

DISCUSSION...

WINDS WILL GRADUALLY TURN TO THE NORTHWEST TONIGHT BEHIND A FRONT WITH INCREASING WIND SPEEDS. WIND GUSTS AT HIGHER ELEVATIONS...ESPECIALLY ALONG THE SOUTHERN BLUE RIDGE MAY REACH 30 MPH BY SATURDAY MORNING. WIND WILL DIMINISH THROUGH THE DAY SATURDAY. A NOCTURNAL JET IS EXPECTED TO DEVELOP ALONG THE BLUE RIDGE SATURDAY NIGHT BUT THE HIGHER WINDS WILL REMAIN ALOFT AND NOT MIX DOWN UNTIL THE INVERSION BREAKS SUNDAY MORNING. BY THE TIME THE INVERSION BREAKS...THE JET WILL BE WEAKENING.

DRIER AIR WILL COME IN BEHIND THE FRONT ON SATURDAY...LOWERING AFTERNOON HUMIDITIES INTO THE 30S EAST OF THE BLUE RIDGE. BY SUNDAY AFTERNOON...HUMIDITY VALUES WILL BE IN THE 30S AREAWIDE. HUMIDITY VALUES WILL BE THE LOWEST FOR THE WEEK SUNDAY AFTERNOON.

PRECIPITATION CHANCES INCREASE LATE MONDAY NIGHT INTO TUESDAY AND AGAIN WEDNESDAY AND WEDNESDAY NIGHT. THE BEST CHANCE FOR A SOAKING RAIN WILL BE WEDNESDAY AND WEDNESDAY NIGHT WITH A GOOD POTENTIAL FOR ONE TO TWO INCHES OF RAINFALL ACROSS THE AREA.

.FORECAST FOR DAYS 3 THROUGH 7...

.SUNDAY NIGHT AND MONDAY...PARTLY CLOUDY. LOWS IN THE LOWER 30S. HIGHS IN THE LOWER 50S. MINIMUM RH 41 PERCENT. SOUTH WINDS 5 TO 10 MPH.

.MONDAY NIGHT AND TUESDAY...CLOUDY WITH SHOWERS LIKELY. LOWS IN THE MID 40S. HIGHS IN THE LOWER 60S. MINIMUM RH 69 PERCENT. SOUTH WINDS 10 TO 15 MPH.

.TUESDAY NIGHT AND WEDNESDAY...SHOWERS. LOWS IN THE LOWER 50S. HIGHS IN THE UPPER 50S. MINIMUM RH 80 PERCENT. SOUTHWEST WINDS 5 TO 10 MPH.

WIND – Gusts may reach 30 MPH. Stronger and erratic winds likely. Crew safety briefings should be focusing emphasis on snags and recently killed tree hazards, changes in fire behavior and applying LCES.

SLIPS TRIPS AND FALLS- Watch your footing, and watch for debris and obstacles in work area. Take your time going up and down steep slopes. Slow and steady is the name of the game.

SNAGS AND HAZARD TREES: Park in areas free of snags and hazard trees. Fall trees only within your certification level or flag and avoid.

IAP Map

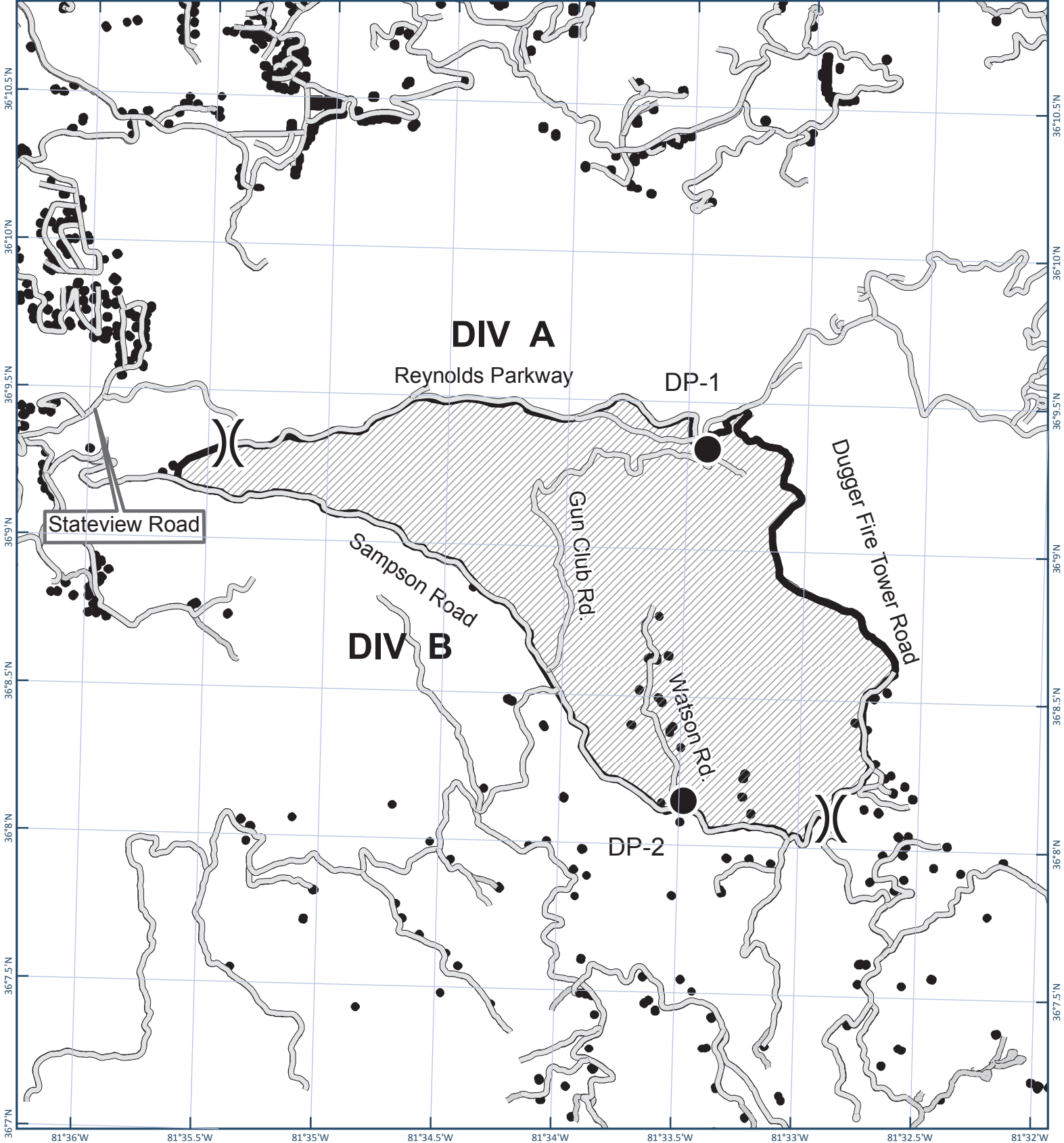
