3. Objective(s):

Management Objectives

1) Protection of human life and safety is the first priority for all actions taken on a wildfire and can overrule all other strategic/management objectives and incident requirements.

2) Base management decisions on meeting objectives while also minimizing the risk of COVID-19 exposures to responders and the public. COVID-19 considerations may alter how you meet goals but should not lead to higher risk tactics.

3) Maintain and strengthen relationships with the Santa Fe National Forest, private landowners, the public, cooperators and partners by providing timely and accurate information.

4) Protect the unique attributes of impacted watersheds through actions that minimize sedimentation and invasive species movement.

5) Protect impact to cultural resources through consultation with local forest specialists.

Control Objectives

1) Protection of human life and safety is the first priority for all actions taken and shall override all other incident control objectives. Evaluate risk vs. benefit in strategic and tactical planning and only commit operational resources to actions that have the highest probability of success.

2) Keep fire out of Jemez Canyon.

3) Keep fire south of the community SLP and south of state route 4; keep fire west of forest road 289, and Tent Rock Ranch Rd.; keep fire north of Bear Spring Rd; keep fire east of forest road 266 and 271; keep fire north of forest road 270.

4) Minimize retardant impacts to Jemez Natural Recreation Area.

5) Protect values at risk in the Valles Caldera National Preserve including watersheds, visitor and administrative infrastructure, historic structures, cultural resources, and important wildlife habitats.

6) Provide initial attack resources to respond to any new ignitions within the TFR area to limit potential size and growth.

4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:

Stop, Think, Discuss then Act, and ensure LCES is in place prior to engaging the fire or Initial Response fire.

The Cerro Pelado fire receives a strategic, risk-based response, commensurate with the threats and opportunities, and uses the full spectrum of management actions, that consider fire and fuel conditions, weather, values at risk, and resources available.

General Situational Awareness:

- Continued low RHs
- · No predicted precipitation for several days

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Unusually early start to fire season. Critical to extreme fire weather for the next several days. Entire area is experiencing extended drought. Please see daily weather forecast for detailed report.



Major Hazards & Risks:	Fire Behavior, St	eep Terrain, Base Camp Lodging

Fire Behavior – Today will be another Fire Weather Watch Day. Over the last week, we have seen what type of fire behavior the winds can produced when combined with low rh and wind gusts. Maintain your situational awareness and pay attention to any fire weather forecasts updates that are communicated throughout the day.

Steep Terrain and Heavy Equipment: The fire is in very steep, rocky country with numerous canyons. Watch your footing and be heads up to equipment working above you. Dislodged rocks are a problem and will roll for a long way. Maintain situational awareness! Equipment operators' vision may be limited and they may not see you. Maintain eye contact with operators.

Base Camp Lodging – Camping areas at the new base camp are spread out along FS Road 376. Please avoid parking vehicles near and around areas where tents have been put up. Vehicles should be parked in designated parking areas away from sleeping locations.

Work and Fatigue in Wildland Firefighting affects your physical and emotional state!

Wildland Firefighting is arduous work, performed for long shifts in difficult environmental conditions. The work can be dangerous due to the fire and working conditions. Heat, smoke, rolling rocks, falling snags, and other hazards threaten the worker. Fatigue can impair performance and decision making, increasing the risk of injury. Prolonged exposure to fatigue, stress, smoke, and poor nutrition has the potential to increase the incidence of upper respiratory illness, but also mental lapses.

The stress response is necessary to prepare an athlete, firefighter or soldier for a maximal effort in a physical challenge, but it can be unhealthy if it occurs too often in the wrong setting.

Fatigue—A sense of tiredness, either mental or physical, brought on by stress (lack of sleep, physical work, nutritional inadequacies, or mental stresses). Fatigue following work or sleep deprivation is a normal state and can be reversed with adequate recovery or rest.


Accumulated (Chronic) Fatigue—Fatigue from which normal rest does not produce recovery. Accumulated fatigue is often caused by extended periods of stress with inadequate recovery periods, resulting in decreased productivity, compromised immune function, and reduced alertness.

Fatigued workers perform poorly and behave carelessly, tolerate greater errors, and become inattentive. They display decreased motivation, increased irritability and depression, and low morale. Accumulated fatigue is more persistent, producing a wider array of effects on performance, health, and morale than ordinary fatigue. Accumulated fatigue requires longer recovery periods than ordinary fatigue.

Correct Nutrition, Hydration and Rest are good coping mechanisms for stress and fatigue. Make use of your down time and rest per the work/rest guidelines.





IWI IC Responsibilities:

• Take charge of the scene – inform the Division Supervisor and Communications that you are the IWI IC and establish radio communications(frequencies, channels). Identify the emergency name – Division A medical, etc.

- Assign or begin patient assessment (Medical Incident Report MIR) and first aid. Request additional medical resources on division/branch or across incident. Transmit MIR patient information to Communications.
- Determine patient transportation through consultation with line medical personnel and Medical Unit Leader. Consider transportation time, risk to personnel, destination facility and available operational resources. If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Order transportation resources through Communications as early as possible.
- Notify Communications as resources arrive and any patient status changes. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio.
- Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. The Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required.
- As appropriate, conduct an After-Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.
