## **HEALTH AND SAFETY MESSAGE**

INCIDENT: Simmons and Juniper Road Fire DATE: 7/15/11 TIME: 0730-1900

#### **Major Hazards and Risks:**

**SNAGS**-Stay out of area, essential fire line personnel only, look at root system before working/parking. IRPG pg. 20. **DRIVING**- Drive defensively. Backing accidents are common with this type incident. Use spotters when backing and blow your horn to alert personnel of your actions. Use headlights on dusty roads. Observe travel restrictions in Demob plan. Safe travel home is part of the assignment.

<u>SCHOOL BUSES-</u> Year- round schools are back in session as well as some summer school programs. Be alert for stopped school buses and children near the highway. Be especially careful traveling around ICP as summer program has started.

<u>Personal Hygiene-</u> Practicing good hygiene will prevent the spread of illness and disease. Washing stations will be set up at various places at the staging area. Use them before eating, and after visits to the rest room.

<u>AIR DROPS</u>- Be alert. Stay out of drop area. Both the approach and departure routes are dangerous to ground personnel. Manage helicopter dip sites to minimize exposure for ground forces. Use Air to Ground channel.

<u>FIRE BEHAVIOR</u> – Maintain situational awareness, follow 10 Standard Orders, recognize / mitigate the 18 Watch Out Situations, and apply LCES. Know the fire weather forecast. Monitor conditions for change.

<u>HYDRATION/HEAT STRESS</u> – Heat index will be high again today Be sure to drink plenty of fluids (before you get thirsty), and take frequent breaks. Watch your co-workers for heat related symptoms.

**ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS** – Watch for and stay away from rattlesnakes, fire ants and wildlife. Keep all foods secured. Bring all trash off the line. Use insect repellent for ticks. Report tick bites to Medical Unit Leader.

Accidents: Contact your supervisor and inform him/her. Follow emergency procedures at bottom of medical plan.

- **Step 2.** Division Supervisor Will relay the following information to Communications on both Viper radio and Command Channel 11: **Division / Nature Of Injury Or illness / Number Of Injured Or ill / Patients Location**
- Step 3. Communications Will Contact 911 Direct and relay information.
- **Step 4.** Communications Will Then Contact Medical Unit Leader, Incident Commander, Safety Officer, And Operations Chief to advise Of The Medical Emergency
- **Step 5.** Medical Unit Leader Will Take Command Of Medical Emergency Operations In Commmunications Unit Along With the Assistance of Ops Chief, Air Ops, SOF, and IC.
- Step 6. Operation Chief Will Advise Air Ops if air transport will be utilized.
- Step 7. Division Supervisor & Medical Unit Leader Should Record Incident On 214 ASAP.

The fire received .2-.3 inch of rain on Wednesday evening. With very little chance of additional rain the fuels will dry out quickly. Major runs in the bay shrubs and southern rough fuels have been observed. Currently smoldering ground fire has been observed along with active burning in the litter and flare-ups in the shrubs that die back down. The fire has burned actively in green and cured fuels. Torching has been observed with some spotting. Watch for needle/leaf cast on all divisions which will provide surface fuels for smoldering or active ground fire.

#### **Predicted Fire Behavior for Today**

#### Cooler conditions and moderate relative humidity will help with the containment effort today.

Several days ago IR showed that there was still heat along the perimeter in Juliet, Delta and November. Expect continued smoldering and active fire in organic soils. Ground fire will be the ignition source for cured and green fuels to burn and cause torching and spotting. Active burning will be observed in the timber litter and southern rough fuels on the sand ridges. Rates of spread and flame lengths are given for flanking fire and head fire in the table below. Spotting distances and probabilities of ignition are also given.

The talking points below are for your use in conversations with the media or the public.

- There is high potential for re-burn in the fire area as pine needles and leaves from scorched trees fall to the ground. Ashes are completely covered with foliage that has dropped in some areas. Embers from ground fire and burning stumps could ignite the dried foliage causing a low intensity fire to re-burn portions of the original burn.
- The fire has burned 5,632 acres and is 70 percent contained.
- Houses along Hwy 53 and Turnbull, Avery and Squatting Bear roads could be threatened if the fire escapes containment lines.
- The NC Forest Service has tractor-plow units, flextracs and fire engines working to mop up hot spots along the fire perimeter.
- Fire department resources from across the state are in place to provide protection to hundreds of structures around the fire area.
- Air tankers are stationed at the Elizabethtown Airport and helicopters are at Turnbull Creek Educational State Forest to suppress flare ups if needed.
- Ground fire will persist for weeks if the drought continues. Smoke will linger in the area as long as there is ground fire.
- Motorist should use caution in the fire area. Watch for slow moving trucks.
- The fire was reported on June 20, 2011 in a Carolina bay near the end on Dennis Harold Simmons Road.
- Rehabilitation work is underway in areas where there are safety and environment issues.
- Wildlife species in the area are accustomed to living in a fire adapted environment and will recover.


