WEATHER DISCUSSION: RED FLAG WARNING TODAY 1200-2000

An upper level low pressure system will drop south across the Great Basin, and as it approaches the region westerly winds will increase, becoming strong through the afternoon and evening hours. Wind gusts up to 35 mph, combined with minimum relative humidity levels in the single digits, will create critical fire weather conditions across the fire.

FIRE BEHAVIOR OUTPUTS

GENERAL: Main fire progression will continue to be in the West Zone to the north and east. Minimal to no forward fire spread expected in the East Zone. With the forecasted winds, the fire in the west zone has the potential to cross into the East Zone. If this were to occur, it will impact DIV VV and TT, either just north or south of the Luna Fire scare. Make sure lookouts have a good view of the fire were areas of interior smokes are visible and there is a continuous canopy. Past fire history has shown reburn through the crowns and with the winds the potential for reburn is high. Expect the fire to become very active after 1400hrs. and continue through the evening.
If fire were to become established, outside the lines or you are supporting IA. Expect rapid rates of spread single and group tree torching and mid to long range spotting 1/2mile plus.

Night no forward progression is expected.

1000hr fuels are at 6%FM and are receptive to spots

Probability of Ignition 90-100%

SPECIFIC:

DIV YY: No forward fire progression expected. Keep a heads up for hold over heat that could be a source of spotting.

DIV VV: No forward progression is expected. There are still sources of heat near the perimeter. Rollout will be the biggest potential for fire getting across the line. Any fire established outside the lines will burn back towards the black or flank run below the black.

If the West Zone fire crosses the divide, expect active crown runs with rapid downhill fire spread. This fire activity would continue through the night.

DIV TT: There is potential for the West Zone fire to cross the divide. If this occurs expect, rapid downhill crown runs and mid to long range spotting. Again, this would carry on through the night.

DIV OO, LL: The fire is not expected to affect these three Divisions during this operational period.

AIR OPERATIONS: Minimal smoke impacts to air operations. Afternoon winds have the potential to shut down air operations.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Southwest Geographic Area Central Arizona to Central New Mexico

Issued: May 18, 2022



Subject: Areas of formerly moderate to severe drought have worsened to severe to exceptional status across the Southwest Geographic Area. Most of New Mexico is now classified as having extreme to exceptional drought. Energy Release Component (ERC) values far exceed normal levels for this time of year and continue to trend upward toward all-time record highs. At lower elevations, there are widespread areas of abundant and continuous fine fuels. At higher elevation sites, larger woody fuels are extremely dry.

Discussion: Expanding drought conditions coupled with very hot and dry weather, extreme wind events and unstable atmospheric conditions have led to explosive fire behavior in the region. For most Predictive Service Areas (PSA), current ERC values exceed the historical maxima for this time of year. Drought impacts are worsening and contributing directly to the increasing fire danger values. With this, it is likely that new **all-time** maximum ERC values will arise in SW07, SW08 and SW10 over the next 5-10 days, surpassing the highest ERCs ever observed in those PSAs. Conditions like this have not been seen since the mid-1950s.

Difference from normal conditions: Expanding drought conditions are contributing to increased fire danger throughout the region. Most PSAs have ERCs above the 97th percentile (all other PSAs are at or above the 90th percentile). Live fuel moisture readings in brush are extremely low. Heavy dead fuels have moisture readings in the single digits area-wide and are consuming completely to white ash. There are widespread areas of above average fine fuel loading. High temperatures are above normal, with daytime minimum RH values below 10% and very poor overnight recovery. Burn periods are much longer than normal, and very active fire behavior has been observed though all hours of the day and night.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Most fuel types and species will ignite readily, exhibiting aggressive rates of spread (outside of model parameters and experiential knowledge), with potentially explosive fuels/terrain plume-driven fire behavior and profuse long-range spotting.
- Short and mid-range spotting in fine fuels is likely with wind gusts, fire whirls, and frequent dust devils creating spotting potential greater than ½ mile in all fuel types.
- Plume dominated fire behavior highly likely within heavier fuels and favorable slope alignment.
- Fires more likely to exceed initial attack unless significant aerial and ground resources are used.
- Normal water sources may not be available for suppression purposes.
- Aviation assets may be unavailable due to operational constraints with wind.
- Direct attack may not be feasible in many circumstances.
- Effectiveness of retardant is limited.

Mitigation Measures:

- Additional resources may be required on initial attack.
- Use indirect attack measures as necessary.
- Ensure you are planning well ahead of the fire.
- Expect long-range spotting of up to a ½ mile or more with well-developed columns.
- Use retardant to modify fire behavior and lower intensities (will not stop fire spread) but only if immediately followed up with firefighters and/or bucket drops.

