<p><u>OBJECTIVES:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Firefighter and public safety will be enhanced through the use of sound risk management and hazard mitigation. Stop, Think, Talk and Act before taking action. Establish a shared commitment by all, that operations are implemented with the least firefighter exposure necessary to meet incident objectives. 2. Use suppression strategy and tactics commensurate with resource values including timber sale units on national forest lands. 3. Keep fire North of the I-40, South of Hurricane Spur, West of Hurricane Creek Road and East of Cold Springs Road. 4. Where reasonable, keep fire away from Forest Service and private structures, improvements, and infrastructure. Known structures include the cabins and outbuildings. Other values at risk will be identified as the incident develops. 5. Maintain relationships with NC Forest Service, Haywood Emergency Center and other cooperatives. 6. Manage the incident in the most efficient and cost effective manner that is commensurate with values at risk. 7. Keep the public and stakeholders informed on fire information. <p><u>Operational Period Command Emphasis:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recon. Get familiar with the local area and fire area. Get to know local resources. Gather intel to be used in mid-range planning efforts. Ask yourself, "Is this action necessary? Is the action I'm taking in line with the management for multiple objectives strategy?" Evaluate all tactics with safety in mind.

Major Hazards & Risks: Transition, Aviation, and Driving

Transition – What has changed? Time to re-evaluate, who are you working for, check IAP for changes in assignments, changes in communications, and changes for an IWI. If you have any questions about the changes, now is the time to ask.

Aviation – Everyone has a role in safe aircraft operations on this incident. If you are on the ground, be prepared to communicate on the air to ground frequency, be sure the area is clear of personnel before water drops. Keep pilot informed of other aircraft/drones while working in the area.

Driving – There are two active Timber Sales in the area, they will be using Cold Springs Creek Road. Slow down on the muddy roads, leave some distance in front and behind you. ALWAYS obey state and local traffic laws. Remember to wear safety belts and run headlights when traveling on the incident. There is a speed limit, RESPECT IT!!

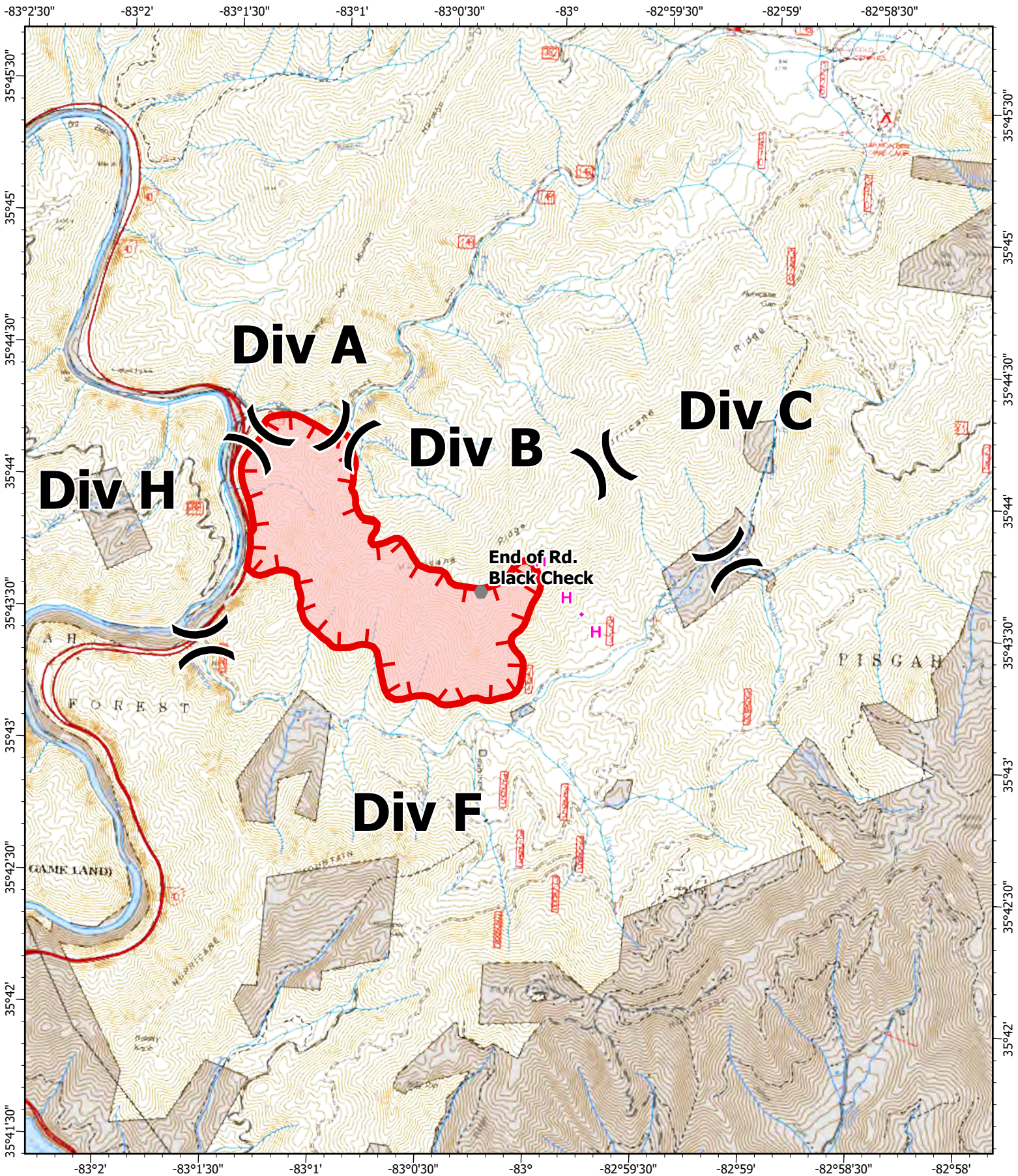

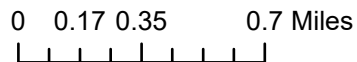
