for ground support once the Pink and Yellow copies of the vehicle inspections are presented.
- Resources will then proceed through the designated units for signatures and return to the Demob Unit Leader once all signatures are received.
- > Demob at the ICP will start in the mornings at 0830 hours.



Should the media approach you with questions about the fire, feel free to communicate the following Talking Points:


- ➤ The fire size is 31,140 acres; containment remains at 85%.
- Engine crews are patrolling New Road and Lodge Road for ground fire hot spots inside control lines and spot fires outside the containment lines.
- > Expected containment and control dates have not been set for this fire.
- The Holly Shelter Game Lands are currently closed to the public due to ongoing fire suppression of the Juniper Road Fire.
- With the ongoing drought providing an increased potential for new wildfire ignitions, area residents and businesses owners are encouraged to look for ways to make their homes and properties more fire defensible by reviewing Firewise tips at <u>http://www.ncfirewise.org/index.htm</u> or by contacting their local County Ranger Office.
