

Incident Link Tree

<p>1. Maintain firefighter safety by adhering to the 10 Standard Fire Fighting Orders, 18 Watch-out Situations, LCES, and 2:1 work rest ratio.</p> <p>2. Provide for public safety, protection of private property, and critical infrastructure.</p> <p>3. Limit the growth of the 2023 Quaker Run Fire to the North of structures on Quaker Run Road, south of the structures on Finks Hollow Lane, east of the Rapidan Road and south of the upper Dark Hollow Trail.</p> <p>4. Minimize impact to the Rapidan River Area, protect Rapidan Camp (Camp Hoover) and the Fork Mountain Repeater site.</p> <p>5. In developing strategy, the potential degradation of wilderness character will be considered before, and given significantly more weight, than economic efficiency and convenience. MIST techniques will be used, and all off-trail vehicle use must be pre-approved by the Agency Rep.</p> <p>6. Implement fire management strategies which will mitigate and minimize disturbance to soils, cultural, and natural resource values within the park.</p> <p>7. Manage the fire(s) in a cost effective and efficient manner while keeping Safety paramount.</p> <p>8. Minimize smoke impacts to Skyline Drive and the neighboring communities where possible.</p>

### FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Fuel conditions are extremely dry. Expect aggressive fire spread in leaf litter. Spotting should be anticipated, especially when wind is present. Even low wind speeds can loft leaves and embers across containment lines. Roll out is also a threat to containment. Heavy fuels are extremely dry and will contribute to fire intensity. Shrub fuels such as mountain laurel/rhododendron are volatile and will quickly elevate into the canopy in an uphill run. **Expect persistent fire spread that will be difficult to suppress today – especially during the peak burn period.**

Night shift – Fire intensity will decrease, but not cease after dark. Fire spread potential will remain for a few hours after nightfall, and probably subside between 2200 and 2400 hours.

### **Specific Areas of Concern:**

Branch 1 (Division Alpha, Golf, Hotel)- This branch has been relatively quiet recently. Some isolated smoke or minor smoldering/creeping possible. Rollout threat remains. Continuing leaf drop into containment lines remains a threat as well. Monitor for fireline condition and for heat in or near unburned or newly fallen fuel.

Branch 2 (Division Delta, Echo, Foxtrot) – Heat remains on the northwest side of the fire, especially near the Echo/Foxtrot break and near the firing operation from yesterday. Expect fire to continue to back downhill towards containment lines. Firing may be needed today. Slope will be in your favor, however – due west winds will align well to potentially put moderate pressure on the containment line. Don't assume the line will be pressure free. Rollout remains a threat to containment as well. If fire manages to get outside containment lines, slope reversal will be possible if fire reaches the bottom of the drainage.

### **Air Operations:**

Breezy conditions expected today. Winds should keep smoke clear and visibility adequate, but may provide for a bumpy ride. Wind/gust gap is not expected to exceed safe flying conditions.

**Fire Behavior Safety Message:** Watch Out Situation # 13: *On a hillside where rolling material can ignite fuel below.* This situation exists on a majority of this fire. Monitor and patrol for rollout potential or post a lookout where risk is elevated. Fine fuels are extremely dry and will ignite easily. Rollout could potentially send fire back uphill towards you.
