


3. Objective(s):		
<p>Provide for firefighter safety through hazard assessments, application of sound risk management decisions, and deliberate mitigation actions. Minimize fire impacts to private lands and ranches around the perimeter, and provide structures protection as need. Operational strategies should include a risk assessment that weighs the values at risk vs. firefighter safety and exposure Manage the human resources assigned in a manner that promotes mutual respect, and is consistent with policy for preventing harassment. Maintain and enhance relationships with the surrounding communities and all cooperators by sustaining inclusive communication strategies and providing timely and accurate information to interested parties.</p>		
4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:		
<p>The overall objective for Copper Breaks and Vivian fire is full suppression of the wildfire. Limit further spread of fire on private lands. Assess and Protect structures as needed. Use suppression tactics that are commensurate with values at risk. Assist with initial response as requested by TFS. Leave Gates as you find them! Either closed or open. Document damage and report damage to fence and gates to Operations immediately, and make hasty repair as soon as possible to do so to prevent loss of livestock and mitigate for safety on roadways.</p>		
General Situational Awareness:		
<p>Extreme hot dry weather continues with related active fire behavior. Thunderstorms are predicted to start building in the area over the next few days. Keep a lookout for thunderheads and be aware of the potential for downdrafts impacting the fire.</p>

Weather Discussion:

Showers and storms will remain around the area today, mainly between 3 PM and midnight. Gusty erratic outflow winds and dangerous cloud to ground lightning remain a concern. Temperatures will climb into the upper 90s before clouds increase, but thick smoke around the Vivian Fire may limit temperature rises by a few degrees. General winds will be mostly from the south with gusts near 20 mph at times, however in the breaks terrain driven winds can be expected.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

With continuing hot and dry conditions, expect very active fire behavior potential again for today, despite slightly reduced general winds. Fuel moistures remain very low while the Haines index will be 5. Widely scattered storms with gusty and erratic outflow winds also persist into the evening.

If fire becomes established in unburned fuels:

Two-fuel model (grass and cedar): Expect ROS near 50 chains per hour, with flame lengths near 7 feet at the head of the fire.

Grass only: ROS about 55 chains per hour and flame lengths near 6 feet.

Spotting distances up to 0.5 miles. Probability of Ignition is 77%.

SPECIFIC:

Along with the potential for thunderstorms today comes the chance for strong, gusty, out-flow winds that can change the above fire behavior projections completely. A 40 mph burst from a thunderstorm would elevate ROS to near 150 ch/hr, raise flame lengths to 12 feet, and lengthen spots to a mile.




Medical person providing care must request type of transportation as early as possible (ie: air or ground)

- Take charge of the scene – inform the Division Supervisor and Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications (frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name – Division A medical, Copper Breaks Fire medical, Highway 6 accident.
- Assign or begin patient assessment and first aid. Using the eight line in the Incident response pocket guide in the pink section page 118, Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident as early as possible Transmit patient information to Communications using Medical Incident Report on back
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move the deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. The Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required.

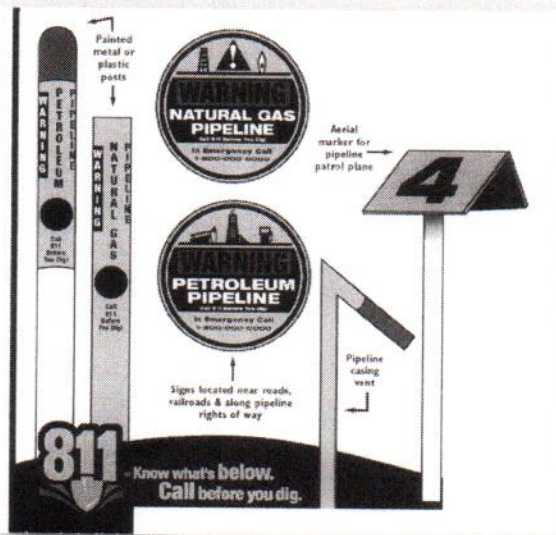
Major Hazards & Risks: Oil and Gas Lines, Powerlines, T-Storms & Outflow Winds

Oil & Gas Lines: *There are numerous oil and gas lines and equipment especially on the Vivian Fire. These lines are 4 & 6” dia. poly or metal lines laying directly on the ground. There are 2” poly lines carrying electrical wires laying with them. Scout out these areas before dozing line and have a strategy for crossing these areas. Read signs for oil & gas activity in your area. For more details on this hazard check your IRPG pgs. 28&29.*

Powerlines: *There are powerlines that have been compromised on both fires. These lines maybe deactivated, but assume they are hot until you are sure. Flag these areas and notify all fire resources. Allow entry only after the hazard has been mitigated. IRPG. Pg. 24*

T - Storms & Outflow Winds: *There is a chance of Thunder Storms with associated outflow winds predicted in today’s forecast. Talk about how these winds could impact your Division during breakout briefings. Check out your IRPG pg. 21.*

Oil & Gas line Safety



Mitigation Techniques

- DO NOT PLOW
- Use the blade to scratch the ground or back blade
- If possible, avoid working in the pipeline right-of-way
- If you must cross an above ground line, place enough dirt over it to displace the weight of the dozer.

FOR A **NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT**: WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A **MEDICAL EMERGENCY**: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM COMMUNICATIONS

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree.
