Objective(s): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Provide for the safety of responders and the public by utilizing recognized safety standards. - Control the spread of fire on the southeast and northeast flanks of the Kidd Fire in order to prevent expansion that would threaten life safety. - Mop up and secure perimeter of the Wheat Field fire in order to prevent spread outside of existing control lines. - Protect the communities of Gorman, Rising Star, and Eastland in order to prevent the loss of life and property from wildfires. - Reinforce the structural firefighting capability of Gorman, Rising Star, and Eastland to allow local resources to recover and posture for potential deployment into the WUI if fire spreads to those communities. - Reinforce control lines on the Oak Mott Fire to prevent expansion outside of current fire perimeter. - Facilitate transfer of command / authority to the Gray Team in order ensure continuity of operations for the incident. 				
4. Operational Period Command Emphasis: The priority of effort for this operational period is establishing control lines to address life safety concerns with the greatest potential for rapid fire spread immediately followed by protecting values at risk in Gorman and Rising Star.

Elevated fire weather concerns will return on Wednesday and again through the weekend. Warm temperatures in the 70s and 80s accompanied by sustained wind speeds of 15-25 mph and gusts upwards of 30 mph possible, and RH values in the mid-teens up to 30% will allow for the return of elevated fire weather concerns generally along and west of I-35. Otherwise, the cooler temperatures on Thursday and the slower winds on Saturday will mitigate the fire weather concerns *somewhat*.

1. Take charge of the scene – inform the Supervisor and Division Lead that you are the IWI IC and establish communications (frequency, channel)

Indicators of Fatigue and Stress:

Behavioral: * Decreased motivation and low morale

* Increased irritability and depression

Physiological: * Social/behavior changes

* Poor abstract thinking, attention/decisions, concentration/memory

Mitigation: * Ensure all fire personnel are getting adequately rest before shift

* Eating well balance meals and maintain hydration

* if needed take longer period of breaks

* In extreme cases personnel may need to be relieved of duties

TRANSITION: During a time of transition to a new Overhead Team, things can become stressful. Ensure that you are aware of who your new supervisor is and ask for specific instructions (**Watch Out # 6** instruction and assignment are not clear) on the task that they would like you to accomplish.

In the upcoming days personnel will be DEMOB AND TRAVELING: IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT YOU TAKE EXTRA PRECAUTIONS AS YOU TRAVEL HOME AFTER AN EXTENDED ASSIGNMENT AND LONG FIRE SEASON! We do not want anyone to experience an accident, injury or death while traveling to Home Base. Be diligent and do not become COMPLACENT!

Know what your agency policy: Single resource driving limit 10 hours behind the wheel (BIA 8 hours), multiple drivers may drive up to duty driving limits with No one driver behind the wheel more than 10 hours. Take plenty of breaks at least every 2 hours.