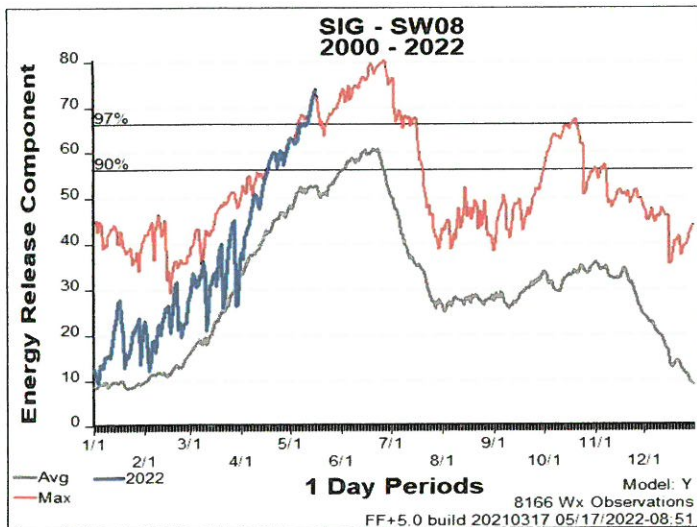
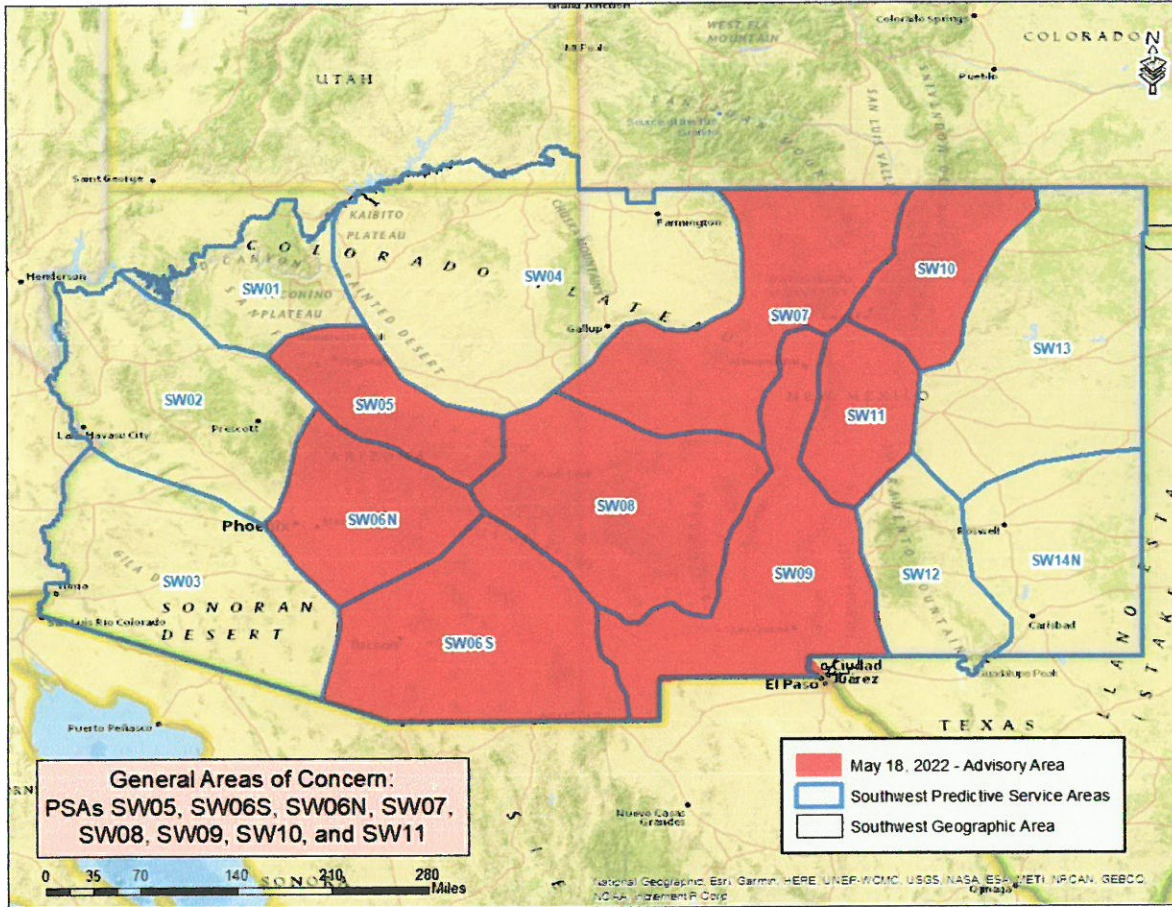

Safety Message

INCIDENT: **Hermits Peak & Calf Canyon Fires East Zone**

Date: May 19-20, 2022

Major Hazards and Risks:

- **ALL VEHICLES:** Drive with caution, defensively, headlights on, wear seatbelts, and Go Slow.
- **WEATHER:** Hot, Dry, with Gusty Winds. **RED FLAG WARNING ISSUED FOR TODAY**
- **MEDICAL EMERGENCIES:** Incident Within Incident (IWI). Know your resources, review IAP, Med Plan
- **HEAT RELATED INJURIES:** Hydrate, Pace yourself, Cool your body down

Heat and Fatigue: Heat exposure can cause minor to severe fatigue, and serious negative physical reactions that require immediate medical attention.

