

General Situational Awareness:			
<p>SAFETY FIRST--Yours, your co-workers and the public! Snags, widow-makers, and trees with shallow root systems are abundant. Wear hard hats when you're in affected areas, maintain your situational awareness, be quick to identify hazards and point them out to your co-workers.</p> <p>Check yourself and clothing for ticks and immediately remove them.</p> <p>Poison ivy is prevalent in the area, be aware.</p> <p>Be situationally aware with changing weather conditions.</p> <p>Be aware of heavy equipment and trucks on park roads; come to a complete stop at intersections and watch for traffic.</p>

MAINTAIN SITUATIONAL AWARENESS AT ALL TIMES

Contact Incident Safety Officer if an injury occurs.

Weather

Check the weather before you start work and periodically throughout the day. Ensure you know where the nearest shelter is to your work location. SEEK SHELTER IF THERE IS A TORNADO WARNING. Seek shelter if there is lightning within FIVE miles.

PPE

This is a large project with many moving parts that may be outside of your normal duties. If you feel you are missing personal protective equipment to help keep you safe, please reach out to your supervisor.

Wildlife

Larger mammals: Feral hogs, bobcats, badgers, black bears, coyotes, foxes, mountain lions.

Reptiles: Rattlesnakes, copperhead snakes, cottonmouth snakes.

Spiders: Black widows, brown recluse.

Other insects: Ticks, scorpions, chiggers, and the usual flying buzzers.

Dangerous plants – castor bean plants, hemlock, several toxic mushrooms, pokeweed, poison ivy.

Heat Stress

If you are not from the local area, the humidity changes the way heat affects your body – ensure that you are hydrating and eating well. Take breaks in the shade or in air conditioning throughout the day to allow yourself to cool off. The effects of heat stress can accumulate over time, so you may feel fine one day and drained the next day – listen to your body.

Driving

The intersection of 177/7 is very busy. Slow down and double check for vehicles and pedestrians in the area. Watch for roadside work. Wear reflective high visibility vests when outside of vehicle and assisting with traffic control. Dump trucks have begun speeding on highway 177, likely in an effort to make additional runs during nice weather. LE will increase patrols, and a mobile radar will be placed – but use additional caution when entering traffic on that road.

Heavy Debris Removal

Heavy equipment will be used to move large material using towing chains. If you are not part of the debris moving operation in the maintenance yard, you should not be in that work area.

Wellness

There is ample opportunity to meet with someone one-on-one – work with your supervisor or a member of the IMT for more information. We have the Oklahoma Highway Patrol (OHP) CrossFit Trailer visiting, located behind the Fire Station – try to stop in for a fun workout and stress relief.

Remove debris from lake flooding. Continue regular maintenance duties with B&U personnel. Work on clearing drain in Pavillion Springs. Roads & Trails work to clean up debris at the boat ramp parking lots, fishing dock parking lots, picnic areas, campgrounds. Utilize street sweeper to remove sediment that was deposited during the high water. If stump removal work is complete in Flower Park, then utilize the sweeper in Buckhorn.</p> <p>Chickasaw Nation Tree Crew: Mitigate hazard trees in Flower Park utilizing lift. Mitigate flagged hazard trees in Cold Springs Campground and Central Campground.</p> <p>Equip Operator/Arborist: Utilize equipment in Flower Park for debris removal. Utilize bucket truck to remove overhead hazard at Little Niagra, Cold Springs CG, and Central CG.</p> <p>All groups: Work with READ as needed for area of work. When moving debris, utilize Hwy 77 to the SW perimeter loop to take material to the staging area past Veterans Lake.</p>

<p>If falling hazard trees, do not fall historic black walnut standing trees.</p> <p>Special attention should be had when cutting wooded debris with non-organic debris mixed in.</p> <p>Leave any historic artifacts that may be found during operations and notify supervisor/IMT.</p> <p>No felling or chainsaw use within 50 yards of the Monkey Tree.</p> <p>A reasonable buffer should be kept between equipment and ground crews at all times.</p> <p>Pay special attention to taking heavy equipment onto saturated grounds.</p> <p>Cold Springs Campground will have orange flagging on the hazard trees for removal.</p>
