Grandfather RAWS

Local weather thresholds that shout watch out:

Temperatures above 60°, Relative Humidity's below 25%, Eye Level Winds Greater than 4mph

FUELS:

This fire is burning in a mixed pine and hardwood forest (FM 9, 10). Mountain Laurel can be found in the understory especially on the South and West facing slopes. Fuels can be characterized as average to slightly dry for this time of year. The ERC-G is tracking slightly above average for this time of year but still 6 points below the 90th percentile. The 100 and 1000 hour fuel moistures are at 12% and 20% respectively. With these conditions, the 100 hour fuels may contribute to fire intensity and completely consume, however the 1000 hour fuels are still too moist to contribute.

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

All Divisions:

Expect minimal fire behavior along all divisions today. Any residual fire will continue to creep, smolder and back in any islands of unburned fuel. If fire becomes established in unburned fuels, expect forward rates of spread in the surface to be 5-10 chains per hour and flame lengths of 2-4' Torching in the Mountain Laurel as well as in Pine are possible. As always, be heads up for spot fires, the probability of ignition is 40% - 50%

Good Rule of thumb: Cut head fire Flame Length in half for Flanking Fire
Backing Fire is usually 1-2' Flame Lengths

AIR OPERATIONS:

Smoke may affect visibility in the AM until the inversion lifts, between 0900-100, then be aware of gusty winds near thunderstorms

Major Hazards and Risks:

DRIVING – Drive defensively while leaving the ICP due to weekend and morning commutes. Use passenger as a lookout, navigator, and backing guide. Obey posted speed limits. Use headlights and seatbelts. Slow down to a safe speed while driving. When meeting oncoming vehicles slow down and give them the right-of-way. Keep your windows clean for good visibility.

TRANSITION- Transition is a red flag event. Accidents often increase during this time. Effective communication is imperative; brief others as needed; debrief your action; communicate hazards to others.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS – Watch out, stay away from wildlife. Do not feed the wildlife or leave left over food in the woods or along the fire line. Be aware of poisonous plants, insects and snakes.

COMMUNICATIONS – Make sure your radio is programmed correctly. Everyone perform a radio check before going on fire line.

COMPLACENCY- can be a killer, stay focused on the mission. Regularly assess hazards and risks; utilize training and common sense.

SNAGS- Hazard trees, both dead snags and live green trees, are one of the most common risks encountered on the fire line. All fire fighters should frequently survey their work area for potential hazards. Refer to pages 22 in the IRPG Guide.

THUNDER STORMS – Monitor your radio for updates, use look outs and apply the 30/30 rule listed below.

*****Conduct Tailgate Safety Briefings / Briefing Checklist Inside Back Cover of I.R.P.G.**

****Lightning safety 30/30 rule: If the time between when you see the flash and hear the thunder is 30 seconds or less, the lightning is close enough to hit you. If you haven't already, seek shelter immediately. Wait inside until 30 minutes have passed since the last flash of lightning.*

SIGNS COMPLACENCY

- Professional conduct slips.
- Less alert.
- Tunnel vision-less situational awareness.
- We take short cuts: PPE, backing without a spotter or neglecting personal hygiene.
- Horse playing.
- Briefings are poorly attended or shortened.

MITIGATION SUGGESTIONS

- Be on time & lead by the example.
- Review 10s & 18s
- Review safety message & 215A
- Brief with Safety & Information Officer
- Review medical plan.

- If you see unescorted media within or near the fire footprint, please contact the ICP Fire Information Center at 919-218-6576 (or 828-713-4096), or call INFORMATION over the radio, or email us using your smartphone at dobsonknobfireinfo@gmail.com.
- We are all “ambassadors” on the fire. Your communication to walk-up customers speaks well of our firefighting community. Thank you for taking a moment to answer questions posed or alternatively call the ICP Information Center for an assist with a customer inquiry.
- Your family and friends can access fire-related information daily on INCIWEB. If you have some good fire photos to post on INCIWEB, please email them to dobsonknobfireinfo@gmail.com.
- Remember that a Holiday weekend is ongoing and Spring Break for many school students is next week; this means lots of visitors in the area and traffic on the roads – so drive carefully and defensively.
- If you observe any drones flying within or in the immediate vicinity of the fire perimeter and/or containment lines, contact Air Operations and the Safety Officer.
- Have a safe and productive day!
- Talking Points for walk-up customer inquiries:
 - Fire is 1,760 acres in size and 77% contained.
 - The majority of firefighting resources are being demobed today.
 - The fire may smoke from interior burning into this week.
 - The Harvell Type 2 IMT will transition the fire back to NCFs’s Asheville District on Monday, 5/17.

