

SAFETY MESSAGE

Hurricane Harvey Jefferson County Operations

Major Hazard and Risks:

- > Vehicle Traffic
- > Contamination(Flood Waters) and Personal Hygiene
- ➤ Heat, Humidity, and Sun Related Risks
- > Public
- > Thunder Storms

Narrative:

- Take time and drive at a safe speed. Also, keep vehicles on paved surfaces. The ground is very soft and may not hold vehicles up. More and more traffic is on road. Take precautions when parking, turning around, and working on roads.
- Avoid direct skin contact with contaminated water to prevent possible illness or infections. Stay out of contaminated water if at all possible. If you must get in the water, wash as soon as possible after any contamination. If no water use Clorox wipes and antibacterial liquid. Avoid hand to mouth contact during field operations.
- Problems with heat and the sun can sneak up on you. Be sure to keep hydrated and use sunscreen and ware you cover (hat). Each of us is a field safety officer. Keep an eye on others and watch for signs of any heat /sun problems. Remember to drink three waters per one sports drink!
- Do not take matters in your own hands, if you encounter disgruntled citizens notify Law Enforcement.
- > Thunderstorms can move quickly in affected area. Observe the 30 minute rule. If you hear thunder, lightning danger persist for 30 minutes after. Move to a designated area.
- > Maintain Situational Awareness!
