Resource Cover Book - INTRODUCTION

Purpose

The purpose of this document is to provide resources temporarily assigned to the Stanislaus National Forest general information and guidelines to facilitate a smooth integration while on assignment.

Description

The Stanislaus NF covers approximately 897,700 thousand acres of land. There are three district offices located in Pinecrest (Sugar Pine District), Hathaway Pines (Calaveras District), and Groveland/Buck Meadows (Groveland District). Three major travel routes traverse the forest; Highway 4 in the northern portion, Highway 108 through the center and Highway 120 to Yosemite NP in the south. There are also numerous special management lands such as the Carson-Iceberg Wilderness and the Mokelumne Wilderness that straddles the crest of the Sierra Nevada's and the Emigrant Wilderness which borders Yosemite National Park on the south.

General

The Stanislaus National Forest operates under the National Fire and Aviation Policy, Forest Service Manuals (FSM) and Forest Service Handbook (FSH) that are issued by the Department of Agriculture. These policies and guidelines are strictly adhered to. Questions on policy, operational guidelines or safety issues should be brought to the attention of any Stanislaus NF staff member.

ROLES AND REponsibilities

Emergency Communication Center

Stanislaus Dispatch is considered a unit dispatch center operating within the Southern California Geographic Area (OSC). Stanislaus Dispatch has the responsibility and authority to mobilize all resources for initial attack fire suppression, fire support and all-risk emergency operations.

Stanislaus Dispatch is staffed with a minimum of two full time dispatchers and a duty officer on a daily basis. General office hours for the dispatch office are 0730 – 1800 Sunday through Saturday. On-call dispatchers are identified and scheduled on a weekly call out list to be available for night shifts and support for increased activity in the dispatch office.

Fire Support

The Stanislaus National Forest annually averages over 375 red-carded personnel who are entered into the Incident Qualification and Certification System (IQCS) and are available to assist with fire and aviation operations within the forest and provide national support as well. The Stanislaus National Forest has non-fire personnel who are trained and qualified to assist with supporting extended attack operations. Most of the STF fires are managed under the Type 4 structure and are generally over within 2-3 days.

FIRE MANAGEMENT INFORMATION

Fire Behavior

High fire danger is generally present throughout the main part of fire season, and very high fire danger is usually present during late summer. The following is a brief description of the two different conditions.

High Fire Danger

- Fires ignite easily and spread steadily or rapidly. Control of fires can become difficult, particularly under windy conditions, and containment of fires may involve some extended attack.
- All dead fuels are generally very dry, and live fuel moisture is dropping to the levels that will support rapid spread, particularly with high winds. Large fires are possible within the forest and there will be an increase in requests to assist on fires from surrounding agencies, thus resource support available within the forest may be limited.
- While relative humidity (RH) drops during the day, we can usually expect moderate to good moisture recovery at night.

Very High Fire Danger

- Lightning and human caused fires will ignite easily and spread rapidly with high intensities, particularly with high winds. Fires will be difficult to control and involve extended attack.
- All fuels are very dry. Live fuel moisture and 100hr fuel moisture within the forest are dropping down to critical levels. Increase of large fire activity within the forest, and plume dominated fires can be expected on days with low wind speeds. A high number of resources available within the zone will be committed to large fires.
- RH is generally very low during the day and one can expect low to moderate moisture recovery at night.

Topography / Vegetation

The Stanislaus NF consists mainly of timber in the higher elevations, and brush in the lower and southern part of the Forest. Most elevations average between 2000 to 6000 feet but can go as high as 10,000 feet in isolated spots within the Forest.

Fuel Types

Generally, the fuel models used for fire behavior are the timber brush types. Annual components throughout the Forest both perennial and annual fuel loading vary greatly from year to year with the amount of annual precipitation.

Fire History

Lightning has long been the primary cause of unplanned ignitions on the forest. However, over the last several years, human caused ignitions have been on the rise due to increasing numbers of forest visitors.

Fire Suppression Tactics

All fires reported within the Stanislaus NF will be managed in accordance with current national policy. Fires are documented and plotted by Stanislaus Dispatch and resources are mobilized under the directions of the Forest Fire Management Plan. For most initial attack fires, Stanislaus Dispatch will mobilize engines to confirm location and land status, provide initial size up, and request more resources if needed. The additional resources could include: overhead, engines, hand crews, and air support.

Prioritization of Targets

The Forest Duty Officer is responsible for providing direction and prioritizing the use of all fire suppression resources on the Stanislaus NF. The priorities for dispatching these resources are as follows:

- Fires threatening human life.
- Fires threatening property (structures, livestock, etc).
- Fires threatening natural resource value.

Initial attack fires have priority over extended attack/project fires.

