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### WEATHER DISCUSSION:

#### **...INCREASING WIND WESTERN LINDEN AND HENDERSON TUESDAY AFTERNOON...**

High pressure aloft will remain over the incident area Tuesday. Increasing low-level south flow well ahead of a developing frontal system will result in locally breezy conditions in Western Linden and Henderson zones Tuesday afternoon. Expect little change in daytime humidity, but afternoon temperatures will be a couple degrees warmer than Monday. Humidity recovery Tuesday night will be a little lower. Changes start to occur Wednesday as the cold front approaches the Texas panhandle. The front should reach the Red River late Wednesday evening, then sweep south Wednesday night and Thursday morning. There are still some questions about how much rain will occur, but all areas are likely to get a wetting rain (greater than 0.25 inches). It will be much cooler Friday and Saturday.

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### TODAY/TONIGHT for NORTH – Linden Dispatch Zone:

**WEATHER:** Sunny in the morning but areas of fog. Fog dissipating 0900 to 1000. Partly cloudy in the afternoon.

**MAX TEMPS:** 80-85 / **MIN TEMPS:** 57-62.

**MIN RH:** 35-45%. **MAX RH:** 75-95%. Good to Excellent recovery.

**WINDS:** Southeast to South 5 mph or less in the morning then South 7-13 mph. Afternoon gusts 17-22 mph, strongest in the West portion.

**HAINES INDEX:** 4, but 5 in the afternoon. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 5500-6500 ft.

#### **OUTLOOK: WEDNESDAY**

Partly cloudy. Becoming mostly cloudy mid to late afternoon. Highs 76-81. Min 50-60% but to 65% far north. South wind 7-12 mph, becoming SW 8-14 mph in the afternoon with gusts 20-25 mph.

### TODAY/TONIGHT for CENTRAL – Henderson Dispatch Zone:

**WEATHER:** Sunny in the morning but areas of fog. Fog dissipating 0900 to 1000. Partly cloudy in the afternoon.

**MAX TEMPS:** 82-87 / **MIN TEMPS:** 59-64.

**MIN RH:** 35-45%. **MAX RH:** 80-95% Good to Excellent recovery.

**WINDS:** South 2-6 mph in the morning then South to Southwest 6-12 mph. Afternoon gusts 15-20 mph, strongest in the West portion.

**HAINES INDEX:** 4, but 5 in the afternoon. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 5500-6500 ft.

#### **OUTLOOK: WEDNESDAY**

Partly cloudy. Highs 78-84. Min RH 45-55%. S-SW 7-13 mph. Gusts 17-23 mph.

### TODAY/TONIGHT for SOUTH – Livingston/Woodville Dispatch Zone:

**WEATHER:** Sunny in the morning but patchy fog. Partly cloudy in the afternoon.

**MAX TEMPS:** 83-88 / **MIN TEMPS:** 59-64

**MIN RH:** 37-47% but to 55% southern Woodville area. **MAX RH:** 80-100%. Good to Excellent recovery.

**WINDS:** East to Southeast 5 mph or less in the morning then South 6-12 mph. Afternoon gusts to 20 mph.

**HAINES INDEX:** 4 **MIXING HEIGHT:** 5000-6000 ft.

#### **OUTLOOK: WEDNESDAY**

Partly cloudy. Highs 80-85. Min RH 45-60%. South 6-12 mph.

**FUEL ASSUMPTIONS:** The major fuel types found in the SE Texas Complex are fuel model TU3 (moderate timber understory), Fire Behavior Prediction System Fuel model 9 and grass fuel model 1. High risk fuels include pine plantations and southern rough brush with yaupon underneath a mature pine canopy. Young pine plantations may react similar to a brush model due to low live fuel moistures. There are also areas with slash from logging operations.

**WEATHER SUMMARY: Also refer to Weather Forecast:** High Pressure aloft over the area brings stronger winds especially in the western part of two North Zones; temps up to upper 80's and Min RHs in mid 30's. Winds changing direction between morning and afternoon as well as getting stronger and gusty. Wednesday cold front approaches bringing stronger gusty winds, higher RH and lower temps followed with good chance of Precip after dark, continuing into Thursday.

**SE Texas Complex General Fire Behavior Forecast:** Drought condition still persist across the zone. Live fuel moistures continue to be extremely low making the live scrubs and trees available to burn. Be very cautious when critical fire behavior thresholds are exceeded. When thresholds are exceeded fires will become very resistant to control with ground resources and will require the combination of aerial and ground resources to be effective in controlling fires.

**Critical fire behavior thresholds: (Temp >90°, RH < 30%, Winds > 10 mph).  
Threshold for Winds met in all zones**

**Specific:**

***Linden, Henderson, Livingston and Woodville Dispatch Zones***

Grass fuels are cured and will support high rates of spread. High risk fuels include pine plantations and southern rough brush with yaupon underneath a mature pine canopy. Fire will easily spread into the canopy when latter fuels are present; expect long range spotting when this occurs.