DEMOBILIZATION GUIDELINES

Before leaving to return home all personnel released from the incident must:

- 1. Check out with Plans at the ICP**
 - 2. Submit Personnel Time, Equipment Time, and any Costs with Finance,**
 - 3. Return all checked out radios and equipment with Logistics.**
- No person will be released from the Incident without first obtaining 8 hours of rest, *unless* specifically approved by the I.C and who's travel time home is no more than 2 hours.
 - The 2:1 work to rest ratio (one hour of rest for every two hours of work) must be adhered. Travel time is included in daily work hours.
 - All employees must be able to arrive at their home unit before 2200 hours
 - Demob will generally occur between 0800 and 1800 hours at the ICP. Demob outside of these hours need to be pre-arranged.
 - All return travel will be by the safest and most direct route.
 - Personnel are responsible to notify their home unit supervisor that they have returned home safely.



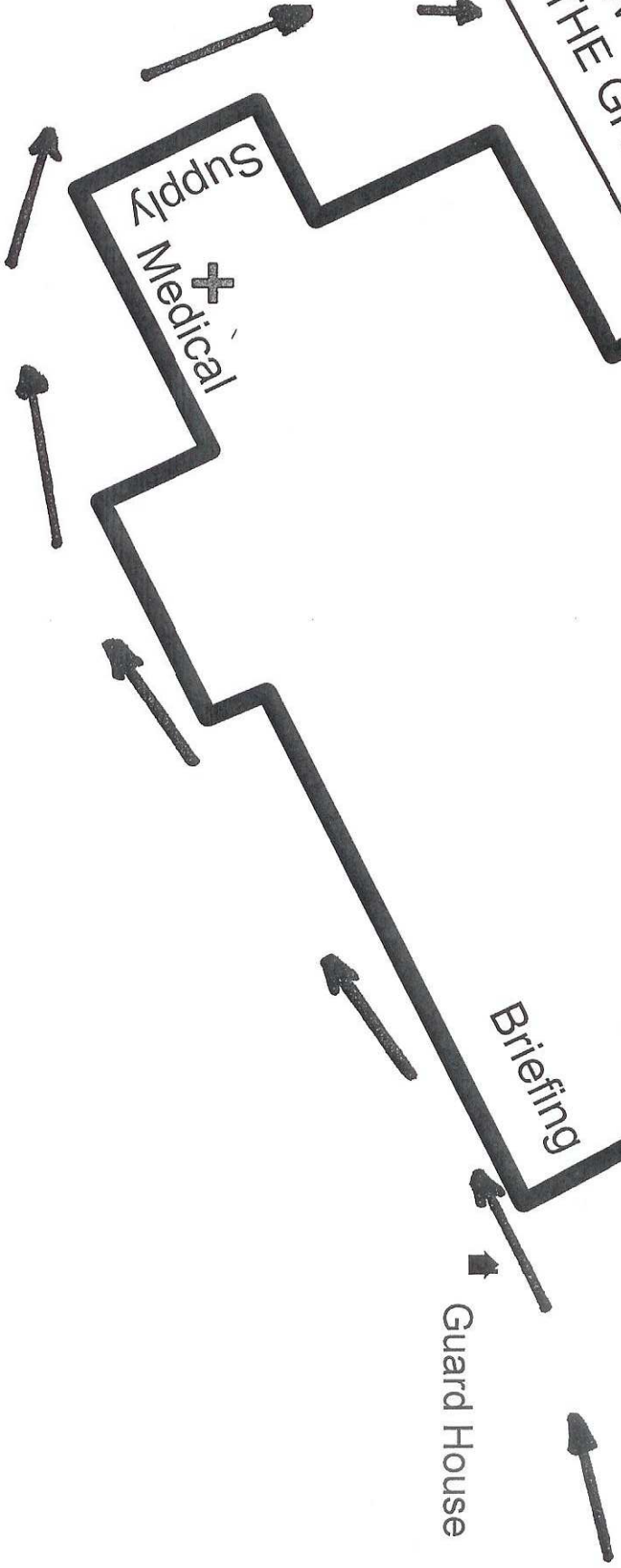

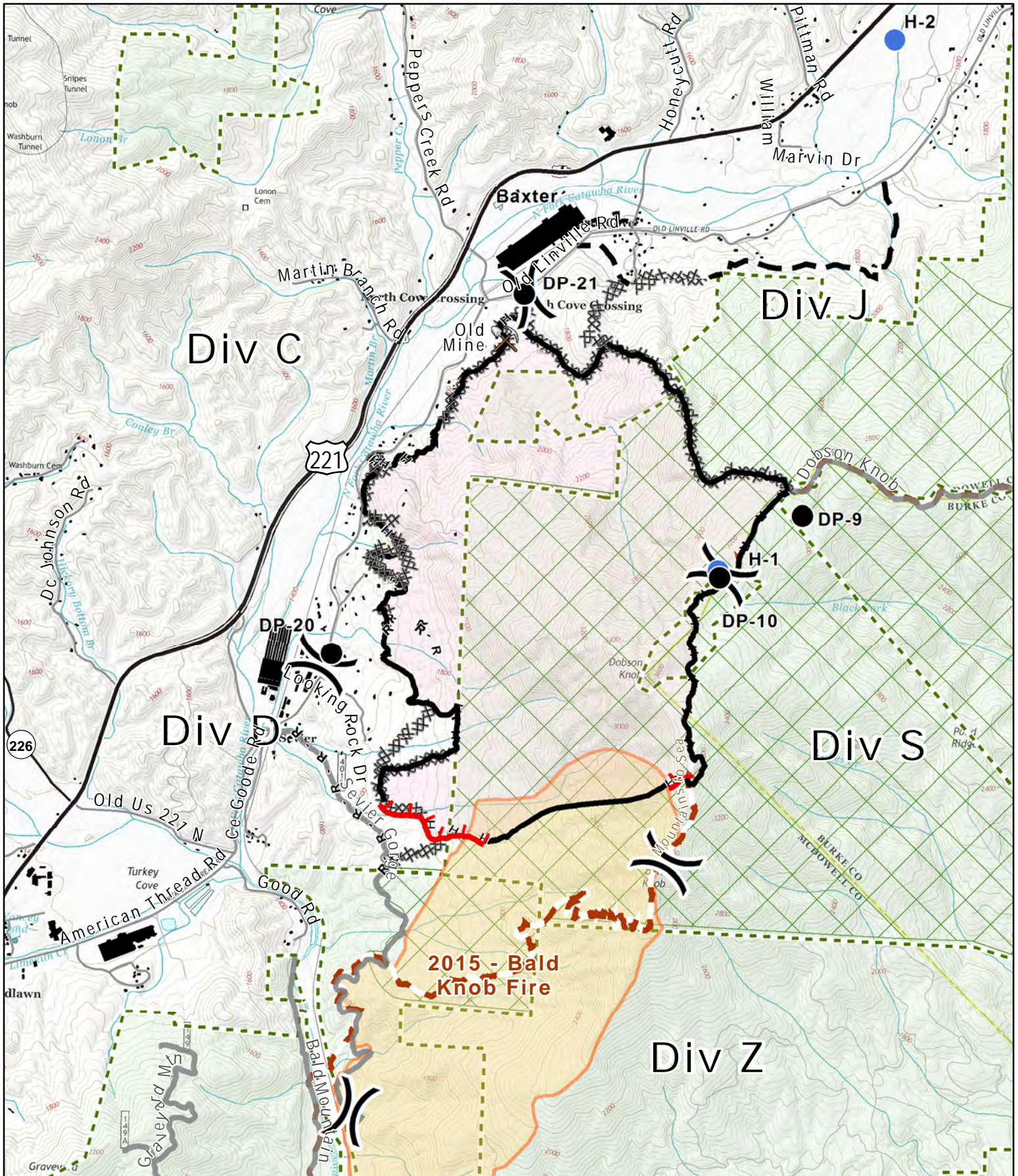

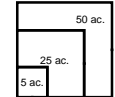
