# Safety Message

## Simmons Rd./Juniper Rd.

July 29, 2011

**COMPLACENCY**- Never lower your guard! Stay focused on the mission. Regularly assess hazards and risks; utilize training and common sense.

**HYDRATION/HEAT STRESS**- Drink early/drink often before you get thirsty. 4:1 water to sport drinks.

**FIRE BEHAVIOR** – Maintain situational awareness, follow 10 Standard Orders, recognize / mitigate the 18 Watch Out Situations, and apply LCES. Know the fire weather forecast. Monitor conditions.

**WORK/REST**- Observe 2:1ratio. Work with supervisor to mitigate excess hours by the next shift.

**SNAGS**-Stay out of area, essential fireline personnel only, look at root system before working/parking in area.

**HYGIENE**- Wash hands/use hand sanitizer. Monitor/mitigate perishable food items.

**ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS** – Ticks carry Lyme disease! Use insect repellent and check for ticks at end of shift. Pack all food items out with trash and watch for rattlesnakes, copperheads and water moccasins.

**DRIVING** – Drive defensively. Use passenger as a lookout, navigator, and backing guide. Obey speed limits. Use headlights and seatbelts. <5 MPH in very dusty road conditions. Limit driving on interior roads to essential fireline personnel. Clean your windows, headlights and taillights.

### **Mitigating Transition**

**Transition is a red flag event.**

**Accidents often increase at this time.**

**Effective communications is imperative.**

**Brief others, as needed.**

**Debrief your actions.**

**Communicate hazards to others.**

**Acknowledge messages.**

**Ask, if you don't know.**

## **Emergency Medical Procedures**

**DO NOT use patient's name or call sign during emergency.**

**DO PROVIDE Nature Of Injury, Number Of Injuries, Minor Or Critical Injury**

### **LIFE THREATENING MEDICAL EMERGENCIES**

1. On INCIDENT 9 (west side of fire) or INCIDENT 11 (east side of fire), announce "All units Hold Traffic for Medical Emergency"
2. Call Communications and provide:
  - Geographic location (road intersection, GPS Coordinates)
  - Nature of injury or illness
  - Number of personnel involved
3. Communications will notify 911 with emergency details.
4. Communications will then notify Line Medic, DIVS, OPS, SOF, and AOBD (if air ambulance is requested)
5. Safety officer will initiate investigation.
6. After affected personnel have been treated/transported, Communications will notify the incident that normal radio traffic can resume.

