General Control Objectives For The Incident Ensure the safety of firefighters, emergency responders, and general public is our number one priority. We do this through: Strict adherence to the 10 Standard Fire Orders. Mitigating all 18 Watch Out Situations. Implementing LCES (Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones). **Maintaining Situational Awareness.** Conducting Hazard / Risk Assessments throughout the day. Conducting "tailgate" briefing on the line with an emphasis on personnel safety, health and wellfare. Keep the Simmons Road Fire contained to the following boundaries: East of Hwy 53; North of Live Oak Methodist Church Road; West of Suggs Mill Pond; South of Turnbull Road Continue to improve direct firelines that will provide long term containment and control. Minimize impact to Bushy Lake Natural Area by operating flextracks from within the burned area. Mop Up hot spots around fire perimeter identified by Situation Unit Leader on Infrared Heat Map. Watch for reburning and flare-up and take appropriate actions as needed. 5. Provide structure protection in conjunction with Cumberland and Bladen EM to residents of Turnbull Rd, Avery Rd and Squatting Bear Road. Monitor fire situation and initiate evacutions should trigger point be breached. Provide a constant flow of accurate and timely information to local Fire Dept., Emergency Mgmt, citizens and media outlets. Continue rehabilitation &/or repair work as suppression efforts allow. Major Hazards and Risks:

<u>THUNDERSTORM SAFETY</u>- Post lookouts, monitor your radio for weather updates. DIVS & OPS acknowledge you received the information from RADO and pass this information on. Refer to page 19 in your IRPG.

<u>DRIVING</u>– Drive defensively. Use passenger as a lookout, navigator, and backing guide. Obey speed limits. Use headlights and seatbelts. <5 MPH in very dusty/wet road conditions. Limit driving on interior roads to essential fire line personnel. Follow posted speed limits. Watch out for roads that have been compromised by ground fire!!

HYDRATION/HEAT STRESS- Drink often and drink a lot, before you get thirsty. 4:1 water to poweraid. Take frequent breaks.

MOP-UP- Blouse or close pant legs before entering burned area to prevent burns to your legs. Learn to identify ash pits from local personnel.

SNAGS- Stay out of area, essential fire line personnel only, look at root system before working/parking in area.

Hygiene- Monitor/mitigate perishable food items. Continue to wash hands/use hand sanitizer.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS – Watch for and stay away from rattlesnakes, copperheads, water moccasins and wildlife. Use insect repellent for ticks. Don't leave leftover food out on the fire.

Accidents-Follow the Medical Plan

Complacency- Stay focused on the mission. Regularly assess hazards and risks; utilize training and common sense. **Fatigue-** Mitigate with 2/1 work rest ratio. Use time off- shift wisely. Eat sensibly and continue to hydrate off duty.

Risk Management: Step 1Situation Awareness. Step 2 Hazard Assessment. Step 3 Hazard Control. Step 4 Decision Point Step 5 Evaluate.

FACT: Vehicle accidents are the source of more deaths and serious injuries to wildland firefighters than any other single cause.

Fact: Inattentiveness is a major contributing factor in vehicle accidents in wildland firefighting.

So.....

Avoid using cell phones, radios, GPS units, CD players, computers, blackberry's, video games, internet poker games, etc while driving

Avoid eating and drinking while driving, tacos are the highest risk food item while driving.

Do not attempt to read maps or write directions while driving. Pull over and park.

When talking with passengers keep both hands on the wheel and your eyes on the road. Avoid animated conversations while driving.

Don't get in a hurry, be patient. Getting agitated magnifies and creates distractions. Pull aside on narrow roads for oncoming traffic.

Do not slam on breaks and go into reverse to get a better view of bears. Do not drive forward while craning your neck for a better view of bears. Do not speed up to get a better view of a bear before it moves out of sight. Do not try to drive and take a picture of a bear at the same time.

Emergency Medical Procedures

DO NOT use patient's name or call sign during emergency.

DO PROVIDE Nature Of Injury, Number Of Injuries, Minor Or Critical Injury

LIFE THREATENING MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

- On INCIDENT 11, announce "All units Hold Traffic for Medical Emergency"
- 2. Call Communications and provide:
 - Geographic location (road intersection, GPS Coordinates)
 - Nature of injury or illness
 - Number of personnel involved
- 3. Communications will notify 911 with emergency details. Communications will then request Bladen County EM/Dispatch for the use of Viper Channel 3 for the emergency.
- 4. Communications will notify DIVS, OPS, and SOF.
- 5. Safety officer will initiate investigation.
- 6. After affected personnel have been treated/transported, Communications will notify the incident that normal radio traffic can resume.

NON-LIFE THREATENING EMERGENCIES

- 1. Patient notifies next level supervisor
- 2. Supervisor/Patient notifies Divison Supervisor and receives treatment for condition
- 3. DIVS will advise the Medical Unit Leader and Safety Officer before the end of shift. Provide information concerning illness, injury and any medical care provided.
- 4. DIVS/Supervisor will document on ICS 214

Trigger Points for the Simmons Road Fire Evacuation Plan

ACTION:

If any of the following Trigger Points are reached, contact OSC Walker who will activate the Simmons Road Evacuation Plan

1. Turnbull Road, Squatting Bear Road, and Avery Road - Cumberland County.

Should the fire escape containment lines and become established moving to the north from Divisions N, O, P.

2. Turnbull Road, AB Smith Road, and/or NC Highway 53 - Cumberland County.

Should the fire escape and become established from B11 moving to the north on Divisions P and S.

3. Tom Burns Road and/or NC Highway 53 – Cumberland County

Should the fire escape containment lines and become established moving to the north from Divisions B and J.

4. Simmons Road, Gilbert Edge, Live Oak Church Road, Neighbor Road, and/or Frank Smith Road- Bladen County.

Should the fire escape and become established and moving to the south near Simmons Road and Frank Smith Roads on Divisions A, G, and F.