West side of Linden and Henderson has best opportunity for fire behavior to be in upper range of table above. Grass fuels and open stands of timbered areas will likely burn well. In the eastern areas of these two zones, where tight canopy timbered areas, interior fuel moistures will lessen ROS once loses edge effect of openings.

In Livingston and Woodville Zones, fuels are drier down here and therefore expect any fire in these fuels to burn well, especially where canopy and midstory is a bit open.

One hour fine dead fuel moisture down to 6%. 100 & 1000 hour fuels are ranging 12 to 18%. KBDI range: 450 (2 counties) - 730, with only 10 counties over 700.

Extensive mop up is required. Most spotting is well less than 100 feet, but could get under rare circumstances up to predicted.

Forecasted ERC: Linden ERC 37 (90%-37/97%-40), Conroe ERC 33 (90%-34/97%-38)

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Possible fog first thing from OK southward towards TX 105, burning off by 0900-1000. Otherwise no foreseen weather issues for air ops.

**FIRE BEHAVIOR SAFETY:** Watch Out Situation #15 Wind increases and/or changes direction.

**COMMUNICABLE DISEASES** = I caught it from someone or I gave it to someone. Most of us work around other people. Sometimes they are old friends and sometimes they are new ones. There are even people who come into our day that we don't know...like the youngster flipping the burgers for lunch or the drivers who pumped gas just before us. The **COMMUNICABLE DISEASES** most likely to affect your fire assignment are the viruses. You may have heard someone talking about Norovirus or even the regular old flu bug. There is a good chance some of those virus bugs can be found around Lufkin and the Initial Attack Locations. Flu shots can help you for the annual flu bug, but there are no vaccines for the Norovirus or its relatives. This is kickoff time for sick season, so work on your defenses now.

Norovirus is responsible for over 20 million sick cases yearly, more infections from contaminated foods than all other viruses, bacteria, and parasites combined. Noroviruses are a group of related viruses that affect the stomach and intestines. Anyone can become sick with Norovirus—and you can get it more than once during your life. It often begins suddenly - you may feel very sick, with stomach cramping, vomiting, or diarrhea. Infections are usually not serious, and most people recover within 1 or 2 days with no long-term health effects...but those 2 days are pretty bad!

**WASH YOUR HANDS** - that is the main prevention for all of these sicknesses. Wash with soap & water if possible. Wash before eating and after answering the "call of nature".

**DRIVING** - Driving hazards might be an old tune, but they are still the greatest risk we all face for serious injury. New resources may not know the local danger zones unless someone speaks up and tells them. Old resources may know the dangers, but sometimes feel pretty comfortable dodging the problems. Every time you drive, anticipate the environment may have changed for the worse. This is one of the few hazards that have another person's brain involved. That "**other driver brain**" may be intoxicated, drugged, sleepy or texting. Keep that in mind the next time you turn the key on in your Hummer.

**FIRE BEHAVIOR** - Do you wonder if this is a "typo"? Although some areas felt a little rainfall recently, there are some areas that missed it. The weather for Tuesday & Wednesday will bring some increased drying. Don't let increased fire behavior catch you in the wrong position. Winds can make your day go bad in a hurry. Situational Awareness is critical.

## **DEMOB PROCEDURES FOR THOSE THAT TRAVEL BY AIR**

Check the Demob list in the IAP. Verify with your supervisor that your TRAVEL DAY is correct. If not, coordinate with the DEMOB UNIT. Five days prior to your TRAVEL DAY, submit the completed "Air Travel Request" (ATR) to the DEMOB UNIT in person or by FAX (936-632-1372). The ATR is provided in the IAPs or through the DEMOB UNIT. Be sure to provide personal contact information on the ATR so that the DEMOB UNIT can call in order to give you your flight arrangements. It is expensive and time consuming to change flight arrangements once they have been made, so make sure to provide the correct information on the ATR.

## **IMPORTANT SHUTTLE INFORMATION**

Airport shuttle from the ICP leaves at 0800 and 1800.

If your flight departs before Noon on your travel day, you **MUST** start your DEMOB PROCESS by 1600 on your last work day (the day before your travel day). You will then be transported by the 1800 airport shuttle to a motel in the vicinity of the airport, where you will rest overnight.

The motel will provide you a ride to the airport the next morning. You should arrange to be at the airport two hours in advance of your departure time.

If your flight departs after Noon on your travel day, you should start your demob process the evening of your last work day. The next morning, the 0800 airport shuttle will deliver you to the airport in time for your departure flight.

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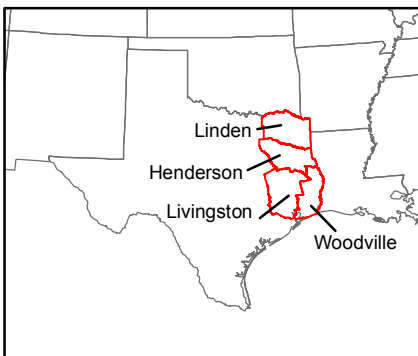