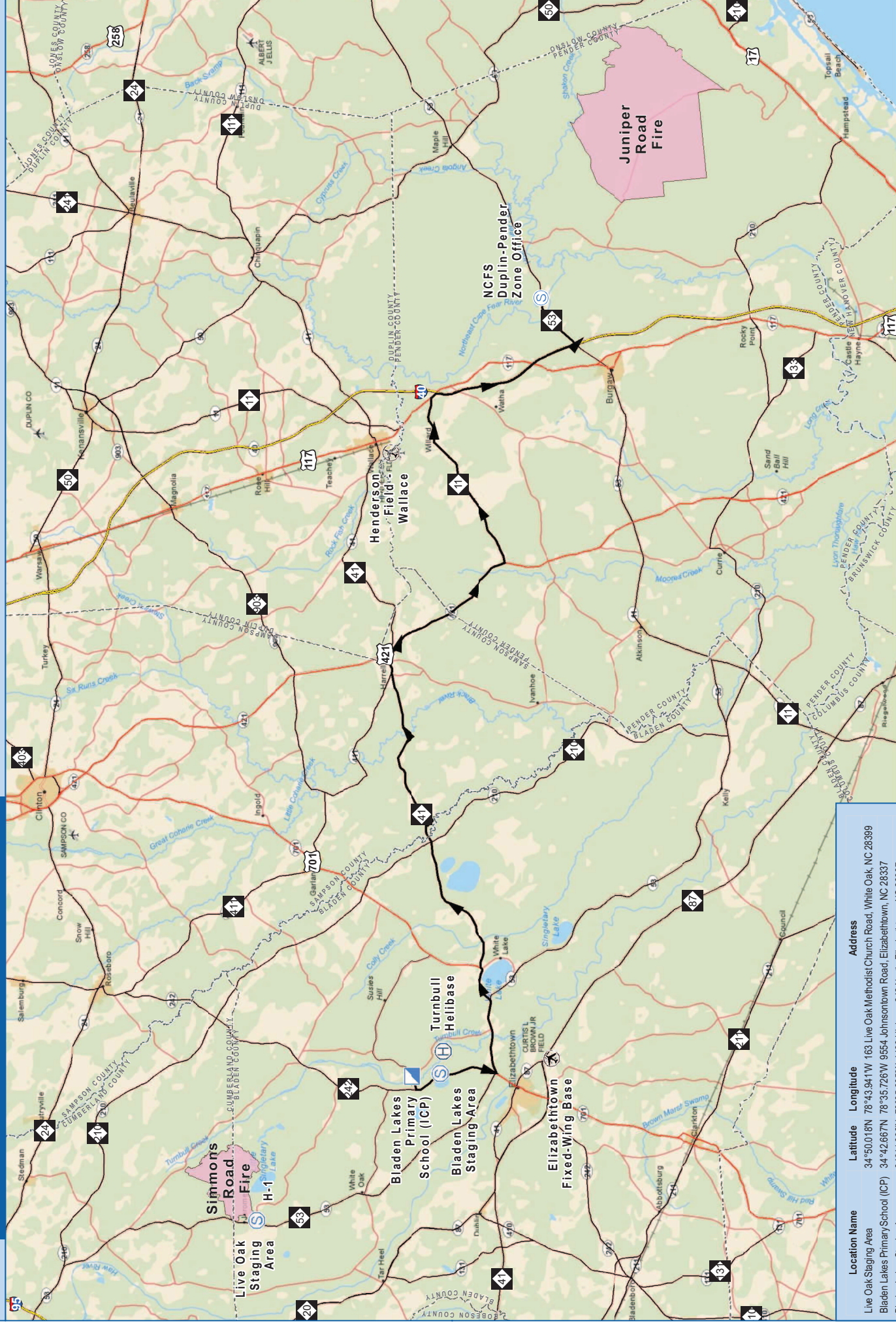
### **NON-LIFE THREATENING EMERGENCIES**

1. Patient notifies next level supervisor
2. Supervisor/Patient notifies Division Supervisor and receives treatment for condition
3. DIVS will advise the Medical Unit Leader and Safety Officer before the end of shift. Provide information concerning illness, injury and any medical care provided.
4. DIVS/Supervisor will document on ICS 214

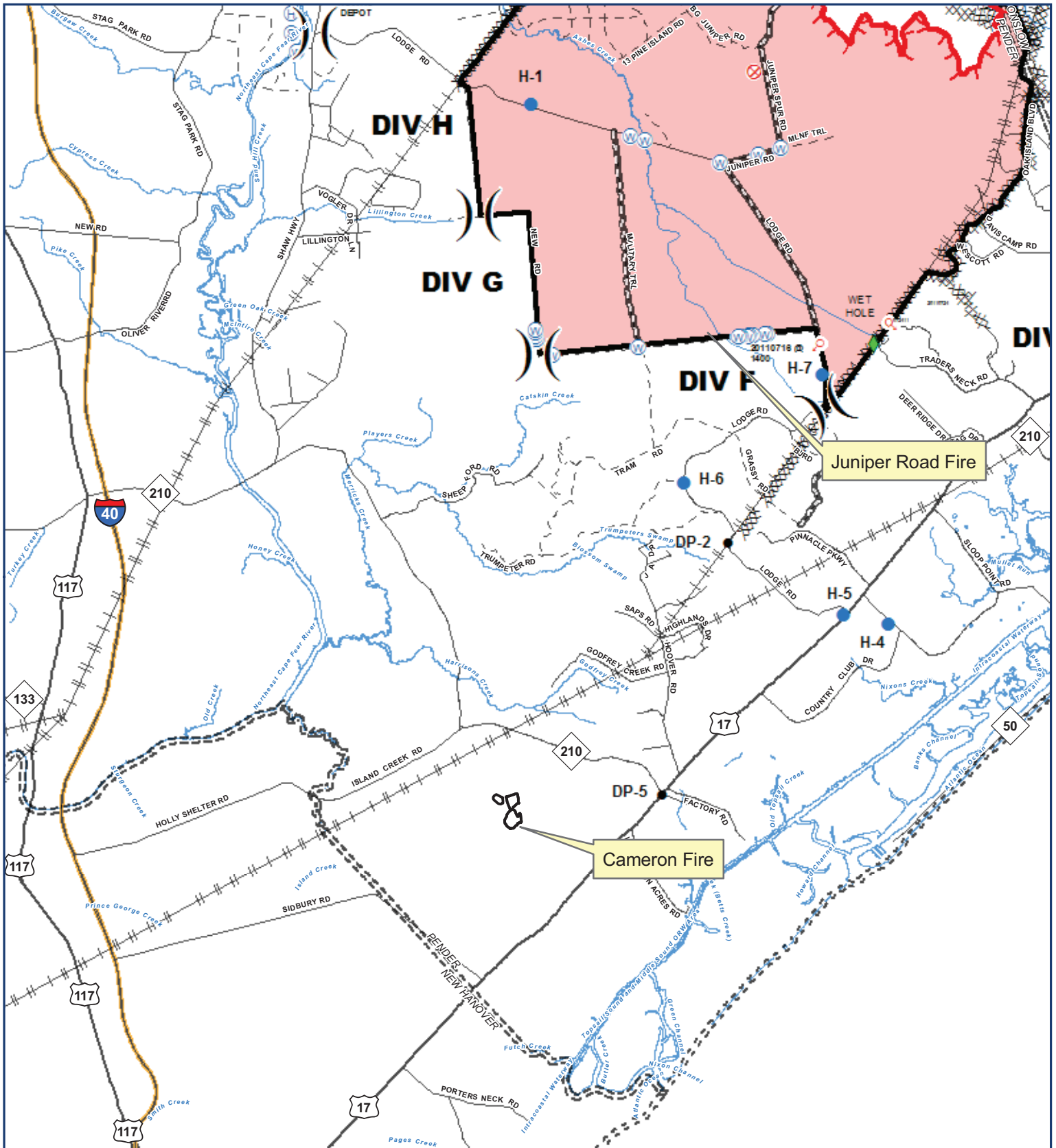
