Elevated to near critical fire weather conditions will evolve both Wednesday and Thursday afternoons along and west of I-35/35E as plentiful insolation and sunshine combine with gusty west or northwest winds, minimum afternoon humidity values between 15 and 25 percent, and warming temperatures well into the 60s.

Primarily low fire weather conditions will prevail Friday and Saturday afternoons as wind speeds diminish to 10 mph or less each afternoon. However, very breezy and very warm temperatures Sunday and Monday afternoons will bring elevated to near critical fire weather conditions back to areas along and west of I-35/35E once again. Wetting rainfall is not expected through this coming weekend.

1. Take charge of the scene – inform the Supervisor and Division Lead that you are the IWI IC and establish communications (frequency, channel)
2. Assign or begin patient assessment and administer first aid. Using the Medical Incident Report in the pink section of the IRPG.
3. Determine the severity of the emergency (Red, Yellow, Green)
4. Medical person providing care must request type of transportation as early as possible (ie:air or ground)**

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3. Safety Message

- Provide for the SAFETY of all personnel and the general public
- Follow all Federal, State and Local Guidelines for the prevention of the spread of COVID-19
- **COMPLACENCY:** With an extended fire assignment, it is especially important to not become complacent. Review Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires (IRPG page 5)
- **SNAGS:** Review Look Up, Down and Around (IRPG pages 3 & 4) daily with assigned personnel. Be especially aware of overhead hazard such as SNAGS, ROCKS and POWER LINES
- Review the "8-Line" Emergency Medical Response Report procedures on the back page of the IAP regularly until proficient
- Maintaining a SAFE SPEED is a critical factor (Recommend 55 mph max on Improved thoroughfares, 45 mph max on secondary improved roads and 35 mph max on dirt roads)
- Be alert for Yellow Jackets, Bees and Hornets and other stinging insects in your operational area
- Be alert for the presence of toxic plants such as POISON OAK in your operational area
- Be alert for utilities equipment and trucks as you travel (give them plenty of room to operate)
- Utilize ground guides when moving vehicles and/or equipment throughout the operational area
- Ensure that your vehicle and/or equipment is in PARK MODE with the Parking Brake set prior to exiting the vehicle and/or equipment (utilize chocks on appropriate vehicle/equipment)
- Do not allow passengers to ride in open cargo vehicle beds (pickup or stake-body beds)
- Ensure that all tools and/or equipment are properly secured
- Operators of dual-wheeled vehicles should inspect their vehicle regularly for rocks that may become wedged between the wheels/tires
- Inform the Safety of any hazards that need to be addressed

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON-SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
