**MAP 4 - 112**

MAP Description: Starts at the end of Forest Road 8WA, west of Dry Lake moves south along Dry Lake. About .5 miles from Rio Gallina goes directly south and crosses Canada de la Cueva, around the BLM range allotment then follows the Rio Gallina west to the Forest boundary.

Values at Risk: Highway 112 corridor, oil wells, private and BLM lands.

Trigger Condition: Fire has crossed or is projected with potential of getting established within 24 hours and is expected to continue sustained toward BLM, private lands, and Highway 112.

**ACTIONS**

Notifications: IC(s) will notify AA and Forest Fire Staff Officer.

Recommended Management Action: Reassess planning area and ensure communication with the BLM, NM Forestry, and Local Sheriff's office has been established.

Mitigation Actions: Begin any identified preparation needed along identified Contingency line from teams P.A.C.E plan.

**RESOURCES:** Additional resources required will be determined by operational personnel after consideration of current fire behavior and availability of resources at the time of MAP activation.

**MAP 5 - North**

MAP Description: Starting near the tip of Mesa Laguna north to wilderness boundary then turning east to Chama Valley following the wilderness boundary south to drainage Canada De La Presa.

Values at Risk: Monastery of Christ in the Desert, Rio Gallina Canyon Ranch, Rio Chama Wild and Scenic River Corridor

**ACTIONS**

Notifications: IC(s) will notify AAs and Forest Fire Staff Officer.

Recommended Management Action: Reassess current strategy, pre-evacuation or evacuation to protect life, property, and other values at risk.

Mitigation Actions: Reassess planning area and complexity analysis along with potential larger Forest closure area.

**MAP 6 - South**

MAP Description: Crosses FS Road 8 approximately 2 miles north of Highway 96 crosses FS Road 77 to the rock rim and follows the rock rim east for approximately 6 miles

Values at Risk: Gallina community, Highway 96 corridor, and communication towers

Trigger Condition: Fire gets established or looks to exceed one operational period past the MAP.

**ACTIONS**

Notifications: IC(s) will notify AAs and Forest Fire Staff

Recommended Management Action: Assess use and ability to implement identified contingency line, point protection for values at risk as needed.

Mitigation Actions: Implement protection of communication sites, recommend larger Forest closure, initiate discussions with County Sheriff's office about potential evacuation levels.

**RESOURCES:** Additional resources required will be determined by operational personnel after consideration of current fire behavior.
