5. Incident Objectives

Control Objectives

- Provide for the safety of firefighters and general public by adherance to the 10 standard fire orders, 18 watch-out situations, in addition to maintaining direct and clear communications with all incident personnel and the general public.
- 2. Keep fire contained within the newly established boundaries for indirect attack suppression strategy.
- 3. Conduct triage and prepare structures on the North side of Bayview Rd in the village of Stumpy Point. Coordinate with Dare Emergency Mangement Coordinator to initiate evacuation if fire threatens the village of Stumpy Point.
- 4. Expedite the safe opening of US Hwy 264 as soon as operational objectives are met to minimize threat to Stumpy Point community.
- 5. Continue soil saturation to extinguish ground fire by maintaining water in plugged canals.
- 6. Mop-up a minimum of 500 feet into the fire perimeter
- 7. Ensure that suppression & containment strategies on FWS property follow minimum impact suppression tactics. Escalation of tactics should consider amount of progress being made with current tactics, and the likelihood of those tactics being successful.

Management Objectives

- Keep general public & local officals in affected counties, as well as incident stake holders informed of fire status through situation updates and personal contacts at least every other day.
- 2. Provide for accurate cost tracking and documentation of incident in accordance with IBH (Incident Business Handbook) procedures.
- 3. Emphasize cost containment through continual assessment of personnel and resource needs to provide (right-sizing) of incident.
- 4. Develop a concise transition document in preparation for a transfer of command to the incoming Incident Mangement Team.







Previous Fire Behavior- The fire escaped control on Division Delta at approximately 1600hrs. Weather observations at this time were winds SSW 16 gusting to 30, temperature 82F and RH 72%. Rates of spread estimated at 30-60 chains and flame lengths of 50 ft. Crown fire was observed for limited runs at the head with torching observed on all flanks. Short range spotting was also observed.

Predicted Fire Behavior- The risk for reburning is still a threat on Division Alpha. Fuels remain dry and are readily available to burn. Watch for torching that could loft embers across control lines. During peak wind gust expect torching and rapid rates of spread, especially after the fire grows much larger than an acre. Be aware of the local sea breeze influence and thunderstorm outflows, this will increase rates of spread and can change the fire direction very suddenly.

- 5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger.
- 6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
- 7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor, and adjoining forces.
- 8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
- 9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
- 10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.

18 Watchouts Situations

- 1. Fire not scouted and sized up.
- 2. In country not seen in daylight.
- 3. Safety zones and escape routes not identified.
- 4. Unfamiliar with weather and local factors influencing fire behavior.
- 5. Uninformed on strategy, tactics, and hazards.
- 6. Instructions and assignments not clear.
- 7. No communication link with crewmembers/supervisors.
- 8. Constructing line without safe anchor point.
- 9. Building fireline downhill with fire below.
- 10. Attempting frontal assault on fire.
- 11. Unburned fuel between you and the fire.
- 12. Cannot see main fire, not in contact with anyone who can.
- 13. On a hillside where rolling material can ignite fuel below.
- 14. Weather is getting hotter and drier.
- 15. Wind increases and/or changes direction.
- 16. Getting frequent spot fires across line.
- 17. Terrain and fuels make escape to safety zones difficult.
- 18. Taking a nap near the fire line.