- Stay hydrated
- Pace yourself
- Maintain a healthy diet
- Get good sleep
- Know your personal limits, rest, and cool yourself down
- Drink more water
- Do not drink coffee or sports drinks all day

- **Hydration:** As it gets hotter, and dryer we need to keep focusing on staying hydrated. Maintain your personal hydration, healthy nutrition, and energy levels throughout each shift. Please, remember to remind those you work with to stay hydrated and “drink water.”

- **Incident Within Incident (IWI):** Review IAP, Medical Plan, ICS 206. Know where your EMTs, incident ambulances, and extraction points are located. Ensure LCES are viable and updated as needed.

Heat-Related Injury

If you suspect a heat related injury: Stop work and begin treatments to cool down the body. Immediately notify your supervisor and seek medical attention. Cool the body as quickly as possible. Find a cooler environment and ensure adequate nutrition and hydration.

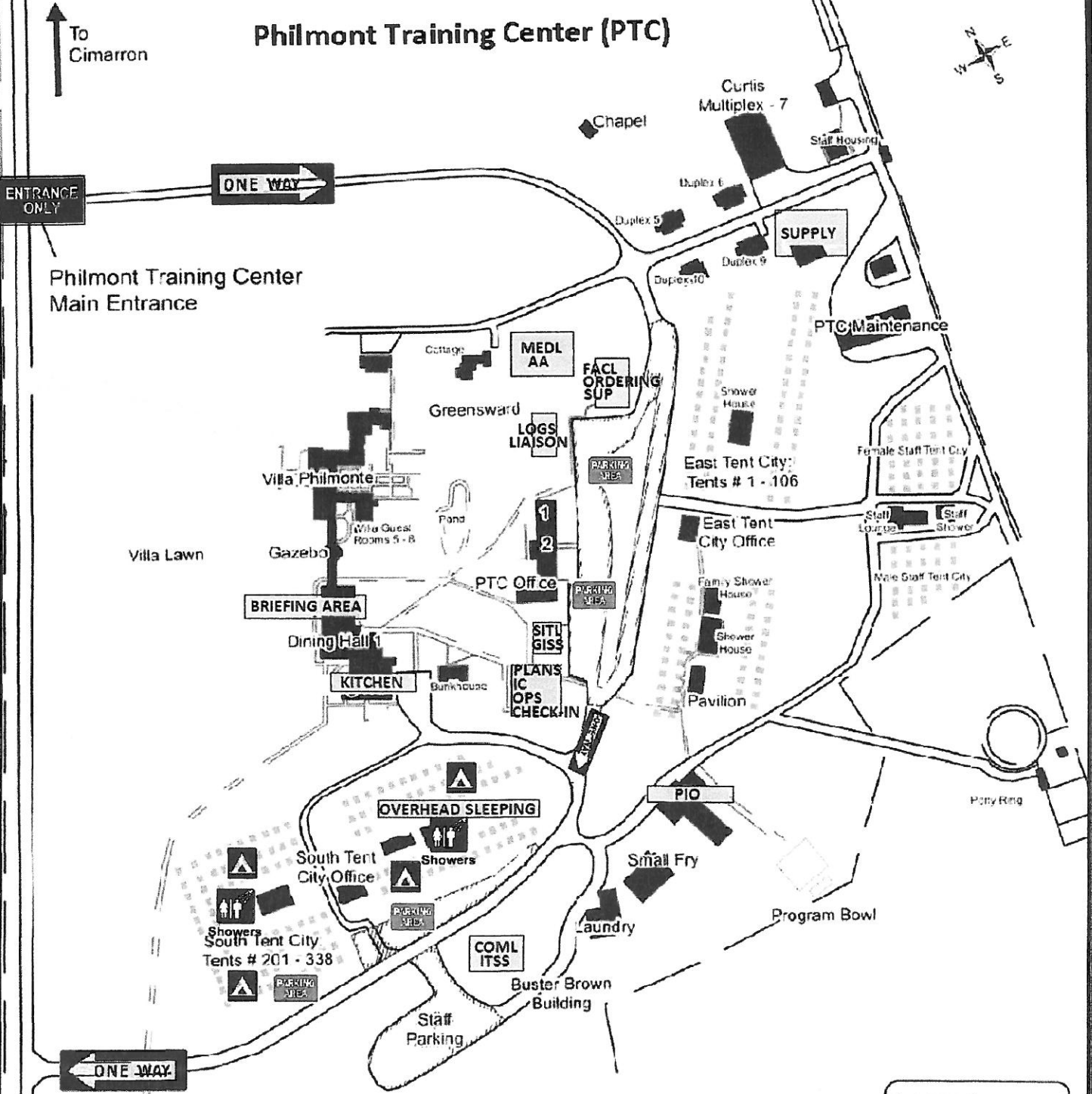
