#### Weather

#### .DISCUSSION...

A cold front that passed through Tuesday afternoon will stall out nearby to the south and west for Wednesday. More dry conditions are expected with sunshine, but winds will be lighter and cooler temperatures will allow for a higher humidity compared to today. Also, there will likely be some clouds moving in during the afternoon and evening hours.


