Some torching observed in interior green pockets. Highly sensitive fire due to its proximity to Austin and because it is burning next to the 2011 Bastrop fire scar that destroyed hundreds of homes. Additional safety concerns with high volume of traffic on Hwy 71 bordering fire edge.
