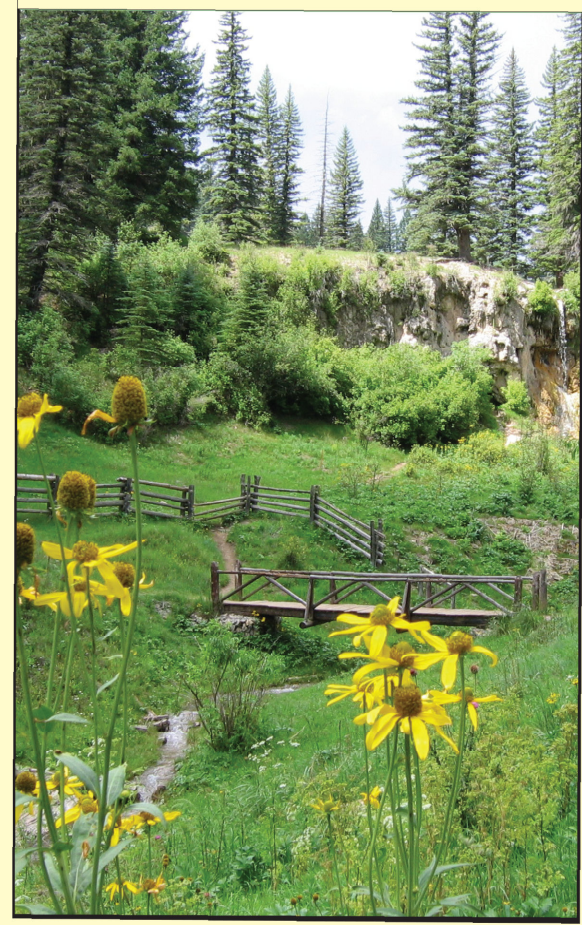

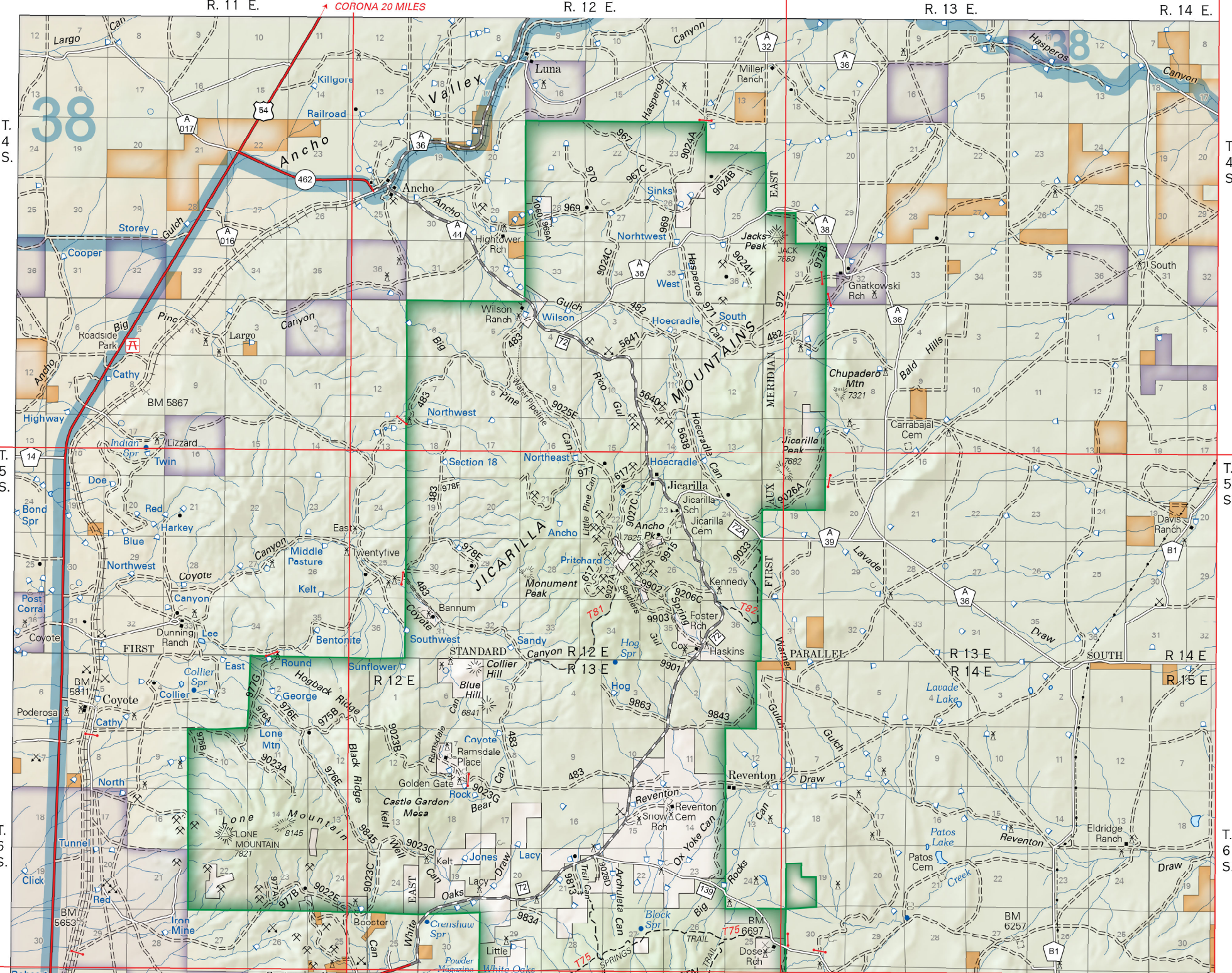

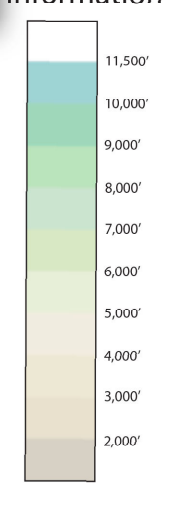


Recreation Opportunity Chart

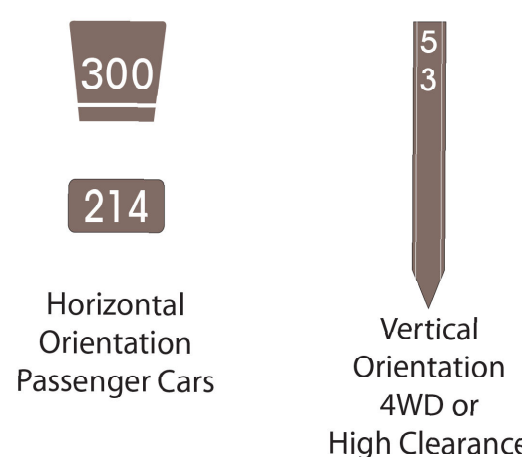


Know the Signs

Understanding how the forest roads and trails are signed will help you better enjoy your stay on the Lincoln. Our roads have a simple method. If the road sign is oriented horizontally, it's ok for passenger cars. If the sign is oriented vertically, the road should only be used by high clearance or 4WD.

Road Signs

Any signs with a horizontal orientation for their number are appropriate for passenger car travel. Signs with a vertical orientation for their number are appropriate for 4WD traffic and not appropriate for passenger cars or RVs.



Trail Signs

Our forest trails have a new and improved set of signs in most areas. You can now see both the trail number (ie: T1234) as well as the types of uses allowed or not allowed on that trail. Always remember to check the signs when starting out for the allowed uses and remember to share the trail. Our trails