Urban Interface

Urban interface areas occur throughout some of the lands located within Stanislaus NF. CAL-FIRE has the responsibility for structure protection on state and private lands located throughout California. There are MOU's and agreements in place for CAL-FIRE to request additional resources from federal agencies to assist with suppression efforts.

Special Management Areas

Within the Stanislaus NF there are numerous special management areas including wild and scenic areas and designated wilderness areas. There are guidelines in place for applications of aerial retardants, fire fighting methods, and aviation activity in general, within these areas. They can be reviewed on a case by case to determine what type of suppression activities should be used.

FACILITIES

Supervisors Office

The Stanislaus Dispatch Office is in the Forest Supervisor's Office located at 19777 Greenley Road, in Sonora, California. This office is the emergency operational center for incident activities within the forest protection area. The office is located at the west end of the building on the lower floor. All the Forest Fire Staff position offices are located on this same level of the Supervisor's office. Parking for Stanislaus Dispatch is located on the west side of the main building.

Service Shop & Fire Supply Cache

The vehicle service shop and fire supply and cache facilities are located directly north of the Supervisor's office. The cache has NFES supplies including Nomex clothing and other line gear as well as pumps, hose and other fire equipment and supplies. There is also parking near the warehouse through a secured gate.

Security Systems

Stanislaus Supervisor's Office as well as all the District offices are equipped with some form of security alarm system. If your assignment will require you to potentially enter these buildings outside of normal business hours be sure to request a briefing on how the alarm system works.

DISPATCH PROCEDURES

Dispatch Procedures

Stanislaus dispatch is responsible for all dispatching for Stanislaus NF incidents, including: fire, law enforcement, recreation, and administrative tracking. Located in the dispatch and aviation plans are detailed instructions for the following dispatch procedures.

COMMUNICATIONS

Radio Frequencies

RADIO NETS

FOREST OPERATIONS NET - This net is used for Emergency Traffic and Fire Operations ONLY. Emergency traffic consists of life-threatening situations, fire, HAZMAT incidents, medical aids, vehicle accidents, and search and rescue operations (SARs). The weather is broadcast on this net along with fire danger, burn indices, burn & woodcut status and fire staffing. The fire program utilizes this net for administrative purposes also.

FOREST ADMINISTRATIVE NETS - This net is used for all Law Enforcement and administrative radio traffic other than fire. Examples of administrative uses include; routine traffic messages and notifications of administrative messages. This net may be restricted to emergency traffic only. Such a situation would occur when the Forest Operations Net is overloaded with emergency traffic due to multiple incidents on the Forest. The District offices use the radio for administrative resource tracking as well.

Repeater coverage maps and STF radio frequency charts are included elsewhere in this document as well as the 2024 Communications Plan.

GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

Timekeeping

Hours worked will be recorded on an Emergency Firefighter Time Report (form OF288) and will be signed by the supervisor before being processed for payment.

Job Codes

Stanislaus Dispatch will issue the appropriate job codes for all timekeeping, travel charges, and supplies that may be needed. Job codes for vehicles used for fire support will also be issued by dispatch personnel.

Stanislaus National Forest History

During the gold rush, the area that would become the Stanislaus National Forest was a busy place, occupied by miners and other immigrants, homesteaders and ranchers, dam builders and loggers. Several railroads were constructed to haul logs out of the woods. Evidence of these activities still exist.

Sierra Nevada History

The Stanislaus National Forest (Forest) encompasses 898,099 acres on the western slope of the Sierra Nevada; California's snow-capped mountain range that flanks the Great Central Valley. Located between Lake Tahoe and Yosemite, the Forest landscape is a continuum of natural and scenic beauty that defines the Sierra. Amid soaring crests, sparkling mountain lakes, towering forests, and canyons carved by cool rushing rivers, visitors discover connections with nature and the spirit of the Sierra Nevada. A mere two hour drive from the Great Central Valley and three hours from the San Francisco Bay Area, makes the Forest a very popular destination place.

During your visit to the National Forest you may encounter archeological and historic sites and artifacts. Like a jigsaw puzzle, each artifact and site, no matter how seemingly insignificant, helps tell the heritage story. Please help preserve these remnants of our past by not disturbing or harming them.

The mountains were shaped by volcanic and glacial action, producing rugged and spectacular topography at high elevations. Each elevation, from 1,500 to over 11,000 feet above sea level, has its own unique vegetation, wildlife, and corresponding temperatures. While the lower elevations are hot and dry, the lush meadows in the higher elevations are cooled by melting snow. Here you will find Sierra mixed conifer, true fir, lodge pole pine and sub alpine vegetation. Bald eagle, peregrine falcon and wolverine have all been reported on the Forest.
