<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Provide for the safety of responders and the public by utilizing recognized safety standards. - Control the spread of fire on the southeast and northeast flanks of the Kidd Fire in order to prevent expansion that would threaten life safety. - Mop up and secure perimeter of the Wheat Field fire in order to prevent spread outside of existing control lines. - Protect the communities of Gorman, Rising Star, and Eastland in order to prevent the loss of life and property from wildfires. - Reinforce the structural firefighting capability of Gorman, Rising Star, and Eastland to allow local resources to recover and posture for potential deployment into the WUI if fire spreads to those communities. - Reinforce control lines on the Oak Mott Fire to prevent expansion outside of current fire perimeter. - Facilitate transfer of command / authority to the Gray Team in order ensure continuity of operations for the incident. 	
4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:	
The priority of effort for this operational period is establishing control lines to address life safety concerns with the greatest potential for rapid fire spread immediately followed by protecting values at risk in Gorman and Rising Star.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Texas Task Force 2 will be conducting post fire impact assessments and searches on the Kidd Fire in the town of Carbon. - A base camp is being established at the Stadium in Eastland. - Utility crews will be working near fire perimeters repairing power lines and other damaged infrastructure. - The county judge will be flying the impacted areas beginning at 1000 depending on weather and A/C availability.

Safety Message/Expanded Safety Message, Safety Plan, Site Safety Plan: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide for the SAFETY of all personnel and the general public • Follow all Federal, State and Local Guidelines for the prevention of the spread of COVID-19 • COMPLACENCY: With an extended fire assignment, it is especially important to not become complacent. Review Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires (IRPG page 5) • SNAGS: Review Look Up, Down and Around (IRPG pages 3 & 4) daily with assigned personnel. Be especially aware of overhead hazard such as SNAGS, FALLING ROCKS and POWER LINES • Review the "8-Line" Emergency Medical Response Report procedures on the back page of the IAP regularly until proficient • Maintaining a SAFE SPEED is a critical factor (Recommend 45 mph max on Improved thoroughfares, 35 mph max on secondary improved roads and 25 mph max on gravel roads) • Be alert for Yellow Jackets, Bees and Hornets and other biting insects in your operational area • Be alert for the presence of toxic plants such as POISON OAK in your operational area • Be alert for utility repair equipment and trucks as you travel (give them plenty of room to operate) • Utilize ground guides when moving vehicles and/or equipment throughout the operational area • Ensure that your vehicle and/or equipment is in PARK MODE with the Parking Brake set prior to exiting the vehicle and/or equipment (utilize chocks on appropriate vehicle/equipment) • Do not allow passengers to ride in open cargo vehicle beds (pickup or stake-body beds) • Ensure that all tools and/or equipment are properly secured • Operators of dual-wheeled vehicles should inspect their vehicle regularly for rocks that may become wedged between the wheels/tires • With the transition of command teams, ensure that you know who is assigned as your supervisor • Inform the Safety of any hazards that need to be addressed
