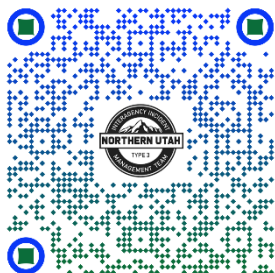

Management Objectives: 1) Provide for firefighter and public safety over all other incident objectives and requirements. All operational strategies and tactics should consider associated risk to firefighter/public safety and utilize the options that have the highest probability for success combined with the lowest amount of exposure. 2) Protect values at risk, including private homes, infrastructure, and critical wildlife/grazing lands, and important watersheds. 3) Utilize public information officers to communicate clearly and timely with elected officials, stakeholders, local communities, and members of the public on current fire situation.																	
Control Objectives: • Ensure LCES is in place prior to engagement. • Utilize aircraft to prevent fire spread and secure the line. • Construct line using natural barriers whenever possible. • Look for indirect firing opportunities. • Conduct burnout operations if conditions allow.																	
General Situational Awareness ○ Watch for local traffic on narrow roads through the communities. ○ Maintain situational awareness on steep rocky slopes with rolling rocks. ○ Watch for rattlesnakes and wasps. ○ Ensure proper hydration with frequent breaks and regular fluid intake.

.DISCUSSION...Monsoonal moisture remains in place today near the fire with ample coverage of showers and thunderstorms through the majority of this afternoon into the evening hours. Currently, mostly light rain has been observed near the fire as storms continue to dissipate within the vicinity. However, another round of showers and thunderstorms is expected to occur around 1800-2000, lasting through around 0200 before tapering off. A brief lull is expected following this, though coverage will increase markedly around the 0900-1200 timeframe tomorrow. Additionally, CWR chances increase substantially to around 75% tomorrow afternoon as chances for precipitation favor northern UT. While chances for precipitation taper off somewhat on Friday, a similar scenario to today is expected to occur with showers and thunderstorms developing after 1200 and persist into the early evening. Come Saturday and Sunday, chances for precipitation decrease to around 20% or less as dry air moves in, favoring precipitation remaining along higher terrain.

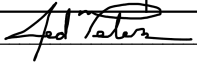

Keep lookouts posted for approaching thunder cells. Take hourly weather readings. Maintain LCES!

Lightning Safety

APPROACHING THUNDERSTORM INDICATORS

Approaching thunderstorms may be noted by a sudden reverse in wind direction, a noticeable rise in wind speed, and a sharp drop in temperature. Rain, hail, and lightning occur only in the mature stage of a thunderstorm.

SITUATION AWARENESS – OBSERVE 30/30 RULE

If you see lightning and hear the thunderclap within 30 seconds, take shelter/storm precautions. Do not resume work in exposed areas until 30 minutes after the storm activity has passed.

SHELTERING

If available, take shelter in a modern, enclosed building or in a metal-topped vehicle. Avoid open shelters (like gazebos) and tall trees.

STORM PRECAUTIONS WHEN SHELTER NOT AVAILABLE

- Find a spot away from tall trees, wire fences, utility lines, and any other elevated conductive objects.
- Stay out of dry creek beds and make sure the place you pick is not subject to flooding.
- If in the woods, move to an area with shorter trees.
- If only isolated trees are nearby, keep away a distance of at least twice the height of the tree.
- In open country, crouch low, with feet together, minimizing contact with the ground. You can use a pack to sit on but never lie on the ground.
- Avoid grouping together.
- Avoid ridge tops, hilltops, wide-open spaces, ledges, and rock outcroppings.
- Put down/do not handle all tools.
- Do not use landline telephones; turn them off and do not operate machinery and electric motors.
- Do not handle flammable materials in open containers.
- **If you (or a member of your crew) feel an electrical charge—if your hair stands on end or your skin tingles, lightning may be about to strike you. Immediately crouch low to the ground, make yourself the smallest possible target, and minimize your contact with the ground.**

