WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...COOLER AND MUCH DRIER FRIDAY...

North flow aloft today over the East Branch will result in cooler daytime temperatures and lower minimum humidity. There will be a threat of a few lingering showers over Woodville and Southeast Henderson zones this morning, but any shower activity will end by late morning as the drier air continues to work south. Expect rapid clearing during the afternoon and evening. It will be much colder Friday night and early Saturday morning due to optimum radiational cooling conditions. The air mass continues to moderate and dry Saturday. This results in a few degrees of warming and minimum humidity near critical values (25 percent). Another shot of cool, but dry, air moves through the region Sunday. It looks dry through much of next week, with periodic dry cold frontal passages.

TODAY/TONIGHT for NORTH – Linden Dispatch Zone:

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy early then mostly sunny.

MAX TEMPS: 58-65 / **MIN TEMPS:** 36-43.

MIN RH: 35-45% **MAX RH:** Above 90%. Excellent recovery.

WINDS: North 2-7 mph in the morning then 6-11 mph. Afternoon gusts to 18 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 4. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 3500-4500 ft.

OUTLOOK: SATURDAY

Mostly sunny. Highs 65-71. Min RH 23-33%. North wind to 5 mph in the morning then East 3-8 mph.

TODAY/TONIGHT for CENTRAL – Henderson Dispatch Zone:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy west in the morning then mostly sunny. Mostly cloudy east in the morning with a slight chance of showers. Partly cloudy in the afternoon.

MAX TEMPS: 62-68 / **MIN TEMPS:** 38-44.

MIN RH: 35-45% west and 45-55% east. **MAX RH:** Above 90%. Excellent recovery.

WINDS: North 6-12 mph. Gusts up to 20 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 4. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 3000-4000 ft.

OUTLOOK: SATURDAY

Mostly sunny. Highs 67-73. Min RH 25-35%. North wind to 5 mph through 0800 then Northeast to East 3-8 mph.

TODAY/TONIGHT for SOUTH – Livingston/Woodville Dispatch Zone:

WEATHER: Cloudy in the morning with a chance of showers, primarily Woodville zone. Decreasing clouds from the northwest in the afternoon.

MAX TEMPS: 63-69 / **MIN TEMPS:** 38-44

MIN RH: 42-57% but to 70% southwest Woodville / **MAX RH:** Above 90%. Good to Excellent recovery.

WINDS: North 8-15 mph. Gusts up to 25 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 3-4 **MIXING HEIGHT:** 2000-3000 ft.

OUTLOOK: SATURDAY

Mostly sunny in the morning with areas of fog. Partly cloudy in the afternoon. Highs 67-74. Min RH 25-40%. North wind to 5 mph in the morning then Northeast 4-9 mph.

FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: The major fuel types found in the SE Texas Complex are fuel model TU3 (moderate timber understory), Fire Behavior Prediction System Fuel model 9 and grass fuel model 1. High risk fuels include pine plantations and southern rough brush with yaupon underneath a mature pine canopy. Young pine plantations may react similar to a brush model due to low live fuel moistures. There are also areas with slash from logging operations.

WEATHER SUMMARY: Also refer to Weather Forecast: Precipitation continues this morning. With winds switching direction and strengths from morning to afternoon. Becoming drier with minimum RHs ranging from as low as 35-45% in the north to 50-55% in the south. Temperatures in the 60's. Next several days will be dry, cool with light winds.

SE Texas Complex General Fire Behavior Forecast: Drought condition still persist across the zone. Live fuel moistures continue to be extremely low making the live scrubs and trees available to burn. Be very cautious when critical fire behavior thresholds are exceeded. When thresholds are exceeded fires will become very resistant to control with ground resources and will require the combination of aerial and ground resources to be effective in controlling fires.

**Critical fire behavior thresholds: (Temp >90°, RH < 30%, Winds > 10 mph).
Threshold for Winds met in all zones**

Specific:

Linden, Henderson, Livingston and Woodville Dispatch Zones

Grass fuels are cured and will support high rates of spread. High risk fuels include pine plantations and southern rough brush with yaupon underneath a mature pine canopy. Fire will easily spread into the canopy when latter fuels are present; expect long range spotting when this occurs.

If you are in an area that had less than 2/10 inch of rain, then your fuels in OPEN timbered stands and grasses will dry out and be available to burn once your RHs get to and stay below 45% for a couple of hours. Grasses and Timber litter stands are more likely to support a fire than denser stands of plantations or southern rough. The table above reflects these conditions.

If you received more than 2/10 inch then likely only a grass fire could occur, after several hours of drying (late afternoon). One hour fine dead fuel moisture might get down to 7%. 100 & 1000 hour fuels are ranging 13 to 19%.

KBDI range maybe changing – but only in areas greater than 1/3". Range on 10/27 1800 hrs: 450 (2 counties) - 730, with only 10 counties over 700; Most of the counties are above 575.

Mop-up should be quick and easy today. Most spotting today will be less than 10 feet, but could get under rare circumstances up to predicted.

ERCs remain below 90th percentile. Forecasted ERC: Linden ERC 28 (90%-37/97%-40), Conroe ERC 27 (90%-34/97%-38)

AIR OPERATIONS: Clear to Partly Cloudy skies in afternoon, morning has cloudy skies with possible precip in the south.

FIRE BEHAVIOR SAFETY: Look for heavies holding any heat still especially on underside of logs protected from rainfall, should you have a holdover fire.

Reference: 80 chains = 1 mile, 120 = 1.5, 160 = 2, 200 = 2.5, 240 = 3, 280 = 3.5, 320 = 4, 360 = 4.5, 400 = 5 miles

DEMOB PROCEDURES FOR THOSE THAT TRAVEL BY AIR

Check the Demob list in the IAP. Verify with your supervisor that your TRAVEL DAY is correct. If not, coordinate with the DEMOB UNIT. Five days prior to your TRAVEL DAY, submit the completed "Air Travel Request" (ATR) to the DEMOB UNIT in person or by FAX (936-632-1372). The ATR is provided in the IAPs or through the DEMOB UNIT. Be sure to provide personal contact information on the ATR so that the DEMOB UNIT can call in order to give you your flight arrangements. It is expensive and time consuming to change flight arrangements once they have been made, so make sure to provide the correct information on the ATR.

IMPORTANT SHUTTLE INFORMATION

Airport shuttle from the ICP leaves at 0800 and 1800.

If your flight departs before Noon on your travel day, you **MUST** start your DEMOB PROCESS by 1600 on your last work day (the day before your travel day). You will then be transported by the 1800 airport shuttle to a motel in the vicinity of the airport, where you will rest overnight.

The motel will provide you a ride to the airport the next morning. You should arrange to be at the airport two hours in advance of your departure time.

If your flight departs after Noon on your travel day, you should start your demob process the evening of your last work day. The next morning, the 0800 airport shuttle will deliver you to the airport in time for your departure flight.


