WEATHER DISCUSSION: Critical fire weather conditions continue through the first half of the day. Gusty winds during the morning will taper off in the afternoon, though occasional gusts near 20 mph are possible through sunset. Critical humidity values likely develop by noon and continue through sunset.

Critically Low Humidity and Gusty Winds Expected Today

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly sunny with thin high clouds

TEMPERATURES: Highs in the low to mid 50s on ridges and mid to upper 50s in the valleys.

HUMIDITY: 50% in the morning, dropping to 20-30% after noon.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West-northwest winds 10 to 20 mph with gusts up to 35 mph in the morning, 5 to 10 mph during the afternoon with occasional gusts up to 20 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Northwest winds 8 to 12 mph, becoming north-northwest 3-8 mph after noon.

HAINES INDEX: 5 (High)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Very shallow inversion weakening/breaking around 1000 hrs.

OUTLOOK FOR TONIGHT:

Mostly clear skies, west-northwest winds at 4 to 9 mph along the ridges, calm for the slopes/valleys. Humidities climb to 60 to 70 percent. Low temperatures in the mid 30s on the ridges, low 30s for the slopes/valleys.

OUTLOOK FOR WEDNESDAY:

Partly cloudy skies, southwest winds at 5 to 10 mph, with occasional gusts up to 15 mph along the ridges. Humidities recover to 60 to 70 percent in the morning, 40 percent in the afternoon. High temperatures will be in the mid to upper 50s.

Elevated fire conditions today! Strong winds and low humidities will provide for a much more fire prone day than recent days. Fuels are transitioning to available, and are expected to be able to support fire spread today, especially on southern aspects or full sunshine fuels. Smoldering or creeping expected inside the fire perimeter today. Reburn potential increasing if unburned fuels contacts heat sources. Any fire that escapes outside of unit may be able to display elevated fire behavior on a southern aspect or under full sunshine conditions. Under the right circumstances, do not underestimate suppression difficulty today.

These outputs assume dry fuel on a south facing slope. Other areas will have lower intensity.

Specific Areas of Concern:

Branch 1 (Division Alpha, Golf, Hotel)-. Elevated fire conditions expected today. This branch has been fairly quiet recently. Expect some increase in the visible smokes or smoldering inside the perimeter. Reburn is possible if unburned fuel exists near heat sources. Low fire behavior expected inside the perimeter. If fire escapes outside the perimeter on a south facing slope, expect elevated fire behavior and resistance to control efforts could be high in an uphill run.

Branch 2 (Division Delta, Echo, Foxtrot) Elevated fire conditions expected today. Heat remains in Echo and Foxtrot. Orientation of parts of the fireline will expose it directly to NW winds today – putting additional pressure on those lines. Expect increased smoke and smoldering today. Reburn possible where heat exists near unburned fuel. Reburn behavior would be very low intensity. If fire manages to escape the footprint, fire spread should be expected on any sunny fuels or south facing slopes. There is potential for the intensity to be high, especially in an uphill run.

Air Operations:

Turbulent air is expected during the first half of the day. Winds will decrease during the afternoon hours and will make for more suitable flying conditions. Clear skies expected.

Fire Behavior Safety Message:

Today is a day that could produce surprising fire behavior. After several days of lower fire potential, conditions today favor elevated fire behavior. If you can see sunshine on the fuel, don't assume that suppression actions will be routine or successful today.

Major Hazards and Risks: Windy Conditions and Low Humidity

Windy Conditions are predicted to be in the forecast today and the fire lines should have been tested last night from the winds. When you go out to your divisions today to check the fire lines, keep your situational awareness up, you may have tree limbs, rolling rocks or ash from stumps across the fire line. If you notice these things, it could be a good indicator for you that changes in fire behavior could be right around the corner. If the fire becomes active due to the weather changes, it is critical to act decisively regarding the changing situation.

Low Relative Humidity is predicted as well, anything lower than 30% should be considered critical especially on the slopes that have the most contact with the sun. These conditions can promote a change in fire behavior during the day and possible into the early evening hours. Winds, fuels and topography may align at any time today and cause an increase in fire behavior.

Be alert, watch for spotting, and above all maintain your LCES.

15.WIND INCREASES AND/OR CHANGES DIRECTION

Standard Firefighting Orders

- 1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions and forecasts.
- 2. Know what your fire is doing at all times.
- 3. Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire.
- 4. Identify escape routes and safety zones and make them known.
- 5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger.
- 6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
- 7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor, and adjoining forces.
- 8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
- 9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
- 10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.






