**Communication:**

Transition Day. Provide excellent in-briefing. Ensure instructions are clearly understood. Communication is a basic responsibility for all fire personnel. Ask appropriate questions to clarify uncertain issues. Speak up when you observe hazards that may place you or others at risk.

Ensure appropriate information is concisely relayed through the appropriate chain of command

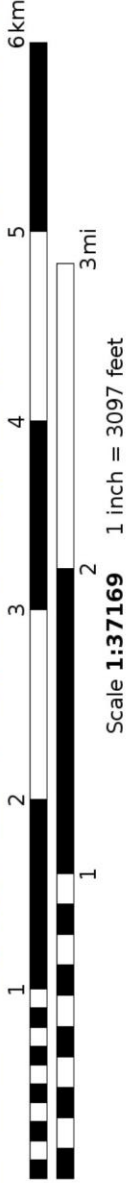
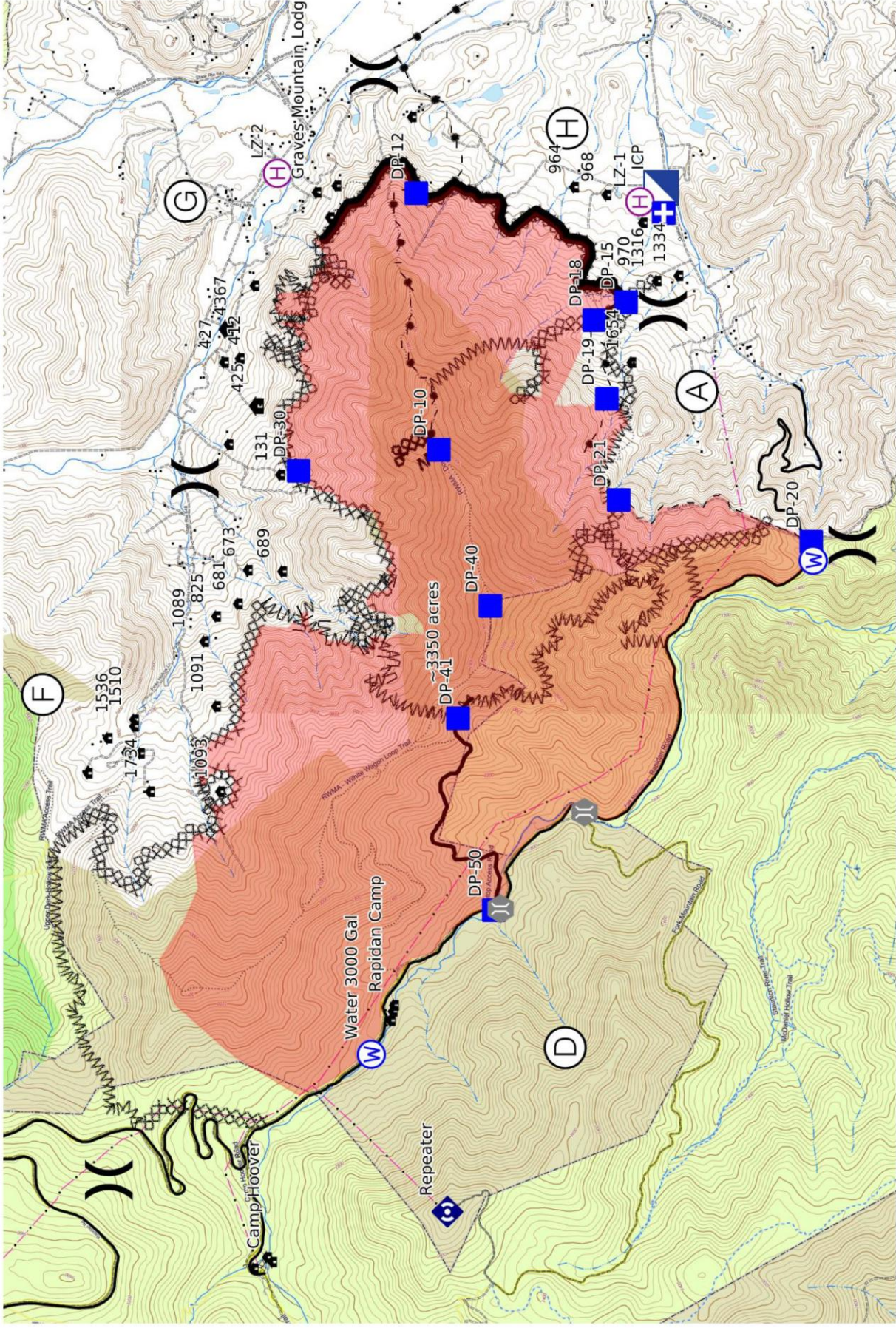