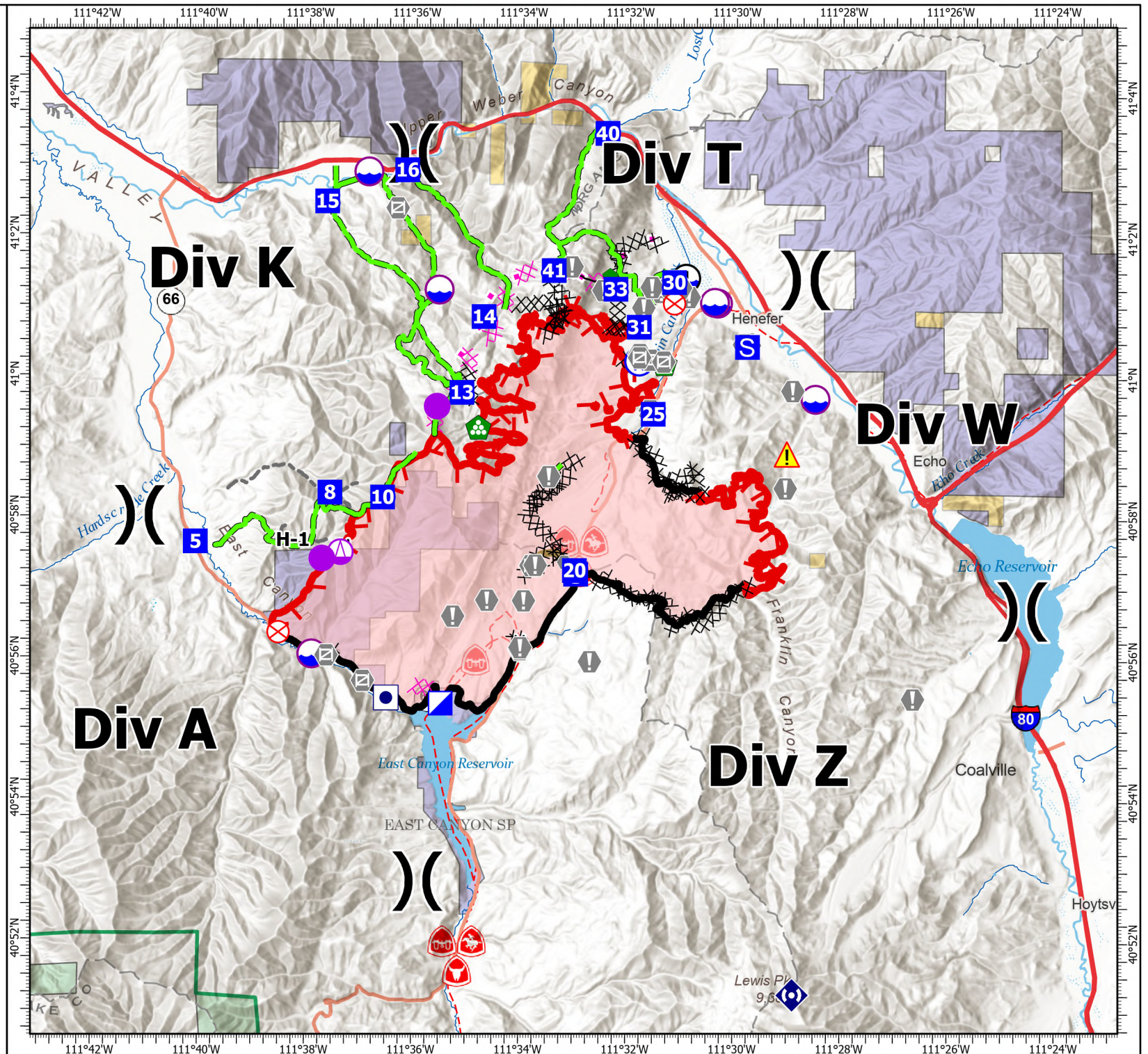

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.
